Plot Summary

"Bared to You" is a novel in The Crossfire novel series by author Sylvia Day. The story follows Eva Tramell, a recent college graduate, as she starts her new life in New York City and her new job as an assistant to junior account manager at an advertising agency. On the day before she starts her new job, Eva makes a test run of the route to her office. While in the lobby of The Crossfire building, where her office is, Eva runs into the most gorgeous man she has ever seen. This is but the first of many encounters with the man she finds out is the billionaire playboy, Gideon Cross.

There is no question that the chemistry between Eva and Gideon is nuclear. When the two first decide to become involved, the arrangement is for them to have a sexual relationship, with no strings attached. The more the two spend time together, however, the more each of them falls in love with the other. The underlying issue is the secrets that Gideon and Eva have.

Both were sexually abused as children. Dealing with their demons puts numerous twists and turns in the relationship. Not only does the sexual abuse remain an underlying issue, but problems with friends, roommates and ex-lovers returning to the scene, cause jealousy, fighting and eventually making up. In the end, however, Gideon and Eva realize that they can make it through anything as long as they have each other.



Chapter 1 Summary

Eva Tramell and her best friend, Cary Taylor, are settling into their new Manhattan apartment. Cary is a model and Eva is starting a new job as an assistant to a junior account manager, Mark Garrity. Cary is trying to get Eva to go out for drinks, but Eva wants to time her walk to walk and then go to the gym.

After the less than thirty minute walk to The Crossfire building, Eva ends up falling on her butt when she tries to help a woman pick up the contents of her dropped her purse. Eva looks up to see a very attractive man standing before her. He helps her up and Eva asks for I.D. badge. Eva leaves The Crossfire and takes a kickboxing class at the gym. The instructor tells her about a Krav Maga class he teaches and gives her the website to check it out.

Cary has dinner waiting for Eva when she arrives home. She tells him about the Krav Maga class and about the gorgeous man she ran into at The Crossfire. Eva asks about the two gift boxes, which Cary tells her is a gown for her and tux for him from her mother and step-father.

The next day, Eva goes to her first day of work. It is her first job out of college and her boss's first assistant. Right before five o'clock, Cary texts Eva about getting the drink she didn't want the night before. As Eva gets into the elevator to leave work, the only rider on the elevator is the gorgeous man from the lobby the day before.

Chapter 1 Analysis

Eva Tramell is experiencing a major transition in her life. She has just moved from the west coast to the east coast. Additionally, she has just graduated college and is starting her first job. Eva is also struggling with her independence—making her own money and paying her own bill—and accepting help from her rich mother and step-father, and help from her policeman father.

The fact that Eva keeps running into the gorgeous man at The Crossfire foreshadows the two starting a relationship. In addition, Eva is so attracted to the man that it seems as if they will have a hot, heavy and illicit affair.



Chapter 2 Summary

The man greets Eva by name, which she realizes he knows because he picked up her I.D. the previous day. He asks how her first day was and wonders how he knows this. She says good and asks about his day. The elevator makes another stop to pick up three more passengers. When they get to the lobby, the man steers Eva out with his hand on the small of her back. Eva meets Cary there while the man goes out to the Bentley SUV.

Eva has a small hangover the next morning, but when Mark arrives he asks her to work late. He says a vodka company asked for a request for proposal from him by name. Eva asks if this is unusual and he agrees that it is. They work through lunch and almost through dinner until Marks' partner, Steven Ellison, calls to bring them Chinese food.

Mark and Eva continue working on the proposal the next day, all the way up until four o'clock. Mark invites Eva to attend the presentation meeting with him. Eva expects to drive to the office, but instead they ride the elevator up to a floor above theirs. To Eva's astonishment, the gorgeous man she keeps running into, Mr. Cross, is there. She stops abruptly, which makes Mark run into her back and propel her toward Mr. Cross, who catches Eva before she falls.

Mark gives his pitch and for the entire Hour Mr. Cross stares at Eva. At the end, he asks Eva which pitch would make her buy the vodka. She tells him and Mr. Cross agrees. He asks Eva to stay behind while Mark goes back to his office. He tells Eva that he wants to have sex with her and wants to know if anyone is standing in his way. Even though Eva is very attracted to Mr. Cross, she tells him that it's none of his business. Mark is waiting for her to ask what that was all about. She says she doesn't know but thinks that Mark is going to get the account. He agrees.

