Plot Summary

Maximum Ride and her flock must stop the Doomsday Group from exterminating the human race. Max is heartbroken after being left by Fang, the love of her life. She is even more devastated to learn that he has started his own flock and is hanging out with Maya, Max's clone. Max pulls herself together with the help of Dylan, an attractive boy who was created to be Max's perfect mate. Max's flock has taken her to her mother's home in order to help her out of her depression. The flock is visited by Jeb and Dr. Hans, whom they hate, and asked to visit the Generation 77 kids. The kids are a new breed of experiments.

Fang and his gang discover the Doomsday Gang, a group of people who worship the One Light. The group is trying to eradicate the human race. They want all kids to be genetically modified and to lead a new world order. Whereas Max's flock was created in test tubes from a mix of human and avian DNA, Fang's new group has been genetically modified in a lab after birth. Fang has been told to begin a gang in order to save the world.

After Max's sister is almost enhanced by the Doomsday Group, the flock and the gang join forces to fight the Group. They manage to keep the Group from killing tens of thousands of people in Paris, but they still have not discovered the identity of the mastermind, the One Light. Max battles her feelings for Fang and her growing feelings for Dylan. She feels replaced in Fang's life by Maya. Fang feels he must sacrifice their relationship to save the world.

At the end of the book, the gang and the flock go separate ways. Angel is believed dead, but is really being held in a lab.

Chapter 1:

Max is in the midst of a nightmare. She is inside a large cage in the lab where she grew up. She has been returned to the lab, despite having been free earlier. Max is being guarded by a bullying guard who carries a wooden billy club. As the guard paces near her cage, Max taunts him. As a result, the guard cracks his club against her cage, eventually weakening the bars enough for Max to make an escape. Max kicks down the bars and takes off. She sprouts her wings and begins to fly toward the glass windows at the top of the room. Fang is on the other side, ready to have her back as he has many times before. Max hits the glass, but it doesn't break, she falls back into the lab and is caught. Fang's face is expressionless and Max realizes he isn't there to help her. Max wakes to find herself at the top of some trees, not back in the lab where she was raised. She remembers that Fang isn't there for her and he will never be there for her again.

Chapter 2:

Max is in Arizona with her friends visiting her mother and half-sister, Ella. Max is sitting in the tree tops wallowing in self-pity because the love of her life, Fang, has abandoned her. Fang felt Max would be better off without him and left. Max is nursing a broken heart. She knows she should be happy that her group is safe and no one is injured, but she can't get over Fang leaving eight days earlier. Max thinks about how much fun her friends are having playing Cranium and eating cookies, but she isn't happy. She threw away the promise ring Fang gave her, but dug it out of the trash later on.

Chapter 3:

Max's pity party is interrupted by Dylan. Dylan is new to her flock, but Max swears he isn't a part of her group. No matter what he might say to the contrary. Max is itching for a fight and kicks Dylan when he suggests that Max doesn't know who she is without Fang. Max reflects on how Dylan was a love sick boy who couldn't fly only a week ago. Now he is sarcastic, bold and a good fighter. The two spar with each other and Dylan knocks Max off of her branch. He expands his 15 food wings and swoops down to catch her, kissing her hard and then flying off. Max is in shock and remarks that her obituary would read, "Killed by love."

Chapter 4:

Dylan taunts Max into a fight. Max flies up and circles him, ready to do battle. As they fight, Dylan tells Max he can't believe she is the same Max who has battled despots and is called a warrior. Max is angry, she becomes even more angry when he calls her



behavior pathetic. Max notices that Dylan is learning from her as they fight, with every punch and kick his skills get better. Max tells Dylan to leave her and he tells her he can't. Dylan was created to be Max's perfect mate, her other half. He has been programmed to imprint on her. Max isn't sure she believes what he says about this. Dylan tells her he would want to be around her even if he had been programmed to stay away from her. Max doesn't want to hear it, she can't stop thinking about Fang, and drops out of the sky away from him.

