Absolutely Maybe by Lisa Yee

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Plot Summary

Absolutely Maybe is a novel by author Lisa Yee. The story follows the main character, Maybelline "Maybe" Chestnut, as she runs away from her home in Kissimmee, Florida for Hollywood. Maybe is the daughter of a beauty queen turned charm school proprietor. Although her mother screams everything beauty queen, Maybe is the direct opposite with her Goth makeup, baggy clothes and brightly-colored hair that changes throughout the novel.

When Chessy, Maybe's mother, chooses her fiancé and soon-to-be seventh husband over Maybe, Maybe runs off to find her biological father in California. Maybe takes along her best friend, Ted, as they hitch a ride with their friend, Hollywood, who is driving out to attend film school at the University of Southern California, USC.

When the trio arrives in California, things don't work out quite the way they planned. Ted and Maybe, at first, are homeless and so they are sleeping in the lounges of the college dorms. Ted eventually lands a job as a personal assistant to a Hollywood star, so he moves on to realize his dream of dealing with the rich and famous. Hollywood starts to realize his dream of becoming a movie maker, propelling his dream into reality when he wins a documentary film contest with his documentary about Maybe.

The only one who is still struggling is Maybe, who is the reason that they go to California in the first place. As she works at a taco truck for the summer, she continues to search for her father and lives with one of her mother's ex-husbands that Chessy married twice, Sammy. By the end of the novel, Maybe realizes that life doesn't always turn out how you want it to and so it's best to learn how to work with what and who you have in your life.



Chapters 1 and 2

Chapters 1 and 2 Summary

When Maybelline, Maybe, is six years old, her mother takes her to Disneyworld for her birthday. They go on the rides, Belle, from Beauty and the Beast serves Maybe her slice of cake and sings happy birthday to her. that night as Maybe's mother tucks her in, she tells Maybe that she'll always be there for her.

By the time Maybe is 16, the relationship between her and her mother is completely different. Chessy, Maybe's mother, announces to Maybe that she is marrying again. She is marrying Jake, the manager from the Piggly Wiggle. Chessy tells Maybe that she needs a makeover and to stop being a Goth. Chessy met Jake the previous summer when she went to the grocery store to pick up Maybe's cake. Chessy returned with Jake and no cake. Maybe gives her mother the finger as she walks out of the house to go to school.

Chapters 1 and 2 Analysis

The drastic change in the relationship between Chessy and Maybe suggests that one or more things happened between the age of six and 16. It foreshadows that some of these details will come as the novel unfolds. Additionally, it suggests that Chessy marries men a lot but that the marriages do not tend to last very long. Maybe also suggests that her mother was a beauty queen because she mentions Chessy's "beauty queen" smile.



Chapters 3 and 4

Chapters 3 and 4 Summary

Maybelline, who goes by Maybe, is named after her mother's favorite makeup brand. Maybe meets her best friend, Ted, so they can walk to school together. She first met Ted when they were freshmen in high school. The Fantastic Five, which are the most popular girls in school, were picking on Maybe and Ted scared them away. Ted and Maybe have been friends ever since.

The Fantastic Five are all pageant girls and they all attend Chessy's Charm School and use Chessy's beauty pageant consulting services. Maybe tells Ted that Chessy thinks Maybe is Goth. Maybe works in the library at school first period. When she arrives, she runs into a fellow student that works with her, Hollywood. He tells her he got accepted to the University of Southern California film school. He's always filming Maybe and Ted.

After school, Maybe goes home to freshen up. She tells Chessy she's having dinner at Ted's house. Chessy says she and Jake are going bowling so Maybe should call before she comes home. Maybe loves Ted's house because his family is so normal and they treat Ted so well. Ted was adopted after Paww found Ted at the base of a statue. Maybe asks Ted if she can spend the night and he says she is always welcome. Maybe even finds a drawer labeled with her name in Ted's room that has a toothbrush and toothpaste for maybe.

Maybe explains that her mother is a serial "marryer" since she has had six husbands, so far. Jake will be husband number six. One of her husbands, Sammy Wing, she married twice. One time, when Chessy is drunk, Maybe and Chessy get into an argument. Maybe threatens to go live with her biological father. Chessy tells maybe that her father doesn't even know that Maybe exists because she told him she miscarried. Maybe wonders if he would want to know that she is alive.