Eva tells Cary the story over a glass of wine when she gets home. Cary searches for Mr. Cross online and finds out that he is Gideon Cross and that he owns The Crossfire building.

Chapter 2 Analysis

The gorgeous man is taking a liking to Eva. This is why he remembers her name from the I.D. badge. It also seems as if he has been finding out information on Eva because he somehow knows it is her first day at work. There is foreshadowing that the gorgeous man is the owner or CEO of the vodka company. because he finds out that Eva is Mark's assistant, this is why the vodka company requests Mark to submit a proposal.



Cary insinuates that Gideon Cross has marketing people that can run campaigns for his subsidiaries. He implies that Cross asks Mark to pitch because Gideon is trying to get to Eva.



Chapter 3 Summary

Cary and Eva arrive at Parker Smith's studio to take the Krav Maga class. Cary insists that there is no way Eva's parents will allow her to come to the bad area of town a few times a week. She says her parents won't find out because she isn't telling them. Her mom will think she wants to take the class for protection over what happened to her rather than for stress relief. After watching the class, Eva registers for it.

Her step-father, Richard Stanton, calls her the next day at work. He says he's sending a car to pick her up for lunch. Mark tells her to take two hours for lunch since she's been working so hard. When she arrives at Stanton's office, he has a catered lunch for two waiting. He tells Eva that her mother is upset about her registering for the Krav Maga class. Eva finds out that her mother has been tracking her by Eva's cell phone.

Eva asks if her mother is still seeing her doctor. Richard says that Eva was just a girl when it happened and that he and her mother are just trying to protect her. Richard wants to have a car drive Eva back and forth to Brooklyn, but Eva tells him no. she leaves angry to return to work. When Eva returns to The Crossfire, she runs into Gideon in the elevator again.

He asks her what's wrong and makes her come to his office with him. He tells her he doesn't have time to date but that he does want to sleep with her. They argue back and forth until Eva tries to leave. Gideon traps her to make her say a proper goodbye. They start kissing and Gideon picks Eva up and takes her to the couch. He's on top of her, kissing her until he suddenly stops. Eva realizes he stops because someone is standing behind him.

Chapter 3 Analysis

It seems as if Eva was attacked or raped. This is why her mom would feel like she is taking the Krav Maga class for self-defense rather than to relieve stress. Something definitely happened to Eva when she was younger, which is causing her mother to be overprotective of Eva, even though Eva is now an adult.

The attraction between Eva and Gideon is undeniable. Eva is trying to seem strong and demands respect from Gideon, who just wants to use Eva for sex. While this is the basis for their relationship to begin, in an ironic twist Gideon and Eva are going to end up falling in love with each other.



Chapter 4 Summary

Eva realizes that it is Scott, Gideon's secretary, on the intercom telling him that his two o'clock appointment is here. Gideon tries to make a plan for them to see each other after work, but Eva says she's busy. Gideon follows Eva into the elevator and continues trying to arrange time, until they settle on Monday for lunch.

Eva returns to work a little late, but Mark tells her not to worry because he just returned from a meeting anyway. She works the rest of the day until her mom calls to let her know that she left her cell phone at Stanton's office and that they dropped off with the concierge in Eva's building. Eva asks her mother if Dr. Petersen knows she's tracing her cell phone and suggests they have a joint appointment again. Her mother agrees and invites Eva and Cary for a massage the following day before they go to the charity benefit.

When the phone rings again, it's Gideon. He persist in telling Eva how much he wants her and tells her to state her demands. She denies him once again and says she has a date with her vibrator. He tries to make it a threesome, but she says that she and her vibrator have an understanding—when they are finished with each other, they know which one has been used and it's not her.

Eva arrives home to find Cary sitting on the couch with a guy, Trey. They introduce themselves and Trey says he has to go to class. Trey agrees to come back Tuesday night for pizza and movies so he can get to know Eva. Parker calls to let Eva know that classes are cancelled next week because her step-father is making some safety improvements to the studio.

Over a glass of wine, Eva tells Cary about her mom tracing her cell phone and what happened with Gideon. They decide to go out clubbing for the night. After clubbing all night, a hawker gives them an expensive business card for a club to get them in free. Eva and Cary decide to go. The card gets them in without having to wait in the line and gets the free drinks the entire night.