Chapter 5:

Max returns home to find the flock having a normal day. They have been at her biological mother's home for about a week. Max likes having a mother and a sister. Ella has a crush on Iggy. Iggy is blind from a lab accident. Angel and Gazzy are brother and sister. They are angelic looking, but Max thinks that Angel can be duplicitous and she doesn't trust the 7 year old. Angel has the ability to read peoples energy and emotions. She tells the group that Jeb and Dr. Hans Gunther-Hagen are coming, she can hear them. Max's mother told them where the flock was. Max is upset with Jeb because he killed Fang the last time she saw him. She isn't sure she wants to seem him, but she consents to the visit. Valencia, Max's mother, tells her Jeb was insistent on the visit and said he had something important to share with Max. Dylan comes into the room and says they shouldn't be allowed to come if Max doesn't want them here. Max is annoyed that Dylan is sticking up for her.

Chapter 6:

Jed and Dr. Hans have come to tell Max and the flock that there is another generation of mutants being created. They explain that scientists are becoming more successful creating human-hybrids who are able to evolve more quickly than others who have come before. They tell the flock that these hybrids are who they will lead after Max and her friends save the world. Jed and Dr. Hans want the flock to start leading these new hybrids now.

Chapter 7:

Jeb and Dr. Hans explain to the flock that the new generation of children have a variety of powers. They call them Generation 77 and point out that the generation is completely unpredictable. The men think Max is an extraordinary leader and want her to unite all of the generations under one leader, her. Jeb tells the group that they will be the survivors of the apocalypse and they need to be trained starting now. Dr. Hans wants to say more, but Jeb stops him. However, it is too late. Angel has read the Dr.'s mind and knows what he wants to say.

Chapter 8:

Jeb and Dr. Hans tell the group that they already know there will be a life changing event happening from which only a few will survive. The group is reminded that Max is to be the leader of this new group. However, lab created people like the flock have a built-in expiration date. Max realizes they will die suddenly, they just don't know when.



Jeb and Dr. Hans tell the group that Max will be the leader of the new society that forms after the apocalypse and they need to think about who will take over when, and if, she dies. The men point out that societies in turmoil do better when a successor is already in place. Max's idea of an election won't work in an unstable society. They want her to reproduce so there are heirs to the new "throne." Everyone becomes silent. Max can't believe what she is hearing. She is only 15 and she feels the idea of having babies for the new society is inhuman. Dr. Hans wants Max to set up house with Dylan and have children. Valencia stops them right there. She tells Dr. Hans he needs to drop it or get out of her house. Max is relieved that she isn't the only person who thinks this idea is crazy. Dylan looks just as uncomfortable with the idea, but Max can see a glimmer of hope in his eyes.

Chapter 9:

Fang is in an empty alley waiting for his prey. He has been waiting for a while, listening as a group of people drink and argue. Finally the person he has been waiting for goes into the alley alone. Fang follows the guy, but the guy gets the drop on Fang and pins him to the wall. Fang gets the upper hand and the boys agree they have been looking for each other. Fang asks for the password, which is "Maximum." The guy's name is Ratchet and the pair met online. Ratchet is the first member of Fang's new flock.

Chapter 10:

Jeb and Dr. Hans have dropped the conversation about Max reproducing. They want Max to go with them to meet the kids of Gen 77 in their home at the Rocco Laurie School for the Gifted. Max tells them no, she has no intention of going to meet them. She enjoys the men's frustration at her answer. Max is surprised when Angel agrees with her, telling the men that Max is the leader and they will do what she wishes. Max knows that Angel wants to be the leader of the flock and is surprised the young girl is being so agreeable. Max's mother tells them all that she would like to go meet the kids. She tells Max that she is a scientist and is curious. Max decides they can go, how can she tell her mother no?

Book One: The Sky Is Falling, Chs. 1 - 10. Analysis

Chapter 1:

Max tells her story in the first person, talking directly to the reader as if she has intentionally written her story for the reader. This is one of the final books in the Maximum Ride series. Max is introduced as a 15 year old girl who refers to herself as a mutant. The scene catches the reader up on Max's background, being raised in a lab, and her present, being free. It also introduces Fang as an important person in Max's life who has abandoned her for some reason. The chapter is short, but covers a lot of information which is necessary to introduce the characters to those who are unfamiliar with the series.

