Plot Summary

Heartless is a novel that is part of the Pretty Little Liars series by the author Sara Shepard. The story follows the four main characters of the book, Emily, Hanna, Spencer, and Aria, as they deal with the aftermath of the disappearance and death of their best friend, Alison. After a slumber party, Alison leaves the barn where the girls are sleeping on Spencer's property, and she is never seen or heard from again. Each of the four remaining girls starts receiving text messages that appear to be from their missing friend. Then, Alison's body is found in the hole the construction workers dug and were pouring cement in to build the family gazebo. The anonymous texter turns out to be Hanna's ex-friend Mona, who tries to run Hanna over with her SUV.

A new text messenger arrivers on the scene, using the same signature of "A" and claiming she has information on Alison's death and true killers. Ian, who was blamed for the murder is on the run, and he too is communicating with the girls via instant messenger (IM) to help them find the real killer. A's text messages send Hanna to a mental hospital, Emily to Dutch Amish country, Spencer to believe her mother killed Ali and that her father was having an affair with Ali's mother, and Aria to believe Ali killed herself.

By the end of the novel, the girls even find themselves under arrest for their best friend's murder. The girls are released when the police find evidence on a construction worker's computer that he is the anonymous A. The police also find another body of a girl where he was doing some plumbing work.



Lost and Found

Lost and Found Summary

Best friends Aria, Spencer, Emily, and Hanna meet up near their best friend Alison "Ali" DeLaurentis's house. It's the day after a sleepover the girls had in Ali's barn. The night before, Ali insists on hypnotizing them. Ali ends up storming out of the barn and now she's missing. The girls don't know where she is and Ali's mother has called them over to talk with them. The girls talk to each other before going into the DeLaurentis home. The girls all discuss how they don't remember much from the night before.

They all assume that Ali has gone off somewhere with her older friends from the field hockey team. When they go inside however, Mrs. DeLaurentis says she's called all the girls on the team and Ali's not with any of them. She asks the girls if Ali has been sad or mentioned anyone picking on her, but all of the girls say everyone loves Ali, who is the most popular girl in school. Ali is really the one that is the trendsetter and she makes or breaks the social lives of her peers.

The girls are each thinking that Ali might have dropped them as her friends. If this is the case, they are worried about what secrets she will expose about them. There is one secret, about Aria's dad, that they all learned of recently. As the girls leave Ali's house, they watch the construction workers that are pouring cement for the new gazebo the family is installing.

As the girls go on to enjoy their first full day of summer vacation, they don't realize that the next day Ali's front yard will be filled with news reporters. They also don't realize that three years later, their best friend might just be back.

Lost and Found Analysis

The suggestion is that Ali's hypnosis on the girls worked. This is why they don't remember much about the night before. This would also explain why one of them has a bruise and scratches that she doesn't remember getting—as if they were traipsing through the woods while they were under hypnosis. As the girls watch the construction workers pour the cement, it seems as if they might be watching their friend's body be covered in cement in the hole dug around the gazebo.

The mention of the front yard of the DeLaurentis home being filled with news reporters the following day, implies that Ali doesn't return home. When her parents report her missing, it becomes a big news story in Rosewood because it's a safe suburb where nothing bad every really happens.

The mention of their friend, Ali, returning three years later suggests that someone contacts the three girls. She is claiming to be Ali but the girls doesn't think she is Ali. The



other possibility is that the person claiming to be Ali is somehow blackmailing the girls with all of the secrets that they know about each other.



Chapter 1 Summary

Emily Fields wakes up in the grass with smoke and fire all around her. Her other friends are coming out of the woods too. The paramedics, cops and news reporters are rushing over to the girls. Emily is thinking about the text messages the girls have been receiving from someone with the initial A. the mysterious texter suggests that the cops investigating Ali's murder are the ones responsible for killing her but that they set Ian Thomas as the killer.

As the paramedics are working on the girls, Emily tells them to help Alison because she's hurt. When Emily points to where Alison was, she's gone. The reporters hear what Emily says about Alison and start asking the girls and the cops questions. They get each of the girls into an ambulance. Emily looks out the ambulance window as it drives her away from the chaos.

Emily sees a cop car with its lights off, but it's not heading toward the fire. She also sees the Cavanaughs with their blind daughter. She sees Mona, who Emily refers to as the original A. who she doesn't see is Ali, who seems to have vanished once again.