When two brothers try to sit at their VIP table, Gideon approaches and says that Eva is taken. He knows Cary's name and introduces himself. Cary heads to the dance floor with the two guys. Gideon orders Eva's drink the way she likes it. She asks Gideon how he knows Cary's name and the drink she likes. He admits she used her credit card at a club he owns and that Cary's name is on the apartment lease. Gideon owns some of the clubs they went to tonight and the building they live in.

Gideon continues to try to get Eva to consent to having sex with him. She tells him that she doesn't treat sex like it's a business transaction, like he does. She agrees to have sex with him if he agrees to spend time with her not having sex, and not considering it a



date, because she has to have more of a connection with the person she's having sex with. Gideon agrees.

Chapter 4 Analysis

Eva is playing hard to get but she really wants Gideon as much as he wants her. The longer Eva plays hard to get, the more attractive it is making her to Gideon. While Gideon is a player that uses women for sex and doesn't want a relationship, he is going to end up falling in love with Eva.

Eva tells Gideon that she doesn't want to date, but she is lying to herself as much as she is lying to Gideon—although it is at a subconscious level. Eve and Gideon entering into a casual sex "contract" or "agreement" is simply going to complicate the matter. One of both of them is going to fall in love. If only one of them falls in love, then the other one is going to get hurt.



Chapter 5 Summary

Eva wakes up the next morning with a hangover. Cary points out a package that arrived for her. it's a bottle of "hangover cure" from Gideon with his business card and a note to call him with his phone number. She drinks it and tells Cary about her and Gideon's arrangement. Then she and Cary head off to the spa.

Cary asks Monica if she knows Gideon. Monica says he's a ladies' man with good taste that is the twenty0fifth wealthiest man on the Forbes list. Cary divulges that he's interested in Eva. Monica says something to Eva about not telling her and Eva tells her mother not to embarrass her. Eva isn't looking forward to attending the abused children's charity tonight. She knows her parents champion for these events because it relates to her. after the spa, Cary and Monica drop Eva off while they go shopping for cufflinks for Stanton.

Eva calls Gideon. He knows it's her when he answers. He tells her he's around the corner and to call the doorman to let them know he's coming. Wearing just a robe, Eva answers the door. Gideon starts kissing Eva and carries her to the couch. He tells her that he wants to go to the benefit with her tonight. Again she realizes he knows everything about her.

He fingers Eva on the couch and then performs oral sex on her. Each time he makes her climax, they stare into each other's eyes and they both know that he owns Eva right now. He scoops Eva up off the couch, adjusts her robe and reminds her that he'll pick her up at seven.

Chapter 5 Analysis

The implication is that Eva was molested or raped as a child. This is why Monica is so overprotective of her, and why she is a staunch supporter of abused children's charities. While Eva has experience with men, Gideon has far more experience with women. He knows exactly what to do to Eva to make her want him, and this is precisely what he is doing. His power and his money allow him to find out information on Eva that a normal man would not be able to find out.

Ironically, Eva thinks that she is nothing like her mother. While her mother seeks money and power, Eva doesn't think she does. In a twist of irony, Eva ends up being seduced by Gideon's power and money—making her exactly the same way that Monica Stanton is.



Chapter 6 Summary

Eva calls her dad to update him on her new job and new living situation. While she is talking to her dad, she thinks about her stepbrother abusing her and how her father doesn't know. She says as soon as her mother found out, Monica divorced her husband, the father of the son that was abusing Eva.

Eva gets ready for the party. When she is done, Cary tells her that he's printed out some research on Gideon and left it on her desk, if she's interested. Eva goes to her room to read the information. She finds out that Gideon's father was caught in a Ponzi scheme and committed suicide when Gideon was five. His mother remarried and had two more children.

Gideon comes to pick Eva up for the charity dinner. On the ride in the limo, Eva convinces Gideon to have sex, which he says he has never done in a limo before. They have amazing sex together, but when it is over, Gideon withdraws, becoming quiet and distant.