Chapters 3 and 4 Analysis

Maybe and Ted represent different ends of the spectrum. While Maybe doesn't know who her father is, her biological mother doesn't treat her as well as Ted's adoptive parents treat him. It is also ironic that the Fantastic Five, the five girls that torment Maybe, are Chessy's favorite students. Chessy seems to be searching for happiness in the men in her life. It is as if she accomplishes her goal if she gets the men to marry her, but then she realizes that marriage isn't really what she wants. There is some foreshadowing that Maybe will go out into the world to search for her father, tell him that she exists and get to know him.



Chapters 5 and 6

Chapters 5 and 6 Summary

Maybe notices that Jake and his things are slowly starting to live in their house within a week of the engagement news. The Fantastic Five show up for their nightly practice. As they are reciting Chessy's seven rules, Ridgeway, the dress designer pushes in a rack of gowns that makes the girls go crazy. When Maybe goes into the room where the girls are practicing, the make fun of her and Ridgeway accidentally on purpose pokes one of them with a pin. Maybe gets a bottle of mustard and squeezes it into each of their bags when nobody is looking.

At lunch, Ted and Maybe are laughing about the mustard incident. Hollywood comes up a=to join them. After lunch, Maybe goes to the girls' bathroom. While she is in the stall, someone turns off the lights. When she exits the stall, a bunch of girls jump her, beat her, tie her up and shove something in her mouth. When they leave, the principal finds Maybe on the floor and takes her to the principals' office. The principal, Mrs. Escobar, tries to get Maybe to tell her who did this to her, but Maybe says she doesn't know. Mrs. Escobar says that Maybe has good grades and that she can probably help in cleaning up Maybe's record so she can apply to colleges next year when Maybe is a senior. Even though the principal insists Maybe is, Maybe insists that she is not college material.

Chapters 5 and 6 Analysis

It is ironic that Maybe has such a different look from everyone else when her mother is a beauty queen and she teaches other beauty queens. It could be that Maybe dresses the way she does to get negative attention from her mother because negative attention is better than no attention at all. Maybe has a low self-esteem because her mother talks down to her. when Maybe tells the principal that she isn't college material, Maybe is repeating what Chessy tells her.



Chapters 7 and 8

Chapters 7 and 8 Summary

The rumors are flying all over school about Maybe getting attacked in the bathroom. Ted and Maybe hitch a ride home with Hollywood. Hollywood tells them it's his last day before he goes to USC for a summer class. He says he'll miss them and they say he can them anytime.

It's the day of the pageant do Maybe has the whole had to herself. She spends it watching reruns of Nelson's Neighborhood, which is a show about a contemporary family that acts retro. That night, Chessy comes in with Jake and Ridgeway and she's very upset. Jake plies Chessy with booze and tucks her in. Ridgeway tells Maybe it was an ethical contest, but Chessy thought it was "ethnical" competition instead of an "ethical" competition.

Chapters 7 and 8 Analysis

Maybe doesn't want to reveal who her attackers are because it could jeopardize her mother's income. Since it is the Fantastic Five that jumped her in the bathroom, if she tells, they could get mad and drop out of her mother's classes. While Chessy is smart at being beautiful and teaching others how to win pageants, she is not very book smart. She confuses ethical with ethnical, which could jeopardize her business now that she has made herself the laughing stock of the pageantry business.



Chapters 9 and 10

Chapters 9 and 10 Summary

Maybe wakes up in the middle of the night with Jake on top of her groping her and trying to rape her. Maybe tries to fight back but Jake is too strong for her. Chessy walks in and catches Jake. Maybe is happy to see her mother until Chessy blames Maybe for trying to sleep with Jake. While Jake and Chessy are arguing in the kitchen, Maybe gets up, gets dress and leaves the house.