Chapter 1 Analysis

Someone using the alias A is sending text messages to Emily, Aria, Hanna Spencer. A is giving the girls clues as to who is really responsible for Alison's death. It seems as if they have declared Alison dead but that her body has yet to be discovered because the girls were meeting with a girl that looked and talked just like Ali in the woods when they fire broke out. There is an inference that one of the secrets the girls have is that they set off fireworks that blinded the Cavanaugh's daughter. This is one of the people standing around when Emily is riding off in the ambulance. The cop car with its lights off and driving away from the chaos suggests that one of the cops is involved in Ali's disappearance or death. It implies that Ali might be in the cop car and that is how she manages to vanish once again.



Chapter 2 Summary

Six hours later, they are discharging Aria from the emergency room. The nurse tells Aria that Spencer is in room 206 and wants to speak with her before she leaves. As she gets dressed, Aria is thinking about the night before. She is running through the woods heading toward Spencer's house when she slips on wet leaves and hears someone light a match before the woods are on fire. She thinks she sees the body of the person they found in the half-dug hole at the DeLaurentis home almost four years ago—Ali's body. Aria' doctor told her that the noxious fumes from the make could have caused the hallucination. Aria thinks she didn't know that group hallucinations were possible since all of them saw Ali the night before.

When Aria gets to Spencer's room, Hanna and Emily are already there dressed in their own clothes. Spencer is in the hospital gown and bed, hooked up to tubes. Aria breaks out the time capsule flag Ali made, which Aria thinks could contain clues on where Ali went the night of the slumber party. The girls start discussing the hallucination. They are trying to reason that it must have been a hallucination because Ali is dead. Then, they question who it is they saw last night in the woods if it wasn't Ali. Aria also pulls out the class ring of Ian Thomas. She says it was just lying in the dirt in the woods. Ian Thomas is dead and the girls found his body in the woods the previous week. When the cops went to search the woods, however, the body was gone.

The girls talk about whoever set the fire was trying to kill them. They mention getting in touch with Ian in the barn and him saying that Jason and Wilden are behind the murder and the coverup. Aria admits to seeing someone with a hood on in the woods who struck the match. As she is about to tell the others who she thinks it was, Officer Darren Wilden, comes in the room. This is who Aria thinks set the fire.

The girls confront the police officer, saying they know he set the fire and they know why he set it. Wilden denies it and even produces a receipt for a purchase he was making about the time the fire was set. He says it's crazy that the girls think he and Jason, Ali's own brother, would hurt Ali. Aria thinks about how she saw Jason's name all over the Radley log when the Radley was a mental hospital. Aria also went on a few dates with Jason and thinks about how angry he got when Aria showed up at Jason's apartment the week before unannounced.

Wilden tells the girls they have to stop saying they saw Ali. He tells them that it's top secret, but the DNA from the girl in the hole matches Ali. This confirms Ali is dead. He tells the girls that the new A is just a copycat trying to plant ideas in their heads.



Chapter 2 Analysis

The girls are struggling with what is reality and what is just their imaginations. It appears as if someone is going through a lot of trouble to make the girls believe that Ali is alive. There is a mention that Ian Thomas, Ali's alleged killer, escaped, so now he is among the missing as well. Whoever is trying to lead the girls in their own amateur investigation is leaving clues for them to find that makes them believe what the person behind everything wants them to believe.

As Wilden leaves, the girl can't help but think that whoever lit that match is still out there. It foreshadows that more attempts will be made on the girls' lives.



Chapter 3 Summary

Spencer and her parents are in their house looking out into their ruined backyard. The fire destroyed the woods, their windmill and their law. Further destruction came from the emergency vehicles driving on the lawn and the spectators traipsing over it. The 18th century barn apartment is also in ruins from the fire and the rest from the water damage from the firemen trying to douse the fire.

Spencer's parents are gushing over her, which is unusual for them. Even though Spencer is enjoying their unusual attention, she admits that she found out that she is adopted. She also tells them that she met her birth mother and wanted to go live with her in New York City. Spencer gave her the savings account number to cover a deposit and first month's rent on an apartment, but the real estate agent and her birth mother were working together and cleaned the account out and disappeared.

To Spencer's surprise, they say that the money doesn't matter. They are more concerned that Spencer is alive and well than anything else. The Hastings admit that Olivia is Spencer's birth mom, but that she was a surrogate for them because Spencer's sister, Melissa's, birth was so difficult for Veronica Hastings that the doctor told her not to have any more children.

Chapter 3 Analysis

Spencer finds out why she has always felt like an outsider in her own family. She decides to forgive her parents for everything they have done to punish her lately when they beg for her forgiveness. She uncovers the truth about being adopted; she's not adopted, but her parents did use a surrogate to have her. After forgiving her parents, Spencer smells Ali's soap—a vanilla scent—blowing through the year. Since the police are saying Ali is dead and they have the DNA to prove it, then someone is acting as if they are Ali to punish the girls, blackmail them or for some other motive.