Chapter 6 Analysis

Gideon's father committing suicide when Gideon was young suggests that this is the reason that Gideon chooses not to get too close to people. He prefers to keep people at a distance so that he doesn't get too attached to anyone. By not getting too attached to people, if they leave or something happens to them, Gideon cannot get hurt again. A further illustration of this is his withdrawal after he and Eva have sex in the limo. Gideon knows that he let his guard down when he was having sex with Eva. He is afraid of where his feelings and emotions for him might take him, so this is why he tries to pull away from her after they have sex.



Chapter 7 Summary

The tension is so intense by the time they arrive at the benefit that Eva parts from Gideon as soon as they get inside. She finds her parents and Cary. Gideon ends up coming over to the group looking for Eva, but encourages Eva not to make a scene when Eva tries to lash out at Gideon. Gideon stands up to give a speech about sexually abused children. Eva is so moved by his speech for she starts a standing ovation at the end.

People surround Gideon to talk with him at the end of his speech. Gideon's half-brother, Christopher Vidal, introduces himself to Eva and asks her to dance. While they are dancing, Christopher asks if she is single and then hints that he's interested in her when she says that she is not taken. Eva dances with Cary next and then Gideon breaks in for a dance. While they are dancing, Gideon warns Eva to stay away from his brother. When Eva tries to push Gideon away, Cary and Gideon exchange some words of contempt.

Eva runs into Magdalene Perez, one of Gideon's exes, in the bathroom. Magdalene says she knows that Eva has already slept with Gideon, which means that Eva is done. Magdalene says she has never slept with Gideon and that is why he stays with her because he thinks of her as long-term.

The next morning, Eva comes out to the living room to a dozen red roses and a card from Gideon. She tells Cary about the limo ride, about Gideon pulling away and about her run in with Magdalene in the restroom. As Cary embraces her, Eva thinks about his scars from cutting himself and about the group therapy sessions they attended together. Cary also tells Eva the phone has been ringing all morning, but he turned off the ringer so it wouldn't wake her up.

Monday at work is very busy. Gideon calls Eva's desk to ask if she got the roses and his phone messages. He also says he arranged for lunch in his office so they wouldn't waste any of the hour coming and going. Eva agrees to have lunch with him. Gideon arrives at her desk to pick her up for lunch and tells Mark they have a lunch date. In the elevator, Gideon and Eva kiss. When they get to his office, Eva tells Gideon they shouldn't see each other anymore.

Chapter 7 Analysis

There is a hint in Gideon's speech that he too might have been sexually abused as a child. This would be additional evidence as to why he treats women and his sexual relationships in the controlling manner he does. If he is in control of the situation, then he is in control of his emotions.



Since Eva thinks about Cary's cutting scars, he must have gone through a tragic event in his life as we. Since the two met in group therapy, it suggests that Cary was sexually abused too. If not, then the suggestion is that Eva might have tried to kill herself because of the sexual abuse and this is why she and Cary were in the same group therapy sessions.

Now Eva is having second thoughts about dating Gideon. She feels as if she is losing control of her emotions. Rather than allow herself to be hurt by Gideon, Eva is cutting ties with him now. Of course, Gideon is not going to allow Eva to do this, so he will continue to woo her and try to win her back. Ultimately, it will lead to Gideon confessing to Eva why he is pushing her away.



Chapter 8 Summary

Gideon tells Eva that she doesn't mean that they shouldn't see each other anymore. He admits that his feelings for her are so strong and out of control that it scared him. He apologizes for the way he acted after sex in the limo and convinces her to stay in the relationship with him. They also discuss being with each other exclusively. Eva admits that Magdalene is going to be a problem for her because she is very jealous and possessive. Eva also tells him exactly what Magdalene said to her. Gideon says he will talk to Magdalene.

They eat lunch and discuss hitting the gym together after work. Gideon gives her a business card with his home and cell number on it. He asks for her cell. She says she has to get a new one because her mom was tracking her with the one she had. He says they'll stop to get her a new one on the way to the gym because he wants to be able to call her whenever he wants.

Gideon kisses Eva in the lobby while waiting for the elevator. When she returns from lunch, Mark asks to speak with her. He warns her about Gideon and says he doesn't want her to get hurt or to quit because her ex owns the building. Eva assures him that she is a big girl. Gideon takes Eva to his car after work. He says they can work out at her gym or his gym. She chooses his gym, which is one in a chain that he owns.