Maybe shows up at Ted's front door at 3 am and Maah lets her in, thinking Chessy is drinking again. The next morning, Maybe wakes up with bruises all over her body and she is sore. She takes two showers to try to scrub the disgust off her. at breakfast she tells Ted that Jake tried to rape her and that he mother doesn't believe her. She also says she's going to run away and try to find her real father. Ted says he'll tell his parents they are going to Los Angeles to stay with Maybe's fake cousin Carla and the two decide they can hitch a ride with Hollywood, who is driving out to California to go to college.

Chapters 9 and 10 Analysis

Maybe is running away from home. She doesn't ever plan on going to her house. Maybe will have to return to her house to try to find clues that will lead her to the identity of her biological father. The three kids making a road trip from Florida to California foreshadows a cross-country adventure. Additionally, another adventure awaits them once they reach California and start looking for Maybe's father.



Chapters 11 and 12

Chapters 11 and 12 Summary

Hollywood is excited when he finds out that Maybe and Ted are hitching a ride to LA with him. Maybe sneaks home when she knows Chessy won't be there. Maybe takes Chessy's old wedding rings, \$350 in cash and finds a photo of Chessy with a man named Gunnar. The photo was taken nine months before Maybe was born, so she assumes it could be her father. Maybe leaves Chessy a note in the liquor cabinet that says she's going to LA with Ted to stay with his cousin Carla for the summer.

Ted, Maybe and Hollywood have started their road trip. They agree to sleep in the car to save money, but one morning they wake up to three guys demanding money and drugs. Since they don't have either, one of the men punches Hollywood and gives him a fat lip. When they get to Texas, they check into a hotel room and eat out at a local diner. When they return to the room, Ted gets one twin bed and Hollywood get s the other one. Jessica takes the floor, but can't sleep. She turns on the TV to watch Nelson's neighborhood and look at the folder she has with clues about her dad.

Chapters 11 and 12 Analysis

This will be the first time that Ted, Hollywood and Maybe are out in the "real world" on their own. It foreshadows them learning a lot of life's lessons the hard way—including getting roughed up by strangers when they are sleeping in the car. While Ted and Hollywood come from loving families, Maybe feels as if she comes from a very unloving family. Maybe also feels that the further she gets away from Kissimmee, Florida, the closer she is getting to find out who her father is.



Chapters 13 and 14

Chapters 13 and 14 Summary

Driving through Texas and long and hard. Ted wants to stop at every tourist trap, but Hollywood and Maybe just want to get to California to start their new lives. Maybe thinks about how much you can learn about a person on a long road trip. About 150 miles outside of LA, Maybe and Ted break it to Hollywood that there is no Carla and they need to stay with him in the dorm for a few days. Ted gets on the phone with Paaw and starts narrating everything they see. Hollywood mutters about being taken advantage of and Maybe and Ted look at each other because they didn't think Hollywood knew they were using him to get to LA. Maybe starts to panic about where they are going to live, how they will earn money and about finding her father.

Chapters 13 and 14 Analysis

Reality is starting to set in for the three teens as they make their way into California. First, they recognize the contrasts between life in their small Florida town compared to life in a big city. For example, when Hollywood cuts someone off in traffic, she honks her horn at them and gives them the finger. Maybe is also starting to realize that they have not thought out their plan all the way because they don't have a sure place to live or a steady income of any kind. She's also worrying about meeting her father.



Chapters 15 and 16

Chapters 15 and 16 Summary

Hollywood checks into his dorm and the girl checking him in says his roommate left him a message that he's not coming until Friday. Hollywood is so excited about the dorm room, even though Maybe thinks it's small and nothing special. Hollywood agrees to let the stay until Friday, which is three days away. Then, the three go on a tour of the campus. At the end, Ted tries to convince Hollywood they should go on a tour of the stars' homes.

They search for a cheap parking lot to park the car to catch the tour bus. As soon as they get on the bus, Ted starts peppering the tour guide with questions. Maybe notices that some people are dressed in Star Wars costumes and she notices a girl with ornage hair to match Maybe's pink hair, and the girl has numerous piercings. Ted welcomes Maybe home. She realizes he means that they fit in here when they never really fit it in Kissimmee. They walk on Hollywood Boulevard and find James Dean's star, which Ted spits on and Hollywood polishes clean with his shirt. When they have dinner at a wings' place, Ted mentions something about running out of money. This causes Maybe to panic even more because she planned on borrowing money from Ted when she runs out of money.

