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Plot Summary

Victor Johnson, who uses the name of Victor Ward, is a model and the son of a United States Senator who has presidential aspirations. Victor is a part of the world of fashion modeling and is an aspiring actor. He dates supermodel Chloe Byrnes and his life consists of modeling assignments and partying at night. It's all about being seen and photographed with the right people.

The book opens with Victor running the opening of a new club for Damien Ross. Damien is engaged to Allison Poole, who is financing the club. He is also keeping Lauren Hynde as his mistress. Victor becomes involved with both women and also plans to open his own club in several months. Damien hears rumors about all of this.

As Victor moves around Manhattan, he finds himself being followed by black jeeps, which he keeps evading. When he meets with a supposed disk jockey for the opening of the club, he finds that the man is F. Fred Palakon, who offers him three hundred thousand dollars plus expenses to go to Europe to bring and old college girlfriend, Jamie Fields, back to the United States.

After the club opening, everything falls apart for Victor. Damien's thugs grab him and rough him up and Damien fires him. Damien breaks up with Allison and leaves for Miami with Lauren. Chloe is packing to leave and tells Victor that he isn't interested in a relationship and keeps trying to impress the wrong people. Since he has nothing else going for him, Victor sails to London, as per Palakon's instructions, taking along the hat that Lauren gave him. He doesn't know what he is getting into. Jamie Fields is part of a terrorist organization run by former model Bobby Hughes. Victor is trapped with them and is set up for the murder of Sam Ho and others. The terrorists are part of the high fashion and jet set crowd and Victor is a part of several bombings in Paris.

Then Victor finds out that Palakon is a double crosser who plays both sides. His father apparently wanted him out of the United States so he wouldn't prove an embarrassment to his presidential campaign.

Victor finds that the people around him aren't who or what they say they are in this book of intriguing conspiracies and international terrorism, with film crews following the characters around. The end of the book can be given several different interpretations by the reader who will enjoy this unique book. The novel is more than five hundred pages, but is very interesting reading and will hold the reader's interest.

Victor works on at the gym in the Flatiron District in chapter twenty-five. The reporter from Details is still following him. His trainer, Reed, comments about a bounced check which Chloe covered for him. The Details crew films the work. JD calls to tell him to meet the disk jockey at five. They still need one for the club opening.

In chapter twenty-four, Victor arrives at Industria for his photo shoot. He and the others talk and share gossip as they prepare for the photo shoot Chloe's name is mentioned along with the name of Baxter Priestley, the man she was sitting with at the Bowery when Victor arrived. They also mention Allison and Victor as they do the shoot.

Both Chloe and Victor lead hectic lifestyles. As models, both are concerned with appearance and with being seen. They are both very susceptible to gossip.

The box contains a bomb and the driver is killed in the blast in front of the Institute of Political Studies. Fourteen people are killed and fifty-one are injured. The film crew packs up and leaves the area by the time the emergency vehicles arrive. That night, Tammy attends a party.

In chapter twenty-seven, the group lives in a huge triplex, with Iraqi money that comes through Hungary paying the bill. The triplex has a high powered monitoring and alarm system in addition to weapons and explosives. Bobby hosts a party and one of the guests is Skeet Ulrich, who Victor last saw when he was being chased through Soho. Numerous celebrities attend the party.

In chapter thirty-six, the group attends shows and frequents nightclubs. Victor follows the script and does what he is told to do. He tries to talk to Jamie, but she tells him to just get through the week. He hears Jamie say that Bobby will be gone for five days traveling to Beirut, Baghdad and Dublin. He will be meeting a Virginia paramilitary group.

In chapter thirty-five, Bentley goes to leave a Prada backpack at the Café Flore. A film crew is going with him. Bentley leaves the backpack with Brad as a sign that he will return to the café. The backpack contains two bombs.

In chapter thirty-four, while the group is performing their assignment, Victor is left with Jamie. He escorts her around followed by the film crew. When they go to the bedroom, a different film crew follows them. Jamie explains how she met Bobby. He helped her career and she knows he is a terrorist.

In chapter thirty-three, Felix and his crew don't know about the other film crew that is in the house. When Victor asks Bobby what is going to happen, Bobby tells him not to worry and that he will be prepped. Victor is taking so much Xanax, he can barely read. Bobby says he picked Victor because he doesn't know what is going on in the world. The group attends a party at which Victor tells Markus Schenkenberg that Bobby is a terrorist.

In chapter thirty-two, a drugged Victor is on a train with a Louis Vuitton tote bag that he is told to leave under the seat. The bomb explodes fifteen minutes after Victor leaves the train.

In chapter thirty-one, Victor escorts Jamie to the Ritz. He tries to warn the son of the French premiere that he is in danger, but the man tells him to say away. Aside from this,



they follow their instructions. Victor finally tells Jamie about Palakon and the whole story, including Marina Gibson.