Chapter 8 Analysis

Eva's drastic mood swings when it comes to her relationship with Gideon is not a good sign. She's dragging and somewhat depressed when she arrives at work and then has to force herself to break up with Gideon. Once she and Gideon discuss their relationship and moving it to the next level, Eva is exuberant and happy once again. It suggests that Eva allows men to control her emotions too much and that her jealousy could reach an unhealthy level—one where she acts irrationally.



Chapter 9 Summary

Eva and Gideon stop at the cell phone store to buy her a new phone first. They argue over who is going to pay for the phone and the account, but Eva wins. They continue on to the gym, running on the treadmill together and then breaking off for their own workouts. Gideon, however, always keeps Eva in his sight. While Eva is working out, a personal trainer comes to try to sell Eva on the gym. Gideon interrupts, telling the trainer that Eva is his girlfriend.

Eva is so turned on by the time they return to the locker rooms that she tells Gideon she wants him before he takes a shower. He takes her to a hotel around the corner. He performs oral sex on her twice and then they have mind blowing sex. Eva tells Gideon to let her collect herself and then she'll join him in the shower. This is when Eva realizes that there is a drawer full of condoms beside the bed, which is where Gideon pulled one from prior to them having sex. She gets up and finds clothes and sex toys in the wardrobe and drawers.

She thinks about how her therapist would tell her to think about what her partner did to upset her and then walk her through it. Eva feels used because it is obvious to her that this is Gideon's personal room at the hotel. She gets dressed in some clean clothes from Gideon's closet, throws all of the sex toys and condoms on the bed, picks up her gym bag and leaves Gideon behind.

Chapter 9 Analysis

Gideon is very possessive of Eva. He continues to try to control Eva and control their relationship. Ironically, Eva is very turned on by demeanor, even though she was controlled when her stepbrother was sexually abusing her. Gideon is sending conflicting messages because he is trying to possess Eva as if she is an object, but Eva also senses the emotions he feels for her when she looks into his eyes.

Eva's sexual abuse, and possibly other events that she has not yet revealed, is something that adversely affecting her emotionally. Eva went through therapy, but it is obvious that she is still not over the trauma that the abuse caused her. For one, the abuse has left her very insecure. She jumps to conclusions, thinking that Gideon has brought her to a hotel room where he brings all of the women he sleeps with. While this might be true to some extent, Gideon has been open and honest about his past relationships and how he wants his relationship to be different with Eva. Again, Eva is having drastic mood swings, where she is high one minute and low the next.



Chapter 10 Summary

Eva wanders out of the hotel and into a restaurant, where she orders a pizza. She pulls out her phone because she decides to take her therapist up on his offer for video sessions until she finds a new therapist. She sees twenty-one missed calls and messages from Gideon. He texts her saying that he messed up again and begs her not to break up with him and to please talk to him. She answers when Gideon calls again. He finds the restaurant where she is and tells her that he would have gone crazy too if she had taken him to a place where she had sex with other men. He begs her to come home with him and assures her that the only women he's ever had in his house is his mother and the housekeeper.

They spend the evening watching TV and cuddling together. Eva calls Cary to fill him in on the turn of events. When they fall asleep, Gideon has a bad nightmare where he's yelling in his sleep. He's yelling for a man not to touch him and calling him sick. Gideon also says that whatever the man is doing to him hurts. Eva wakes Gideon up and they have sex without a condom because Gideon doesn't have any condoms in the house. The next morning, Gideon takes Eva home to change for work.

When they pull up in his car to the office, Eva gives him a framed picture of her. Gideon takes it into work with him. Since Gideon has a business lunch, when Cary calls to say he landed a new modeling gig, Eva tells him to come celebrate with her for lunch. While she's waiting for Cary to arrive, she reads a Google alert she set up Gideon and finds a picture of Gideon kissing her on the sidewalk in front of his gym with a small snippet saying they are an item now.

Chapter 10 Analysis

Gideon's nightmare suggests that he was molested and raped. Since he previously warned Eva to stay away from his stepbrother, it could be Christopher Vidal that was raping and molesting Gideon. It could also be Gideon's stepfather and Christopher's father that is responsible for the assaults.