Chapters 15 and 16 Analysis

Maybe and Ted recognize the contrast between Kissimmee and LA. They already feel like they fit into the culture of this city more than they ever have in Kissimmee. In some respect, Maybe feels as if she is a fish out water, but in other ways she is experiencing a new way of life that she has longed for for a long time. One of the contrasts she notices is how the neighborhood changes as they walk along the street. The street changes from a tourist area to a seedy part of town. This change is symbolic of the journey that Ted and Maybe area about to take in life. They are moving from the wholesome town of Kissimmee, Florida to the mean streets of Hollywood. While Ted always has the option of returning home to his loving family, Maybe might just find herself alone and living on the streets.



Chapters 17 and 18

Chapters 17 and 18 Summary

As Hollywood unpacks and decorates his dorm room, Ted and Hollywood argue over whether USC is a film school or a football school. Maybe wanders around exploring the campus. Before they know it, it is Friday and Hollywood's roommate is scheduled to arrive, which means Ted and Maybe have to leave. Maybe slips a help-wanted flyer into her purse from the bulletin board in the student union. When she gets back to the dorm, she sees the most gorgeous guy she's ever seen in Hollywood's room. It's his roommate, Ian. They leave Ian to settle in and Ted tells Maybe he has a plan. He says they can crash dorm lounges until they save enough money for a place to live. Maybe shows Ted the advertisement for an assistant to a celebrity personage. Ted uses his cell phone to call and land an interview. While Maybe tries to pretend fall asleep in the lounge, she wishes Ted were there. It doesn't seem as if the students passing by are even paying attention to her. She starts to wonder if this means she is officially homeless.

Chapters 17 and 18 Analysis

Maybe has never really been interested in dating a boy. When she sees Hollywood's roommate, Ian, she feels like she knows what love is for the first time. maybe also starts to think that if this is what college boys look like that she needs to reevaluate her decision to attend college. While Maybe has not led an idyllic life, she has always had food, shelter and clothes on her back. for the first time in her life, she is starting to know what it feels like to truly be homeless.



Chapters 19 and 20

Chapters 19 and 20 Summary

Maybe pawns her mother's wedding rings, but she only gets \$65 for them. She heads back to the dorm lounge to go to sleep. She has to hide out in the bathroom for a little while when a couple on a couch across from her starts making out. When they finally leave, Maybe falls asleep. When she wakes up the next morning, someone has stolen her purse. She goes to Hollywood's room but he;s at work. Ian lets her in to get the rest of her stuff. One girl at the sandwich shop gives her two free sandwiches because the girl made too many. As Maybe is eating, she sees a homeless woman that she saw previously and offers a sandwich to her. Maybe spends the majority of her days in the library, hiding in the stacks, reading the books and using the free bank of computers. She tries to find her real father, tries to contact agencies that help kids find their birth parents and even tries to obtain a copy of her borth certificate—all without any luck. She finds the book A Little Princess at the library. She tosses it out the bathroom window and goes outside to retrieve it. She takes it back to Hollywood's dorm room and reads it.

Chapters 19 and 20 Analysis

Maybe is experiencing how cold and cruel the world can be. It starts when she tries to pawn her mother's wedding rings. It carries through to when her purse is stolen. Maybe empathizes with the homeless woman because Maybe is starting to feel as if she is homeless too. She is paying forward the generosity the sandwich shop girl paid her with free sandwiches by offering the homeless woman a free sandwich too.



Chapters 21 and 22

Chapters 21 and 22 Summary

Hollywood brings Maybe lunch when he can. Ted takes care of feeding Maybe her dinner. Hollywood tells Maybe that she can't keep her things in his room and come and go as she pleases anymore because Ian is missing some money. Maybe gets her things and steals Ian's jar of mints and \$20 off his dresser. She finds a bush o hide her things in and meets Ted at his dorm lounge. He talks Hollywood and Maybe into going for a ride and surprises them with the Rolls-Royce. They go to a fancy restaurant, where Ted treats them because today was payday. he tells them that Gloria says he can live in her apartment above the garage but that Maybe can't live with him.