Chapter 2:



Fang made the decision to leave so that Max would be safe, but Max doesn't appreciate having her decisions made for her. She is upset Fang left and she is heartbroken. Max's group is introduced: Gazzy 9, Iggy 15, Nudge 12, and Angel 7. Max is their leader and feels responsible for her group.

Chapter 3:

Max is caught off guard by Dylan. Not just by his sudden appearance at the top of the trees, but also by his abilities and his kiss. Max explains that she and her group were created in test tubes. Their DNA was combined with some bird DNA which gives them wings and some other special features. She tells the reader that Dylan is different. He was cloned from an actual boy named Dylan, who is now dead. She describes is looks as model-like. She describes them all as birdkids.

Chapter 4:

Dylan was created to be a partner for Max. Max thinks this isn't true and tells him he should wait until there are other girls to choose from. Max is surprised by the changes in Dylan. He is a better fighter now and he is more sarcastic. When she met him, just recently, he was kind, compassionate, and followed her around with cow eyes. Max's real anger with Dylan comes from the fact that he is saying out loud what Max is thinking about herself. Max isn't used to being vulnerable and she doesn't like the way she is acting and feeling now that Fang is gone. Max seems confused about his feelings for Max. He is programmed to love her, but he thinks he would love her even if he wasn't forced to do so.

Chapter 5:

Max gives more background on the other characters in the book. She provides details about her flocks' various attributes, abilities and disabilities. She also provides information about her mother and sister; both of whom are relatively new to her, but both of whom she cares for.

Chapter 6:

This chapter explains why Max and her flock were created. They lived their early lives in a lab called the School. Max and her flock are the fifty-fourth generation of hybrids created by the scientists at the lab. They have also been the most successful. Max reveals that the flock has had to battle other generations of hybrids in the past. Most notably generation 17, the Erasers. Max doesn't trust Jeb or Dr. Hans. She feels that they are harmed each time they try to help them. Max looks at them as mad scientists and feels they can either use their intelligence for good or for evil. Max and her flock have been created to save the world. Scientist around the world are working on creating human-hybrids who can evolve faster than normal human beings.

Chapter 7:



Jeb and Hans want Max to be the leader of this newly developed generation. The generation is unpredictable and needs guidance.

Chapter 8:

Dylan was created to be Max's perfect mate, but it is clear that Max is a strong girl who will choose who she loves and who she doesn't. The Doctor and Jeb show themselves to be morally bankrupt men. They are concerned for the state of humanity, but they do not consider it wrong to do anything to reach their goals. Valencia, also a doctor, loves Max more than she wants to secure the future of the human race. It is clear that the flock is tired of being used as the doctor and Jeb's pawns.

Chapter 9:

The point of view for this chapter is third person, focusing on Fang's thoughts and feelings. Fang left Maximum for reasons he doesn't think she will understand. The exact reason is still unclear, but Fang feels it is his mission to start a new flock. His choice of Ratchet indicates his flock will be a dangerous, if not lethal, one.

Chapter 10:

Angel has read Valencia's intent, so she doesn't argue with Max. Angel is calculating, so Max is surprised when she doesn't try to undermine Max's initial decision. Max enjoys telling the men no and likes that they are annoyed. She likes to exercise what little power she has over her own life and destiny. Max doesn't want Dylan to include himself as a member of her flock, however, Dylan is always on Max's side and defends the decisions she makes.

Chapter 11:

They fly to see the Gen 77 kids in Jeb and Dr. Han's corporate jet. Max flies outside the plane using her wings. She needs some time to think. Angel projects into Max's head that there is a building in the distance. Max sees it and then flies smack into a jellyfish.

Chapter 12:

Max realizes the place is booby trapped from the air. She didn't run into jellyfish, but into large balloons. The balloons are tethered by wires coated with diamond powder. The wires shear off a part of her wing tips. Max shouts to Angel telepathically and the girl tries to get the pilot to turn, but it is too late. Chapter 13:

Chapter 14:

Fang and Ratchet are in a diner waiting for someone else to meet them. Ratchet tells Fang that he can hear thoughts, like Angel. He has been living with a street gang since his mother kicked him out. She thought he was a devil because he could read her mind. Life was tough on the street so he took up with the gang. Ratchet is afraid they will come looking for him. Fang tells him that they will think he was kidnapped. Ratchet sees a blonde girl coming to find them, she has Fang's name on a Post-It note. Fang is impressed because the girl is a few blocks away and not yet in their visual field.