If Gideon has been sexually abused too, then he and Eva have a lot more in common than they originally thought. This could deepen the affection they feel for each other. Additionally, the fact that Eva and Gideon are starting to have sex without using condoms foreshadows Eva getting pregnant. A pregnancy could bring Eva and Gideon even closer together or it could be what ultimately ends up tearing them apart.



Chapter 11 Summary

As Eva thinks about the picture of her and Gideon in the paper, she also thinks that she has been careless in exposing herself. She has remained anonymous and now she has blown it. On her way to meet Cary for lunch, she runs into Gideon and his lunch guests in the lobby. He asks her what's wrong. She mentions the picture. He hints that he knows about it because he is the one that had it placed in the paper so that he could announce to everyone that they are together and to get their status correct.

At lunch, Eva expresses her concerns to Cary about reporters finding out the truth about her. Cary assures Eva that Stanton had all of that buried. He also suggests that she and Gideon go through couples counseling. When she returns from lunch, she gets a text from Gideon saying he has fifteen minutes. She goes to his office and performs oral sex on him. He tries to return the favor, but she says she isn't keeping score.

Eva tells him to come over when he is done with his business dinner and she is done with pizza and movie night with Trey and Cary. He agrees. When Eva arrives home, she changes. She checks the voice mail of her old cell phone, realizing she hasn't given her mother her new number yet. She calls her mother and they talk about Gideon and the appointment Eva and Monica have with Dr. Petersen.

Eva, Trey and Cary have a good time together. Before going to sleep, Eva changes into a black lace baby doll. Sometime in the middle of the night, Gideon wakes her up by kissing and caressing her and they have sex.

Chapter 11 Analysis

Eva is hiding from her rapist or molester. She is also protecting Gideon from the truth about her sexual abuse. She's afraid that once people figure out who she is that her past will come back to haunt her and then embarrass Gideon. In a way, the relationship Eva and Gideon have is toxic for both of them. She is allowing him to possess her, which is contrary to how she feels after being forced to have sex with her stepbrother. It is not healthy for Gideon to be the possessor either, since it seems that he too was once a possession of his abuser.



Chapter 12 Summary

The next morning, Gideon joins Eva in the shower. She performs oral sex on him again. She thinks that the sexual therapy must be working for Gideon because he didn't have any nightmares the night before. When he tells her he wants to take her to dinner and back to his place tonight, she resists a little. He encourages her to trust him and agrees.

At work, a Google alert comes in revealing a picture of Gideon dining with Magdalene the night before and pictures of Cary and Eva at lunch the previous day. The captions indicate that Eva might be cheating on Gideon because she lives with Cary and that Gideon might be paying her back for it. Eva tries to push it out of her mind because she remembers what Gideon said about them having to trust one another.

Mark invites Eva to lunch with him and Steve. She receives an interoffice note from Gideon beckoning her to his office, but she replies saying that she has plans. The security guards calls Gideon when Eva is leaving with Mark and Gideon assures Mark that he'll get Eva to the restaurant where they are dining. Gideon asks Eva if Cary is in love with her and if she's had sex with Cary. Eva tells him no. as they arrive at the restaurant in Gideon's car, Eva goes in but Gideon goes in behind her and grabs her by the waist. She tells him he's making a scene.

He admits that he ran into Maggie, but that the look on his face the picture captures is him talking about Eva to Maggie. Eva says they need to talk tonight. She says they either need to keep their relationship private or end it, either of which is good for Gideon. Gideon refuses and says they will work it out, whatever the problem is. Gideon kisses Eva full on the mouth and says to let that go viral. When she meets up with Mark and Steven, she apologizes and thanks Mark for not firing her.

Steven says Mark can't afford to lose Eva. Mark says Steven can't afford to lose Eva because he is a soap opera addict and he would miss out on updates of Eva's love life. Eva tells him her mother got pregnant with her, which destroyed her debutant status and got her ostracized from her wealthy family. She says her mom went on to marry a millionaire, who had a son two years older than Eva. She says her stepfather traveled a lot and her mother raised his son and spent her husband's money. When she tells Gideon that she was ten the first time Nathan raped her, Gideon breaks the wine glass in his hand, goes into the kitchen and comes back with something stronger in a glass.

She says when she got close to telling her mom, Nathan broke her cat's neck and left it on her bed. Eva says the servants knew what was happening but that they were so scared of Nathan that they didn't say anything either. She says when she was fourteen, she was bleeding badly, so her mother took her to the emergency room. The doctors told her mother Eva had miscarried and that she had vaginal and anal trauma and scarring. They reported the abuse to child protective services.