Chapters 21 and 22 Analysis

It seems as if Ted and Hollywood's lives are progressing but Maybe's is not. She keeps hoping that if she can find her father that it will change everything. In reality, however, finding her father is really a pipe dream. Even if Maybe does find her father, the odds of him being rich or a great guy that takes her in and changes her whole life are slim to none. Parker has been turning his head to the fact that Maybe is sleeping on the couch in the lounge. Since he can't afford to lose his job, though, he tries to give Maybe some money to help her, but he can't risk his family's welfare over Maybe.



Chapters 23 and 24

Chapters 23 and 24 Summary

Maybe sleeps in Hollywood's car for the next couple of days. Ted is so busy with his job that she hardly sees him. She spends her days at library and following people who are eating, so she can gather the food they throw away in trash cans. She still hasn't spent the money Parker loaned her. Maybe runs into Ian on campus, who tells her they caught the thief on campus. Maybe uses Parker's money to buy supplies to give herself a makeover. Chapters 23 and 24 Analysis

The homeless woman represents who Maybe thinks she is going to become if she doesn't find her father soon. Ted and Hollywood realize that things haven't turned out well for Maybe. Things definitely have not turned out the way she planned. They know they have to do something about her living situation. Even as bad as things are for Maybe, the last thing she wants to do is return to the way her life was.



Chapters 25 and 26

Chapters 25 and 26 Summary

Ted picks Maybe up in the Rolls. Maybe assumes that Ted is moving out of the garage apartment and has found them their own place. When she says this to Ted, he remains silent. Ted pulls up to a beautiful house with a bunch of gas windows. A model-like woman answers the door and seems to recognize Maybe. When they go inside, there are pictures of Chessy and maybe all over the walls. The woman says "he" will be back soon and she's sure they want to catch up.

An hour later, Sammy, Chessy's husband that she married twice walks n the door. This is Maybe's favorite of the husbands and she always though Sammy would adopt her, so when she sees him, she runs into his arms. Maybe tells Sammy about getting in a fight with her mother, but doesn't tell him what it is over. Eventually, Ted asks if Maybe can stay with Sammy. Sammy says she can but makes her call her mother to tell her. Maybe leaves a message on the answering machine. Sammy hits redial and leaves his own message.

Sammy takes Maybe to a room that is decorated in pink and white for a 10-year-old girl. Maybe remembers how her and Chessy were supposed to move out with Sammy to this very house, but that one of them never made it there. When Willow, Sammy's girlfriend, finds out Maybe is taying, she throws a fit. She accuses Sammy of never getting over Chessy.

Chapters 25 and 26 Analysis

The inference is that Ted has found Chessy's grandparents, rather than her father. It is also seems as if Chessy has relatives and a life that Maybe doesn't know anything about, but is about to uncover. The bond that Maybe and Sammy have is like that of a real father and a real daughter. It foreshadows Maybe realizing that a father-daughter bond doesn't have to be biological. Chapters 27 and 28 Summary

Chapters 27 and 28 Analysis

The fact that Sammy's house is a shrine to Maybe and Chessy, with their puictures everywhere, indicates that Sammy never got over his breakup with Chessy and his losing Maybe. Maybe thinks that Willow even reminds Maybe of a version of her mother. Maybe meeting the girl that works in the taco truck indicates that the two girls become friends, and Maybe might even get a job working in the tac truck for the summer until school starts again.



Chapters 29 and 30

Chapters 29 and 30 Summary

When Sammy gets home, he tells Maybe that he got her a job as a nanny. Maybe explains to Sammy and Willow that since Willow mentioned the Santa Anas were coming to visit that Maybe cleaned the house. Willow bursts out laughing and Sammy tries ti stifle a laugh as he explains the Santa Anas are winds that drive the whole town crazy.

Maybe meets with Tessa, who is the mother of the triplets she'll be babysitting for. Tessa agrees to pay Maybe \$11 an hour to work Monday through Friday and some weekends when Tessa and her husband have events to attend. Maybe visits Jess at the taco truck and it occurs to her that she could work for Jess instead. Maybe begs Jess to hire her and Jess relents.