Chapter 4 Summary

Hanna is getting ready for school and talking to her boyfriend, Mike, on the phone. Mike is also Aria's younger brother. Hanna admits that she hasn't heard from the new A since she changed her number and got a new iPhone. Hanna also thinks about how they found out the old A was Hanna's former best friend, Mona Vanderwaal. When Hanna hangs up with Mike, she goes downstairs to find her soon-to-be step-sister, Kate, in the kitchen.

Kate and Hanna dislike each other but might have called a cease-fire at a recent party where Kate told Mike Hanna only asked him out on a bet and Hanna told everyone Kate has herpes. Kate tries to hide a newspaper story about the girls telling lies about seeing Alison. Janna also glimpses a story about the cops possibly not doing everything they can—complete with a picture of Wilden. Hanna's father and soon-to-be stepmother come into the kitchen to talk to Hanna. Hanna's dad says the school counselor called and is concerned that Hanna has post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD).

Mr. Marin starts attributing all of Hanna's problems, such as her lying and eating disorder, which Kate told him about, to the PTSD. He wants to send Hanna to a facility in Delaware for help. Hanna tells her father the letter he received is not from the school counselor, but from the new A. Hanna thinks about how Mona was driving her SUV when she ran over Hanna in the parking lot at school. Mr. Marin mentions that Mona is dead.

When Hanna opens her eyes, she realizes she is urled up on the kitchen floor and screaming. Her dad, Isabel and Kate are standing over her. Hanna also thinks she hears someone snickering as if their plan is falling into place.

Chapter 4 Analysis

Whoever is posing as A knows a lot about each of the girls. He or she is using this information to pay them back for various things the girls have done over the years, and one girl at a time. additionally, A is trying to make the girls look like they are crazy, so that nobody believes the stories they are telling. Not only is A trying to make other people think the girls are crazy, but she is trying to convince each of the girls that they are crazy too.



Chapter 5 Summary

On Monday morning, Aria's father, Byron, is driving her to school since her car is on the fritz. Aria is looking at the yellow tape surrounding the woods between her backyard and Spencer's backyard. The police called her the previous night to find out more about whom she saw in the woods and the police have been searching the woods for clues on who started the fire.

As they drive pass Ian's house, she thinks about the IMs the girls were receiving from Ian. Aria wonders why he's giving them the wrong information. She also thinks about how he lost his ring without knowing and why the cops didn't find it before she did in the woods. As they drive past Spencer's street, Aria spots Jenna Cavanaugh and her guide dog. Aria thinks about how Jenna knows more about Ali than she is telling.

Aria admits to her father that she isn't sure what she saw. She also says she wants to believe it was a hallucination when she saw Ali, but finds it strange that they all saw the same thing. Byron admits it is strange. Byron mentions that some people believe that ghosts can't rest until they impart a message on the living. Aria says her father doesn't believe Ian killed Ali either. Byron says that not what he means.

As Byron pulls up to Rosewood Day, Aria's school, reporters surround the car and knock on the window. She gets out as they follow her, questioning her. She slides into the quiet school auditorium. She thinks she hears a creak and sees a shadow. At first, she wonders if it's the person who started the fire. Then, she thinks it might be Ali's ghost trying to tell them something.

Chapter 5 Analysis

Aria is insinuating that Jenna Cavanaugh might be posing as Ali to get back at the girls for blinding her. Aria's father and her mother, although divorced, are both concerned about Aria. Byron is reacting to his daughter's strange behavior differently than Hanna's father, who wants to send her away to get help. Byron suggests that he might believe that his daughter and her friends are seeing the ghost of their dead best friend. He insinuates that Ali might be hanging around to help the girls uncover the real murderer. It might be the real murderer, however, that is trying to throw the girls and the police off his or her trail.

Chapter 6 Summary

Emily sees a flier that reminds her of her ex-boyfriend, Isaac, that she lost her virginity. He broke up with her after calling her a psycho when she tried to tell him his mom was giving Emily dirty looks while they were dating. Emily also notices as she walks through the school hallways that everyone is staring at her. Spencer shoots her a dirty look, apparently still mad that Emily told the cops they saw Ali in the woods.

When Emily gets to biology, all of the kids are gathered around a computer. She sees the story is about her and her friends, with a caption of their new nickname, Pretty Little Liars. The picture is of the girls in Spencer's hospital room, which was on the second floor, so Emily is wondering how the paparazzi took the picture.

Emily escapes to the bathroom. She receives a text message from A. a tells her to tell her parents she's going on the Boston trip but to really go to Lancaster. A sends Emily to her locker where she has planted more information. Emily goes to her locker and finds an Amish looking costume and a note with instructions on what yo do when she gets to Lancaster.