Gideon threatens to find and kill Nathan. Eva says he's not worth it. she says she wants Gideon to know because of what a reporter might dig up and print. Gideon says if anyone writes that story that he'll destroy them. Eva goes on to say that her mother left the marriage with two million dollars and Eva left it with five million dollars. She says Stanton worked to seal the public records when he married her mother and that he manages the account Eva dumped the money into because she refuses to touch it.

When Eva looks into Gideon's eyes, she sees what she feared she would. He tells her to stop talking.

Eva has concerns about them being seen together in public because she is afraid it is going to be a scandal when the media finds out about the past she has been hiding. Tonight, Eva plans to tell Gideon about what happened to her. It foreshadows Gideon reciprocating, confessing that he too was sexually abused.

They shower together and get ready for dinner. He reveals to Eva that she has three drawers in his room and two in the bathroom. He has filled one of the drawers with lingerie in her size. He asks if she has ever lived with a man, besides Cary, and she says no. Gideon says that they have to do whatever it takes to make her feel secure. She asks him to attend couples' counseling with her. After a moment, he agrees to do it.

They have a romantic dinner. He asks how she met Cary. She admits it was in group therapy for troubled teens. Gideon asks about her choosing a college that was close to her father, revealing more information he dug up about her. he asks if she ever told her dad about Nathan, but she admits no.

That night, Gideon has one of his nightmares. Eva turns on the light to find Gideon masturbating in his sleep. She is able to wake him up and he asks her what's wrong. She tells him he was having a nightmare and repeatedly asks him what it was about. He keeps insisting that he doesn't remember. She accuses him of lying and leaves.

When Eva gets into the elevator of her building, there is a blonde girl wearing one of Cary's t-shirts exiting the elevator. Cary greets Eva with open arms at the door. In his past, Cary was a troubled teen as well. It seems he was doing drugs and cutting himself. Cary and Eva met in group therapy sessions. Cary tends to be very protective of Eva, so several times throughout the novel, Cary stands up to Gideon on Eva's behalf.

By the end of the novel, Cary seems to be slipping back into his old ways. When Eva comes home to find Cary having sex with two women and a man at the same time, Cary seems as if he is high on drugs. Cary even tries to get Eva to join in on the escapades.

One of Gideon's carsis a limousine. When Gideon picks Eva up for the charity benefit, he picks her up in the limousine. The backseat of the limousine is the first place that Eva and Gideon have sex. Throughout the novel, the limousine is the site of numerous sexual encounters between Eva and Gideon.

Krav Maga Studio

The Krav Maga studio is in Brooklyn, Eva goes there to observe a class before she decides to register for the class. When her mother and stepfather find out about Eva attending the classes, Richard Stanton pays to have the studio safeguarded.

Hotel

Another building that Gideon owns is the hotel around the corner from Gideon's gym. Gideon takes Eva to the hotel after they work out at the gym. Eva and Gideon have sex, but Eva realizes that the hotel room is Gideon's private room, where he brings women to have sex.

Flowers

Gideon sends Eva flowers the day following the charity benefit to apologize to her. throughout the novel, numerous bouquets of flowers go back and forth between Gideon and Eva. Eva even sends Gideon a couple bouquets of flowers toward the end of the novel with some notes to indicate what the flowers represent.



Rings

Gideon and Eva buy rings for each other. Gideon buys a ring for Eva first that looks like Xs and Os covered in diamonds. In response, Eva buys Gideon a masculine ring. The rings represent a reminder of the commitment the two of them have to each other when they wear them.

Keys

Eva leaves her keys at Gideon's apartment one night. When she leaves because they are fighting, Gideon returns the keys to Eva via an interoffice envelope. Later, Eva finds out that one of the keys is the key to Gideon's apartment, and that Gideon made copies of her apartment keys before returning the keys to Eva.

Sex Toys

Gideon has a drawer full of new sex toys, still in their packages, in one of the drawers at the hotel room. When Eva finds the sex toys, she gets angry. She dumps the sex toys on the hotel bed and leaves while Gideon is still in the shower.