Chapters 29 and 30 Analysis

Sammy wants Maybe to get a job so she stays out of trouble. Sammy pulls some strings to land Maybe a job, but Maybe is convinced that the kids she'd be sitting for are the devil's spawn. Instead, Maybe decides to work for Jess at the taco truck. It foreshadows Sammy getting mad at Maybe for turning down the nanny job to work in a taco truck instead.



Chapters 31 and 32

Chapters 31 and 32 Summary

Ted and Hollywood show up at Sammy's house as Sammy and Willow are on their way out to a movie. Hollywood tells Maybe and Ted that he's entering a documentary into a contest so he'll be busy working on that for a while. Maybe tells them about getting a job working on the taco truck and how she turned down the job as a nanny. Hollywood mentions that he wants to make Maybe proud. After Hollywood leaves, Ted asks Maybe if she likes Ted.

Maybe shows up the following morning for work. From the time Jess pulls up in the truck until it's time to go home, Maybe is extremely busy. She basically does everything Jess tells her, starting with changing out of her baggy t-shirt into a Benito's Tacos shirt that is tight on her. Jess hands Maybe a bag when it's time to go home. maybe finds enough food for a week, \$42 in cash, and two t-shirts in it. It's just Willow and Maybe at home because Sammy is away on a People magazine shoot in San Francisco. They both eat their respective meals and talk about how each one is freeloading off of Sammy.

Chapters 31 and 32 Analysis

Finally, she'll use the rest of the money to hire a private detective to find her father. Jess talks with Maybe about her relationship with Chessy while they work. Maybe calls to talk to Ridgeway. Chessamay

Chessamay "Chessy" Chestnut is Maybe's mother. Chessy is a blonde bombshell with big hair, big boobs, and a big personality. She charms the pants off men and is working on getting married for the seventh time. in addition to being a serial marryer. Chessy is also an alcoholic. Whenever something doesn't go right, Chessy turns to the bottle to resolve her problems.

Chessy runs a charm school, where she also consults with beauty pageant contestants to help them win their own crowns. In her younger days, Chessy was a beauty pageant contestant and winner—making it all the way to the Miss America Pageant. Ian is Hollywoods roommate in the dorms. Ian is from England. He is gorgeous and Maybe falls in love with him the first time she sees him. When Ian is missing money from he dorm room, he talks to Hollywood about it and Hollywood says that ted and Maybe cannot go and go in his room as they please. Later, Ian runs into Maybe and tells he they caught the kid that was stealing and it was an engineering student at the school.

Sammy Wing

Sammy Wing is the man that married Chessy twice. He is a photographer that lives in California now. Maybe has always looked up to Sammy as the only true father figure she has ever had. Ted finds Sammy and convinces him to allow Maybe to stay with him so that she won't be homeless anymore.

Sammy is obsessed with Chessy and has never gotten over her. Even though he has a new model girlfriend that is the younger version of Chessy, Willow, his house walls are still full of photographs of Chessy and Maybe. Sammy helps Maybe land a job as a nany, but supports Maybe when she turns down the job to work at the taco truck instead.

Sammy thinks of Maybe as his own daughter. He still thinks of Maybe as his stepdaughter, even though he and Chessy are no longer married.

Willow

Willow is Sammy's new live-in girlfriend. She reminds Maybe of a younger version of Chessy. At first, Willow is very snobby nd acts like she doesn't like Maybe. As the two get to know each other, Maybe and Willow form a special bond. Willow helps Maybe with her clothes, while Maybe helps Willow with her posture and other charm school etiquette that can help Willow with her actong career. Willow doesn't eat very much so she is very tall and slender. This leads tpo Maybe referring to Willow as Twig behind her back. When Willow starts to stress out over losing Sammy, howver, she starts to overeat. She gains enough weight to look healthy.

Jess

Jess is a girl that is about Maybe's age. Jess runs the taco truck Maybe comes across on one of her first days living with Sammy. Jess and Maybe start talking and they become friends. After Maybe realizes she doesn't want o work as a nanny for the triplets, she begs Jess to hire her to work at the taco truck.



Jess is Mexican and she has a deep sense of faiily loyalty. Even though she is accepted to Princeton, she is choosing to stay and run the taco truck for her uncle and her family. When Jess meets Hollywood, they take an instant liking to one another and start to date. Jess is a good friend to Maybe, also encouraging her and supporting her in all of the decisions that Maybe makes in her life.