In chapter thirty, Victor and Tammy are shooting a scene outside the Louvre. Victor goes to use the restroom and leaves the Prada backpack by the pay phones. The film crew is filming. A woman from an American film crew follows Victor and returns the backpack.

The group is at a party in chapter twenty-nine. Edgar Cameron repays Victor for the dinner in New York last week despite Victor's denial that he was in New York discussing the opening of a new club with Damien. Felix asks what happened to the actor paying Sam Ho.

In chapter twenty-eight, after a day on a yacht, Bobby, Victor and Jamie engage in a threesome.

The group moves to Paris where they live in a triplex. They continue their terrorist activities under the cover of modeling and shooting films. They explode bombs in various places with the blame being placed on other extremist groups. The rent on the house they have is paid for by Iraq with the funds being funneled through Hungary. Nobody wins to suspect them, but the man that was following Victor when he first appeared in London is in Paris and Victor mentions an American film crew that is in the house.

In chapter twenty-two, Victor is taken to another room at gunpoint when the French premier's son is slowly being poisoned and tortured. Victor is forced to watch.

In chapter twenty-one, the French premiere's son is dying and is now thinking about other things in his life.

In chapter twenty, the group is at a dinner party. Bobby has to leave the party and tells Jamie to stay for dinner. After he leaves, Jamie tells Victor that they can't see each other anymore. She tells Victor to look at a file called Wings on the computer and also that she thinks she knew Marina. Characters

Victor Ward

Victor Ward is a model in Manhattan. He is often photographed and seen in the right places with the right people. Victor has been hired to open the new club that Damien Ross is opening. Victor, who dates model Chloe Byrnes, is having an affair with Allison, who is Damien's girlfriend. Victor is twenty-seven years of age. He attended college at Camden College in New Hampshire and his father wants him to return to school. His father, who is a United States Senator, lives and works in Washington DC, and is embarrassed by Victor and refuses to give him money beyond his trust fund check. As a result, Victor has financial problems. His mother died while he was in school at Camden College. He constantly chases women, including the two involved with Damien, and finds men in black jeeps following him around Soho. The day after the opening, Damien fires him because of his involvement with Allison and Lauren. Victor is approached by a man named Palakon to find an old college girlfriend named Jamie Fields. He will be paid three hundred thousand dollars and expenses and sails to London on the Queen Elizabeth 2. Strange things happen on the ship crossing, such as having a dinner photo taken and finding different people in the photo than were at this table. In London, he resumes his relationship with Jamie Fields and finds himself involved with a terrorist organization that plants bombs and kills the sons of political figures. Throughout the book there is a Victor double that appears at various functions, including at his sister's. The real Victor is more or less shut out by his family due to his father's presidential aspirations.

Chloe Byrnes

Chloe Byrnes is a model in Manhattan. She is also the girlfriend of Victor Ward. Born in 1970, Chloe is a Pisces. Her agent is from the CAA agency. She was first discovered on a beach in Miami and has appeared on the covers of four hundred magazines, including the Sports Illustrated swimsuit edition. She has also appeared in Playboy and has ghost written a book which was a best seller. She is highly sought after model and is in the process of negotiating a multi-million dollar contract with a cosmetic manufacturer. She has had a problem with drugs but it hasn't affected her career. Chloe is twenty-six years old which is, she feels, old for a model. She has silicone breast implants and is worried about the news reports about the problems with silicone implants. She frequently has anxiety attacks and takes Xanax to calm her nerves. Chloe becomes friendly with Baxter Priestly, which upsets Victor. When things between Victor and Damien blow up and Victor is fired, Chloe tells Victor that he lives to try to impress the wrong people. She is mad because she can't get a straight answer from him. As she is talking, she is also packing. Several weeks later, Chloe meets Victor at a party in Paris. They hug each other and cry. When Chloe tells Victor that she is pregnant from when he visited her apartment, he doesn't tell her that he wasn't in the United States at that time. Chloe doesn't want to resume her relationship with Victor and refuses to return to the United



States with him. She apparently tried to abort her pregnancy by taking RU486 and hemorrhages to death in the hotel suite when Victor is there.

Jamie Fields

Jamie Fields is an actress who is living in London and working on a film financed by Japanese investors. She attended Camden College in the 1980s and dated Victor, who left her for Lauren Hynde. A man named F. Fred Palakon tells Victor that Jamie disappeared from the United States three weeks earlier and offers Victor three hundred thousand dollars plus expenses to find her and bring her back to the United States. Palakon says that according to Jamie's 1986 journal, Victor meant a lot to her and her parents think that he might be able to persuade her to return to the United States. Jamie lives in London and shares a house with a group of people. She is very upset when Victor appears on her movie set and sends him away, and then appears in his hotel suite. She begins going out with him and brings him to the house where she is living. Jamie became involved with former model Bobby Hughes and he helps her career. They travel all over the world together. She knows that he is a terrorist but he has educated her in how to change the world. She is killed in the Paris triplex.