Gideon's Office

Gideon's office is another location where Eva and Gideon have numerous sexual encounters. Gideon's office has remote control frosting on the windows to create privacy. When Gideon brings lunch in for him and Eva, they eat in Gideon's office.



Themes

Relationships

Friendships and relationships are the primary thems that runs throughout the novel. Eva Tramell and Gideon Cross enter into a sexual relationship. As the relationship continues, Eva and Gideon end up falling in love with each other. With the baggage, issues and problems that each of them bring into the relationship, Eva and Gideon have to learn how to overcome adversity in order to make their relationship work.

Eva and Cary are best friends and roommates. Their relationship is unique in that they are a lot like brother and sister. the troubled past that Eva and Cary have cements the foundation of their friendship. After Eva meets Gideon and Cary starts to slip back into his old destructive ways, a wedge occurs in Eva and Cary's friendship.

Good versus Evil

Another plot throughout the entire novel is that of good versus evil. Sex in the novel is represented as both a good act and an evil act. When the sexual act is between two consenting adults, it is represented as good in the novel. On the other hand, when someone is abusing someone else with a sexual act, then sex is shown as evil in the novel.

Even the sex between Gideon and Eva fluctuates between good and evil. Gideon says that every time they have sex it is making love because he and Eva love each other. On the contrary, however, when Gideon suggests that he dominant Eva and that she succumb to him sexually, Eva starts to see their sexual encounters on more of the evil side than on the good side. Some of Eva's perception, however, is tainted by the sexual abuse she experienced in the past.

Mental States

Another primary theme in the novel is the mind or mental state of human beings. Primarily, the focus falls on the sanity, or insanity, of Eva, Gideon and at times Cary. Gideon seems to be very obsessive, dominating and controlling. Some of the things Gideon does seem a bit on the mentally unstable side, such as taking pictures of Eva while she sleeps, running background checks on Eva and making copies of her apartment keys without Eva knowing.

Eva's own mental state also comes into question. She is insanely jealous of any woman that talks Gideon. This is even prior to them concluding that their relationship is going to be exclusive. Eva also has very low self-esteem. She thinks that Gideon can have any woman he wants and therefore doesn't understand why he would want her.



Cary seems to be losing control of his mental well being. He is scared of how intense his feelings are for Trey. This seems to be propelling Cary to cheat on Trey. Additionally, it seems to be pushing Cary back into doing drugs.

Even Monica Stanton's mental state comes into question during the novel. She is trying to be extremely overprotective of Eva. Monica thinks it is normal to have her daughter followed and to track Eva with her with the GPS on Eva's cell phone. Monica believes this is normal behavior so she defends herself against complaints from Eva, and even against the advice of her therapist.



Style

Point of View

"Bared to You" is written in the third person point of view, from the perspective of author. The novel swings back and forth between the present and the past. The present represents the time after Eva moves to New York. The past represents the time leading up to Eva moving to New York.

The point of view of this novel is intimate, allowing a reader to connect closely with the main characters, primarily Eva Tramell. The book written in this manner allows the reader to get inside the head, thoughts and inner struggles of Eva as it pertains to the plot. The reader cares what happens to Eva and to Gideon. The point of view also allows the author to inject her own opinions into the narration and to expand on the events taking place around the other characters and the occurrences taking place.

Setting

The novel is set primarily in New York City. The novel covers the first few months of the relationship between Eva and Gideon. The main characters are involved in the relationship as it starts and evolves.

The setting of this novel works well with the plot. At first, the reader is not aware that Eva and Gideon are going to fall in love with each other. However, as events unfold, the romantic relationship is a constant part of the plot, the lives of the characters and even the outcome of the novel.

Language and Meaning

The language of this novel is relatively simple and easy to read. The language is from the 21st century, which is when the novel is set. The language is descriptive enough that it helps to explain the situations and is detailed enough for the reader to truly understand.

Structure

"Bared to You" is divided into 22 chapters. The length of each chapter ranges from two pages to 15 pages long. The chapters tell the story primarily in exposition and with some dialogue. The narrator injects her own voice and thoughts throughout the book, providing her opinions and feelings of the events unfolding in the novel.



The novel contains one main plot and several subplots. The main plot is friendships and romantic relationships. One subplot is the struggle between good and evil. Another subplot is the mental states of the characters in the novel.