Chapter 15:

Gazzy sees Jeb getting ready to jump from the plane and realizes he is the only one who can save him. He grabs Jeb under the arms, but the man is to heavy for 9 year old Gazzy. Jeb tells Gazzy that the human race will have to die to save the planet. Then he lets go of Gazzy and falls to his death. Gazzy blames himself for Jeb's death.



Chapter 16:

Star joins Fang and Ratchet in the diner. There is tension between Star and Ratchet. They eat sushi, which Star and Ratchet hate. Star eats like a machine, but is thin. She has perfect hair, perfect clothes, and an expensive purse. She tells the boys she ran the 20 miles to see them and they aren't convinced. She takes them to her school to see her friend, Kate, whom she says is strong. Star runs the whole way without breaking a sweat. Ratchet drives his Camero and Fang flies. Star beats them each time the race along the way until the boys give up.

Chapter 17:

Dylan comes out of the sky in time to save Jeb. Everyone lands on the ground in the hot Arizona sun. Valencia has a broken arm, Jeb a broken leg, Iggy and Nudge are also injured.

Chapter 18:

They decide not to go to the hospital to seek treatment for their injuries, too many questions about their blood types and DNA. Instead, Valencia calls her doctor friends and they come to pick everyone up. Dr. Hans is nowhere to be found. He pushed Dylan out of the plane and Dylan assumed he jumped out afterward. Dylan has the ability to heal himself, unlike the others, so he volunteers to go and find Hans. Max decides to go with him.

Chapter 19:

Max and Dylan take off in flight to find Hans. Max notices the differences between Fang and Dylan: their builds, their wings. She thinks that she will be really upset if she has been programmed to only love Dylan. She also wonders for the first time if the flock have all been mixed with DNA from different types of birds. Max and Dylan both say the same weird sentence at the same time and are shocked by it. They also both wonder if the other can read their mind.

Chapter 20:

Fang, Ratchet, and Star meet up with Kate. Kate is gorgeous and Fang is annoyed when he realizes Ratchet is flirting with her. Kate is also a vegan. They check into a hotel and turn on the TV. A news reporter is in Paris reporting on a new organization called the Doomsday Group. The group is lead by no one. A person speaking for the group, Beth, says they want to cleanse the earth. Everyone seems to be alright with this statement. The group sprang from nowhere and is already thousands strong. Fang watches the interview and finds himself mesmerized. He believes the Group will make people happy. The TV is turned off and Fang snaps out of it. He realizes his mission is to find out more about the Group and save the world. He wonders who will save it firs: him or Max.

Chapter 21:



Max and Dylan inspect the wires. Dylan has the ability to see far and very up close. He can also see through some things. He tells Max that the wires have four sides, each side like a razor. Max teaches Dylan how to fly sideways. Something the flock learned from hawks. They can't find Hans or the plane's fuselage, so they decide to fly over and inspect the school. Again they say the same thing at the same time.

Chapter 22:

Fang tells his gang that they are waiting for one more girl and one more boy. He tells them they were each chosen because where one was weak, another was strong. Star and Ratchet begin fighting because he changes the channel while she is watching TV. Star runs at him, but Ratchet can read her intent and is ready for her. Kate breaks them up with her superhuman strength. Fang hears Max's voice.

Chapter 23:

Fang turns to look at Max. She looks like Max, smells like her, and sets Fang's heart racing like Max. But this is not Max. She is a clone of Max, Fang refers to her as Max II. She refers to herself as Maya. She and Max have meet before and came up with this plan for him to form a gang. They are meeting now as planned in the hotel. Fang feels like Maya is reading his mind and laughing at him. The rest of the group is introduced. It is obvious that Star doesn't like Maya (Max II). Ratchet makes a joke about liking strong women and Kate blushes.

Chapter 11:

Max doesn't trust the men and thinks getting them to see the kids is part of a trap to get her to work with the kids. She thinks she should hang back and watch what happens, then realizes Angel can hear her thoughts.