Gloria de la Tour

Gloria de la Tour is the aging movie star that Ted starts to work for in her Hollywood mansion.gloria is somewhat of a recluse, so she hardly leaves her mansion or is hardly seen in public anymore. When Ted decides to return back to Kissimmee, however, Gloria makes an appearance at the dual going away-birthday party at the observatory for Ted and Maybe. Gloria adores Ted and she begs him not to leave her. In the end, Gloria agrees to try out Chessy as her new personal assistant to replace Ted.

Uncle Benny

Uncle Benny is Jess's uncle. He owns all of the taco trucks, including the one that Jess runs. He is about 28 years old, Mexican, and adamant that only family can work on the taco trucks. When he finds out that Jess has had Maybe working on the truck, he demands to put Maybe's cooking skills to the test. Uncle Benn ends up loving Maybe's tacos and allows her to continue to work on the taco truck.



Objects/Places

Kissimmee, Florida

Kissimmee is a small town in Central Florida, relatively close to Orlando. It is also the town where Maybe was born and raised. Chessy too lived in Kissimmee for most of her life and doesn't appear to want to leave it. Kissimmee is the primary location for the novel until Ted, Maybe and Hollywood leave for Los Angeles.

Charm School

Chessy runs the charm school. The charm school is located on the bottom floor of Chessy and Maybe's house. The top five clients of Chessy's charm school are the Fantastic Five. These are five girls that attend school with Maybe, but are constantly picking on her and harassing her.

Los Angeles, California

Los Angeles, California is the setting for the remainder of the novel. It is the city where Ted, Hollywood and Maybe drive to in search of Maybe's father and so Hollywood can attend college. It is also where Maybe and Ted become homeless unless Ted lands his job with Gloria de la Tour, and Maybe moves in with Sammy. Ultimately, it is the city that changes Maybe's life and where she and Chessy decide to call home to start the next chapter in their lives.

Koolaid

Koolaid is what Maybe uses to dye her hair the various crazy colors throughout the novel. She is using the Koolaid packets to dye her hair in the Burger King bathroom when the manager kicks her out. Maybe buys the Koolaid packets with some of the money Parker gives to her and in an attempt to make herself feel better after everything that has happened to her since she arrived in California.

Chessy's Wedding Rings

Chessy has as et of wedding rings from each of her six marriages. Before leaving Kissimmee, Maybe steals the wedding rings. Maybe pawns them when she gets to California, but keeps the one that was from Sammy. Maybe only gets \$65 for the wedding rings from the pawn shop. The money goes missing when somoen steals Maybe's purse while she is sleeping in the ounge of the dorm.



Rolls-Royce

The Rolls-Royce is Gloria de la Tour's car. She allows Ted to drive it when the chauffeur is off work. Ted has to wear platform shows to be able to reach the pedals and the steering wheel at the same time. Ted, Maybe and Hollywood have many adventures while tooling around in the Rolls-Royce.

Taco Truck

Maybe stumbles across the taco truck at a construction site after her interview as a nany. Maybe strikes up a conversation with Jess, who is running the truck. Maybe returns to the truck a few times and starts a friendship with Jess. Maybe convinces Jess to allow Maybe to work in the truck, which Maybe does for the remainder of the summer.

Photographs

Photographs play a pivotal role in several portions of the novel. It is aphotograph of a man named Gunnar and Chessy that Maybe finds taken around the time her mother would have conceived her. This photograph leads Maybe to believe the man in the photo is her father, and this is the man Maybe searches for, and eventually finds in California.

Sammy is a professional photographer. When Maybe arrives at Sammy's house in California, the walls are covered with his photographs of Chessy and Maybe. Sammy also takes photographs of the food at the taco truck to help Jess and maybe make the ordering process faster and easier on the customers.

DNA Test

When Maybe meets with Gunnar, Gary, he gives her a prepaid DNA test. He tells Maybe to provide some saliva and send the test in to the lab to see if she is his biological daughter. Ted takes the DNA test instead, which is how he finds out he is half French and half Chinese instead of Thai.