Damien Nutchs Ross

Damien Nutchs Ross is the owner of the new club that Victor has been hired to open. He is engaged to Allison Pool and has Lauren Hynde as a girlfriend. The day after the club opening, he breaks off with Allison and goes to Miami with Lauren. He is with Lauren at the end of the book.

Bobby Hughes

Bobby Hughes is a male model who lives in the London house with Jamie and the others. He began modeling at the age of eighteen and was an overnight sensation. He runs a terrorist organization that plants bombs and kills the sons of political figures. He is killed by Victor at the airport in Paris.

F. Fred Palakon

F. Fred Palakon pretends to be a disk jockey in New York and offers Victor three hundred thousand dollars plus expenses to find Jamie Fields and bring her back to the United States. Palakon works for both sides, serving both the government and the terrorists.



Lauren Hynde

Lauren Hynde lives in the Silk building in New York. She attended Camden College where she dated Victor. She is a friend of Chloe's and is Damien's mistress. She is with Damien at the end of the book.

Senator Johnson

Senator Johnson is the father of Victor. He considers Victor to be an embarrassment to his presidential aspirations and apparently wants him out of the country.

Lorrie Wallace

Lorrie Wallace appears on the Queen Elizabeth 2 and presents herself as the husband of Stephen Wallace. In the tape Victor views in Milan, she is walking with his father, holding hands and kissing.

Allison Poole

Allison Poole is the girlfriend of Damien Ross. She lives at 80th and Park Avenue in Manhattan and is having an affair with Victor Ward. She is Victor's girlfriend at the end of the book.



Objects/Places

Allison's Apartment

Allison's Apartment is located at 80th and Park Avenue in Manhattan.

Silk Building

Silk Building is in Manhattan where Lauren Hynde lives.

Queen Elizabeth 2

Queen Elizabeth 2 is a luxury liner on which Victor crosses the Atlantic.

Notting Hill

Notting Hill is a section in London, England where Jamie is filming a movie.

Hempstead

Hempstead is the area of London where Jamie shares a house with other people.

The Triplex

The Triplex is located in Paris and paid for with Iraqi money that comes through Hungary.

Soho

Soho is a neighborhood in Manhattan where Victor is chased by black jeeps.

Chloe's Loft

Chloe's Loft is a huge exquisitely decorated loft style apartment located in a trendy area of Manhattan.



The Club

The Club that Damien is opening is located in Manhattan overlooking Union Square Park.

Milan

Milan is a city in Northern Italy where Victor's is taken after leaving Paris.



Themes

Deceit

Deceit is one of the prevalent themes of the book. Glamorama is a novel in which people aren't who they say they are and situations aren't what they seem to be. Nothing can be taken at face value. Victor tries to deceive Damien about his relationships with Allison and Lauren. He also tries to deceive Chloe about his involvement with these women. From the time Victor boarded the Queen Elizabeth, there is one deceit after another. The Wallaces are not who they say they are as Victor discovers in Milan when he views the tape of Lorrie with his father. He meets a woman named Marina, who gives him two different surnames. When he tries to find her, he finds there is no such name of the passenger list and her cabin is unassigned. The biggest deception is propagated by F. Fred Palakon, who apparently was hired by Victor's father to get him out of the country. He sends Victor to London to find an old college friend and bring her back to the United States, knowing that he was sending Victor into the terrorist group of former model Bobby Hughes. Then Victor is told that Jamie Fields is a government agent who infiltrated the terrorist organization. As Jamie dies, she tells him that Lauren Hynde died in a 1985 auto accident and that she isn't really Jamie Fields. In addition, there is a Victor double that was appearing at events before Victor left the United States. Victor calls his sister from Milan and she tells him that her brother is in the room with her and to stop calling. The theme of deceit runs through the book.

Relationships

Relationships are another dominant theme of the book and there are quite a few of them. Victor is a shallow person who has many superficial relationships. He is a part of the world of high fashion and is more concerned about being seen and photographed with the right people than he is in establishing relationships. He is a fast talker who evades giving direct answers and thinks that he can talk himself in and out of situations. He finds out that this doesn't work when things fall apart on him after the opening of the club. Damien fires him because of his relationships with Allison and Lauren. His girlfriend, supermodel Chloe, has also had it with him because of Lauren and Allison. She tells him that he never answers questions directly and that his big problem is that he spends his life trying to impress the wrong people. She is telling him this as she is packing. Victor's relationships don't last because he has a superficial personality that doesn't allow him to establish lasting relationships. He also thinks that he can just pick up with old girlfriends like Jamie, Lauren and Chloe. He doesn't seem to understand that he hurt them by his behavior when he left them. They are obviously cautious because they are afraid of being hurt again. When he sees Chloe in Paris, he tries to pick up the relationship where they left off. He wants her to leave everything and return to the United States with him. She tells him that she doesn't want to resume their relationship.