Chapter 12:

Max realizes too late that they are in danger. She watches in horror as the plane is destroyed by the booby traps.

Chapter 13:

The pacing is picking up. Everyone Max loves is in the plane. Except for Ella, who is at school. The flock tries to save Jeb, Dr. Hans, and Valencia.

Chapter 14:

Fang is collecting people with interesting skills for his new flock. It is unclear why.

Chapter 15:



This is a very short chapter told in the third person with Gazzy's inner thoughts. Jeb tells Gazzy the human race must be sacrificed for the good of the planet. Then he tells him he is going to sacrifice himself to save Gazzy because Gazzy can't save them both.

Chapter 16:

Star seems to be an asset to the team Fang is building. She has the gift of speed, Ratchet can read minds, and Fang can fly.

Chapter 17:

Much to Max's relief, everyone lands alive.

Chapter 18:

Max wants to go with the others to make sure they are treated, but some part of her doesn't want to leave Dylan. She isn't suspicious of him, she just wants to be near him. She begins to wonder if she has been programmed to fall in love with Dylan like he has been programmed to love her. Max decides this can't be true given the feelings she has for Fang. Dylan seems glad Max is going with him and she likes that he is happy.

Chapter 19:

Max is beginning to wonder about the origins of the flock and how they were created. She wonders if they have different attributes because they were created with different types of bird DNA. She is still suspicious of Dylan, but she finds she doesn't want to get away from him anymore. Dylan shows how well he adapts to things when he flies. Max can see that he easily learned the flying techniques she taught him.

Chapter 20:

Fang decided to recruit older kids so he wouldn't have to worry about their safety. The Doomsday Group is introduced. On the outside, they seem to be a very nonthreatening group, however, their message about cleansing the earth has scary undertones. Fang now knows his mission is to find out about the group. Fang thinks about Max and has a pang in his heart, but he doesn't dwell on his feelings. It isn't clear how Fang knows he has a mission or what it is.

Chapter 21:

Dylan is a fast learner and Max is impressed by his vision. Dylan tells her everyone has their own gift and he is humble about his.

Chapter 22:

Fang didn't realize Max talked so much because she was a leader. He has been making a lot of realizations about Max lately. He tells his gang they were chosen because what



might harm one may not hurt the other. Each of his new gang has a special ability that will come in handy when investigating the Doomsday Group.

Chapter 23:

It is now revealed how Fang came to be organizing his own gang. He has meet Max II, Maya, and they plotted his moves. Fang thinks about his physical and emotional reaction to Maya and realizes this was a bad idea.

Chapter 24:

Max points out that he is human and the kid tells them he isn't really. Then he runs off. The trio head home.

Chapter 30:

Fang tells Maya how he put together his gang. The gang was created by scientific experiments, they weren't born the way they are like he and Maya were. Kate and Star were injected with things that changed their genes. Holden was cut open again and again until they potion they gave him allowed him to regenerate limbs and heal himself. Fang is attracted to Maya because of her likeness to Max. He hates talking and hopes he can find peace with Maya that is like what he had with Max before their relationship became complicated. Fang shows Maya the Doomsday Group and she agrees they are scary. Fang points out that they like genetically modified kids, but don't realize that not everyone wants to be modified. Gazzy flies up and tells them Angel was right behind him. He looks terrified that he can't find his sister. Fang shows up and Max clutches him. Then she lets him go and asks about Angel. She can see the emotion in his eyes and it tells her he doesn't know where Angel is. Max flies back in pain realizing she has lost her "child."

Chapter 78:

Everyone searches for Angel. In the process they help human survivors of the explosions. Gazzy is heartbroken and blames himself, he thought he had dismantled all of the wires. Max wrestles with the decisions she faced: save one person or save a city and its inhabitants. When they find Angels bloody shoe, Max breaks down. Fang gathers her in his arms and she cries on his shoulder.

Chapter 79:



After a day of searching, Max sits in the wreckage thinking of Angel. Fang comes to Max and tells her that his group is leaving. He tells her they are taking the information learned from Gazzy and going in search of the One Light. He is convinced Mark was not the leader of the Group. He tells Max to take care, looks at Dylan, and is off. Dylan hugs Max, then she tells her flock they will go in search of Jeb, her mother, and Ella.