Andy Warhol Scarf

One of Maybe's purchases from the local vintage shop is an Andy Warhol scarf. Maybe wears the scarf around her waist as a belt and around her head at various points in the novel. During the dual going away/birthday party at the conservatory, Maybe gives Ted the scarf to remember her when he returns to Kissimmee.



Themes

Relationships

One of the primary themes running through the novel is relationships. The two primary relationships the novel tackles is the relationships of a family and friendships. The novel lightly touches upon romantic relationships as well.

Friendship is one of the primary types of relationships the novel tackles. Ted and Maybe become best friends as soon as Ted defends Maybe against the harassment of the Fantastic Five. Ted and Maybe are always there for each other no matter what happens in their respective lives.

Hollywood too turns out to be a good friend to both Ted and Maybe. At first, he agrees to drive them out to California with him when he goes to college. As their lives unfold and challenges face them in California, Ted continues to try to help Maybe and Ted in any way that he can.

For the first time, Maybe forms a friendship with another teenage girl, when she befriends Jess. Even the relationship between Willow and Maybe becomes a type of friendship as they get to know each other and help each other throughout the novel.

The novel lightly touches upon romantic relationships. First, it reveals Hollywood has a crush on Maybe. Maybe, however, only thinks of Hollywood as a really good friend. When Jess and Hollywood meet, they start to date. Jess proclaims Hollywood, who she knows by his real name of Daniel, as someone she just clicks with.

Coming of Age

One of the primary themes that run throughout the novel is growing up and coming of age, even against adversity, such as having an alcoholic mother, not knowing who your biological father is and being a homeless teenager. Maybe struggles with the fact that her coming of age includes having to learn how to live on the streets when she finds herself broke and homeless on the streets of Los Angeles.

Maybe tries to take on adult responsibilities, but realizes that she needs help from the adults in her life to turn her life around. Jamie also faces the fact that even though she has always thought of her father as a savior that could turn her life around, that he in fact turns out to be a jerk. Additionally, Maybe discovers that her mother means well when she's giving advice, even though it might sound like criticism or disappointment.



Family

Family is the central theme throughout the entire novel. This is because the storyline is about the lives of this particular family—the Chestnuts. While every family has their trials and tribulations, Maybe's family has its own family dynamics that are the same and that are different from those of other families. In the end though, they are a family and they will get through it together, one way or the other.

Additionally, Maybe learns that a family is more about the people that are there for you, rather than the ones that are biologically related to you. Sammy is more of a father to her than her biological father. Even Ted, Hollywood and Ted's family act as a surrogate family to Maybe in her times of need.



Style

Point of View

The novel is written in the first person point of view, from the perspective of the main character, Maybe Chestnut. The point of view of this novel is intimate, allowing a reader to connect closely with the main character, Maybe. The book written in this manner allows the reader to get inside Maybe's head, thoughts and inner struggles. The reader cares what happens to the narrator. The point of view also allows the author to inject her own opinions into the narration and to expand on the events taking place around the other characters and the occurrences taking place.

Setting

The novel takes place in Kissimmee, Florida and Los Angeles, California during the 21st century. The main characters are involved in the daily life of living with an alcoholic mother and then trying to make it on her own as a teenage runaway..

The setting of this novel works well with the plot. At first, the reader is not aware that the main character is going to runaway from home to find her biological father. However, as events unfold, the search for Maybe's father is a constant part of the plot, the lives of the characters and even the outcome of the novel.

Language and Meaning

The language of this novel is relatively simple and easy to read. The language is from the 21st century, which is when the novel is set. The language is descriptive enough that it helps to explain the situations and is detailed enough for the reader to truly understand.

Structure

The novel is divided into 68 chapters. Each chapter ranges from one pages to 10 pages long. The chapters tell the story primarily in exposition and with some dialogue. The narrator injects her own voice and thoughts throughout the book, providing her opinions and feelings of the events unfolding in the novel. The narrator switches back and forth between the past and the present.

The novel contains one main plot and several subplots. The main plot is that of human relationships—family and friendships. One subplot is the coming of age of the characters, primarily Maybe Chestnut. Another subplot is family.