Suspense

Suspense is another theme of the book and it builds slowly throughout the first half of the book. The reader begins to wonder about the film crews near the beginning of the novel and about all of the people that tell Victor that they saw him at a particular event and him saying that he wasn't at the event. The suspense becomes more noticeable as Victor is followed around Soho by the men in the black jeeps. Who are they and what do they want with Victor? There are all of the situations that take place on the Oueen Elizabeth 2. Marina gives two different surnames. The cabin she was in was unassigned, but he finds Chloe's hat and Polaroid photos apparently of himself. The Wallaces seem to know he is supposed to go to London and Lorrie claims to recognize Marina from Berlin. Once Jamie takes Victor home with her and he remains there, he becomes trapped with their terrorist group. They can't let him go once he walks in on them with Sam Ho. When the group moves to Paris, the reader wonders what and whom they will attack next. There are the Christian Bale guys that follow him around London and Paris that turn out to work for Palakon. The reader wonders who and what Palakon is throughout the second half of the book. The reader wonders what will happen next and how will it all end as they wait for Victor to realize what he is involved in. The suspense in the book makes the novel exciting reading.



Style

Point of View

Bret Easton Ellis writes Glamorama in the first person point of view with the narrator being the main character, Victor Ward. The reader watches as Victor stumbles from situation to situation and relationship to relationship. The use of the first person means the reader learns of events and situations as Victor learns of them. There is no additional information or details supplied by a third person author and this is a limiting factor in the use of the third person. Since Victor uses too much alcohol and drugs, he doesn't always see situation clearly but with Ellis's unique writing style, the reader does and has to wait for Victor to figure it out. Because of the first person approach, the reader must wait to learn certain information about Palakon and various situations, and this adds to the suspense and intrigue of the novel. Not only does the reader wonder what will happen next, they wonder what will happen to Victor next. The use of the first person approach is appropriate to the novel of this kind because it adds to the intrigue. It doesn't result in the reader identifying with Victor.

Setting

There are various locations that function as settings for the action of the novel. There are numerous settings in New York. The club Damien is opening overlooks Union Square Park. There are scenes at Victor's apartment, Chloe's loft, Allison's apartment at 80th and Park and Lauren's apartment in the Silk building. There is the chase scene through the Soho area and scenes in the gym. There are quite a few scenes at various restaurants and night clubs since being seen is the lifestyle of many of the characters. The Queen Elizabeth 2 is the setting when Victor travels to London. Victor finds Jamie Fields in the Notting Hill section of London and shares a house in Hempstead with the terrorist group. In Paris, the group lives in a triplex in the city. There are scenes at clubs and restaurants and in various parts of the city as they move around and plant their bombs. Victor kills Bobby in a men's room at the airport in Paris. When Victor leaves Paris, he is taken to Milan, Italy where he stays at the Principe di Savoia. There are also scenes at Camden College in New Hampshire and in Los Angeles.

Language and Meaning

The novel is written in the everyday vernacular of English. There are few difficult words and no terms with hidden meanings. The language and meaning are designed for quick and easy reading with little to slow the reader down. There are a few foreign language terms that are not defined but in no way detract from the action of the novel. It is not the language and meaning that create confusion in the minds of the reader, it is the various situations in the novel. There are many places in the novel where the language is very explicit. There are numerous sexual scenes that are very explicit and are not really



necessary to the action of the novel or to the plot. The scenes of torture are also very descriptive as are the aftermath of their various terrorist attacks. There is a great amount of detail and the descriptions are gory. Many readers may not enjoy these parts of the book, even though these scenes may add to the realism of the story. Readers may also become irritated by Victor's continual use of the word 'baby', but this is part of Victor's personality. For the most part, the language used adds to the ease of reading the novel.

Structure

Glamorama by Bret Easton Ellis is divided into six parts. The parts are designated by a number and no title. Each of the parts in a very distinct segment of the novel. The first part is concerned with Victor's life in New York and establishes his lifestyle and personality. The second part involves his travel to London on the Queen Elizabeth 2. Parts three and four concern Victor and the group's activities in London and Paris respectively. The fourth part shows the life of Victor after Europe. Part five shows Victor in a hotel in Milan, Italy where he was taken after leaving Paris. There are chapter divisions within each section that are designated by numbers. The numbers go from high to low in all parts except for the sixth part. There are many places with run-on sentences that are a paragraph long.

There is no Table of Contents, Introduction or Foreword to the novel but none is really needed. There are Acclaims at the beginning of the book and a few sentences about the author.

The structure of the novel contributes to the atmosphere of the novel.