Book Three: Paris Is Burning, Chs. 68 - 79. Analysis

Chapter 68:

Everyone is stressed about what is going to happen. It has been two days since Angel and Gazzy left and Max is worried about them. Dylan tries to comfort her and she wonders if she will ever get used to him touching her. She also wonders why she has to deal with her feelings while the world needs saving.

Chapter 69:

Again Dylan tells Max just what she wants and needs to hear. This time she asks him if he can read minds. He tells her no, but says he wouldn't tell her if he could. Angel's message is fuzzy, but Max goes to her.

Chapter 70:

Dylan left the rest of the flock to follow after Max. She is who he is worried about the most. Max and Dylan aren't sure if the person calling to Max is really Angel. The voice sounds like Angel. Max is worried because she hasn't heard Angel sound this scared in a long time.

Chapter 71:

It is a trap.

Chapter 72:

Max doesn't want to make the decision to tell Gazzy to leave the room. If he fails to dismantle the bomb he will die. If she orders him out tens of thousands will die. Angel makes the decision for Max. Max can't imagine losing Angel too. Fang also volunteers to stay. Max realizes she needs to trust her instincts and do her part. Angel tells her that no matter what happens, she believes in Max. Forever.

Chapter 73:

The book has been building toward the climax for the last three chapters. Max has confronted her leadership issues and has had to let go of her friends. She has also had to learn to rely on others, not just on herself. This is a huge growth point for Max's character.



Chapter 74:

Max's only thought is to take care of the zombie like kids so she can go back for Angel and Gazzy. She believes Fang will keep them safe, but she want to make sure.

Chapter 75:

Dylan's injury helps Max realize she has feelings for him. Fang shows he is wiling to put his personal feelings aside for the good of the group. Dylan is also willing to do this.

Chapter 76:

The climax of the action comes when Maya saves Max's life.

Chapter 77:

Max never thought she would lose Fang forever. That he would be gone for good. She is relieved to see him and at the same time angry that he left Angel behind. Despite their rocky relationship, Max is destroyed at the thought of Angel's death.

Chapter 78:

Max doesn't understand how Mark and his Group could have done this to so many people. She is confused about her mother, Jeb, and Ella and wonders if they played some part of this. She is also confused about the choices she has made as a leader, if they were the right choices. She thinks about how familiar Fang's embrace is and then thinks about how unfamiliar he is to her right now. The overarching plot has been resolved, but there are more questions which must be answered in the next book (the final installment of the series). Max has grown as a person, but her love life and future have yet to be determined.

Chapter 79:

Max can't believe Fang is leaving at that moment. She expects him to say he will see her again, but he doesn't she interprets his parting glance at Dylan as saying it is Dylan's job to look after her now. Max gathers her courage, still crying, and prepares for her next steps.

Epilogue: Famous Last Words. Summary

Angel regains consciousness in some sort of medical room. She is bloody and her memory is hazy. She has an IV and there is a tube being put down her throat. She recognizes the smell of disinfectant. She isn't sure if Max and the others have been saved and she begins to cry. A voice talks to Angel, it tells her she is superhuman and special. It tells her she is admired and that superhumans are needed in the new world.

Epilogue: Famous Last Words. Analysis

The Epilogue solves the question about Angel's fate. It also sets up another challenge for Max and her flock to meet in the next book.



Characters

Maximum Ride.

Maximum Ride, Max, is a 15 year old girl who has been charged with saving the world. Max was created in a test tube when scientists combined human and bird DNA. She lived most of her life in a cage as a part of an experiment. Max has wings and can fly like a bird. She is the leader of a group she refers to as her flock.

Dylan.

Dylan is a clone who was created to be Max's perfect mate. He has excellent vision and can sometimes see through objects. Dylan has model good looks and has imprinted on Max. He is in love with her. He is a fast learner and has learned flying and fighting skills quickly.

Fang.

Fang is Max's best friend and the love of her life. Fang left Max so he could create his own gang and save the world. Fang is dark haired and handsome. He is unemotional and Max finds it hard to know his feelings. Fang also has wings and was a test tube baby.

Angel.

Angel is a blond 7 year old. She wants to take control of the flock from Max. She is at times Max's friend and other times she works to undermine Max. Angel is a birdkid who was created in a test tube. She has the power to read people's thoughts and feelings.

Gazzy.

Gazzy is 9 years old. He is Angel's biological brother and is obsessed with explosives. He is a birdkid and part of Max's flock. Gazzy is blonde and is also a test tube baby.

lggy.

Iggy is a 15 year old member of Max's flock. He is blind and is a birdkid. He was born in the same lab as the others.



Nudge.

Nudge is an African American girl. She is a birdkid and also a member of Max's flock.

Ella.

Ella is Max's human half-sister. She lives with Max's mother and genetic donor. Ella has a crush on Iggy and becomes brainwashed by the Doomsday Group.

Jed.

Jed is someone who the flock used to trust, but no longer believe in. Jed helped to raise the flock, but he puts his ideals and scientific nature over their well being.

Dr. Hans.

Dr. Hans is one of the scientists responsible for changing kids and creating human experiments. He dies after being flung from an airplane.

Dr. Valencia Martinez.

Valencia is Max's biological mother. She contributed the genetic material to help create Max. She lives in Arizona and genuinely loves Max.

Star.

Star is a member of Fang's gang. She is blonde and can run fast.

Kate.

Kate is a member of Fang's gang. She is beautiful and has super strength.

Ratchet.

Ratchet is a member of Fang's gang. He is a street kid with superhuman hearing and can read minds.

Maya.

Maya is a clone of Max, she is originally named Max II. She is a member of Fang's gang.



Objects/Places

The Rocco Laurie School for the Gifted.

The Rocco Laurie School is the place where the Generation 77 kids are created and housed. Jed and Valencia convince the flock to go to the school to meet the new generation. Max and her flock are attacked by kids there who have hundreds of eyes in a line around their head. The school is where the Doomsday Group is altering kids.

The School.

The School is the flock's name for the lab where they were created and raised. The kids were locked in cages at the School and were experimented on while they lived there.

The D-day Rally.

The D-day Rally is the event that takes place at the climax of the book. The rally is held in Paris and is led by the believers in the One Light. The rally is rigged with explosives.

Comic-Con.

Comic-Con is a convention where people go who are fans of comic books, science fiction, and fantasy. It is in San Diego and Fang's gang goes to see if the Doomsday Group will have their rally there.

Arizona.

Arizona is where a majority of the book takes place. It is where Valencia lives and where the flock takes Max when she is depressed about Fang leaving.

San Diego.

San Diego is where the Comic-Con convention takes place. It is also where Fang's gang and Max's flock meet up for the first time.

Valencia's House.

Valencia's house is a place where Max and the flock feel safe and cared for. Valencia makes them chocolate chip cookies. They go there to relax and regroup.



Gen 77.

Gen 77 is the the newest group of genetically enhanced kids. They are the new generation which has been created to dominate the world after humanity dies.

Paris.

Paris is the site of the D-day rally and it is where the climax of the book takes place.

One Light.

One Light is the force behind the Doomsday Group.



Themes

Scientific Ethics.

Scientific ethics play a very important role in the book. The lack of ethics of some scientists have caused kids to be created who do not fit into normal society. These scientists feel it is alright to sacrifice a few kids for their ideals and the greater good.

The Flock - Max and her flock have been created by scientists. They were born from test tube mixes of human and bird DNA. They are not thought of as human, but as experiments. The flock grew up locked in cages by scientists who felt they were only important for experimentation purposes.

The Gang- Fang's gang is made of kids who were genetically experimented on after birth and against their will. The scientists who changed them felt it was their right to "improve" them without their consent because it was for the betterment of society.

Angel, Fang, and Max all express their feelings about the gruesomeness of experiments gone wrong. They wonder how many kids have been tortured, killed, or maimed in the name of scientific advancement.

Family and Friendship.

The flock and the gang are families tied together by the bonds of friendship. They must rely on each other and trust each other, however, they argue and fight like a blood-related family.

Max and Valencia are blood related, but they are bonded together by their affection for one another. However, Max becomes suspicious of Valencia and wonders if she can trust her. She feels she can only trust her friends.

Ella is Max's sister, yet the she goes with the flock to meet Fang instead of going to find Ella at the school.

Max and Angel have a love-hate relationship. They are not blood related, but Max considers Angel to be like her child.

Leadership.

Leadership styles are another theme in the book. Both Fang and Max are leaders of groups, but they lead in different ways and feel differently toward leadership.

Max- Likes being a leader. She is a bold leader, but she is temperamental. Her moods often affect the group in bad ways.



Fang- Fang is a reluctant leader. He is a quiet boy, but must step up and take the lead when he is sent on a mission. He doesn't understand why Max enjoys leading and wonders why Angel covets it. Fang doesn't bully people like Max, instead he tries team building.

Angel- Angel covets Max's job as a leader. However, she ends up as Max's leader. Angel's words and guidance help Max grow.



Style

Point of View

The majority of "Angel: A Maximum Ride Novel" is told in the first person by Max. She tells the story as if writing in a journal or book. Sometimes she speaks directly to the reader and references previous novels in the series. Angel is a sarcastic 15 year old who's words reflect both her age and maturity level.

Some chapters are told in the third person limited. Fang, Angel, and Gazzy. Their thoughts and feelings are open to the reader in these chapters. As is the action from their point of view.

Setting

The first half of the book takes place in Arizona in and around Max's mother's home. As the action builds the setting changes to California and Paris. The climax of the book takes place is Paris, as does the falling action, resolution, and epilogue. Each setting contributes to the tension of the book. The Arizona portions of the book are slower paced and deal more with Max's feelings. California picks up the pacing and is where the gang and flock begin to interact with each other. Paris is filled with underground tunnels and abandoned factories. It is also a larger place where different countries in Europe can be accessed and threatened by the Doomsday Group.

Language and Meaning

Max's thoughts and dialogue are witty and filled with slang fit for a teen of her age. Each member of the flock speaks in ways which help to differentiate them. Angel is the only member of the flock who speaks as if she is an adult. The text is peppered with scientific language to help the reader understand how the flock and the gang were created.

Structure

"Angel: A Maximum Ride Novel" is written in three parts, 79 chapters, and includes a short epilogue.

Part One provides the reader with an introduction to the characters, background, and rising action.

Part Two provides character development, plot development, rising action, faster pacing, and plot tension.



Part Three provides the climax, falling action, and resolution. It also sets up the beginning of the next book.

The Epilogue provides a conclusion to one of the book's cliffhangers. It also sets up conflict for the next book.

Topics for Discussion

Some of the characters in the book are born and some are cloned.

- 1) Who is a clone?
- 2) How are clones viewed by Max and Fang?
- 3) How does Dylan feel about being a clone?
- 4) How does Maya feel about being a clone?

Max thinks that people who put the greater good above the individual can be dangerous. Who is she talking about when she says this? Why does she feel this way? What has Max seen that makes her feel this way? Provide examples from the text.

How are Max and her flock tied together? Do they need each other? Why or why not? How do they know each other? What binds them together?

Angel tells Max that she must make up her own mind about Dylan and Fang. She shouldn't let anyone push her into a decision one way or another.

- 1) Who has pushed Max into a decision between the two boys?
- 2) How does Fang feel about Max? How does she feel about him?
- 3) How does Dylan feel about Max? How does she feel about him?
- 4) Which boy feels the greater good is more important than Max? Support your answer with examples.
- 5) Which boy feels Max is more important than the greater good? Support your answer with examples.

Scientists are responsible for the experiments which created both the flock and the gang. Why do the scientists create these genetically modified kids? What do they hope to gain from it? What has Fang seen happen with experiments that makes him upset when he meets Holden? What has happened to Holden?

Explain Max's feelings about Jeb and Dr. Hans. Who are they? How does Max know them? Why doesn't she trust them? What do they want from her when they visit at Valencia's home?

Explain what the Doomsday Group. Who are members of the Group? What do they want? Why do they want this?



Ella is rescued from the Doomsday Group, but disappears during the night. She leaves behind a note stating that she was meant to have wings.

- 1) Is Ella still under control of the Group when she writes this letter? Why or why not?
- 2) Why might Ella want to have wings?
- 3) Is Ella part of the flock? Is she an outsider?