Chapter 6 Analysis

The implication is that Wilden or one of the hospital staff is behind taking the picture of the girls in Spencer's hospital room. Whoever is feeding the reporters information is trying to make the girls look like they are lying. It implies that the girls are on to something about finding Ali's real killer, so he or she is trying to make them look crazy and like liars so that nobody believes what they say.

A is sending Emily posing as an Amish girl to Lancaster. A insinuates that Emily will find Ali living there among the Amish. Either that, or the person, Lucy, that A tells Emily to see when she gets to Lancaster, has more information on Ali and where she is.



Chapter 7 Summary

Spencer is happy the day is over. She's at her locker when her ex-boyfriend, Andrew, comes up to her and they start to talk again. When Spencer is walking toward the parking lot, reporters surround her. She admits they didn't see Ali on Saturday night, that it was just a hallucination from the smoke inhalation. Spencer sees her sister, Melissa, parked in her SUV waving at her. Melissa packed up and left last week about the same time lan started IMing Spencer. Spencer thinks Melissa left town because she knows more about Ali's death than she's telling.

As Melissa starts to drive them home, Spencer thinks about how she saw someone in the woods last week that looked like Melissa. She wonders if Melissa was looking for lan's class ring.

Melissa tells Spencer that she and Ian were drinking the night Ali went missing. Melissa says that during the second interrogation from the police, she admits that Ian might have gotten up at some point in the night. Spencer admits that she isn't sure that it was Ian she saw that night roaming in the woods. Melissa says if they both got it wrong then it's Ian who is paying the price. Spencer thinks about how Ali stole Ian away from Melissa.

When they get hone, Spencer thinks she sees someone across the street watching her. When she looks again, they're gone. She notices a text on her phone that insinuates there is a ocverup taking place right under Spencer's nose.

Chapter 7 Analysis

Melissa has a motive for hurting and killing Ali because Ali stole Melissa's boyfriend, Ian, away from her. This would also give Melissa a motive for setting Ian up for the murder—to get back at him for cheating on her. The text message from A confirms what Spencer is already thinking, that her sister knows more about Ali's murder than Melissa is admitting. The text message also implies that the clues A is giving the girls are true but the girls are not evaluating and understanding them correctly.



Chapter 8 Summary

Hanna is in the back seat of her father's car with Mike. Isabel and her father are in the front seat. After driving around lost for half an hour, they finally find the Preserve at Addison-Stevens facility. Mike says his goodbyes to Hanna in the lobby, telling her he snuck in a cake with a file in it so she can escape. The hospital seems more like a day sap than an institution.

When Hanna's concierge shows Hanna to her room, she also confiscates her phone. Hanna cannot watch TV, surf the net or have outside contact, except for calls between 4 and 5 on Sundays.

Chapter 8 Analysis

Hanna believes that A is getting her out of the way. A wants to inhibit the investigation of her death, so she is picking off the girls one by one. A has managed to get Hanna checked into a mental facility. A is also working on getting Emily to Lancaster. It foreshadows that A also has plans for the getting rid of the other two girls as well.



Chapter 9 Summary

Aria goes to a shop in Yarmouth for a séance. She wants to try to reach Ali to see what she needs to tell them. Aria runs into her brother's best friend and a boy from their school, Noel. Noel is also someone Aria had a rush on, but he always liked Ali. The two are beckoned into the back room where the séance will take place.

When the séance begins, Equinox, the leader of the séance, approaches Aria, saying her friend is there. Aria believes it's Ali because Equinox says he knows everything about Aria, but that Aria hates that she knows everything about her, and that Aria wanted Ali gone. When Equinox mentions Ali stealing Aria's boyfriend, Aria runs from the room, thinking Equinox is a fake because Aria didn't have a boyfriend when Ali disappeared.

Aria locks herself in the bathroom. She thinks about how Ali was with her when Aria saw her father kissing another woman in a parking lot. Ali told Aria she wouldn't tell anyone if Aria did everything Ali said. Aria apologizes to Ali out loud for wishing Ali would go away and says she didn't want her to die. The bathroom light bulb flickers out and then Aria smells Ali's vanilla soap. When the light comes back on, Aria sees Ali's missing poster on the back of the door.

Chapter 9 Analysis

Aria is starting to become even more paranoid. She is questioning how much of a coincidence it is that Noel is two towns over attending the same séance that she is. It's ironic that several years later Ali's missing poster is still tacked to the back of the shop's bathroom door and Aria just happens to be there trying to conjure up Ali's spirit in a séance. T's as if Ali is sending a sign or message to Aria.



Chapter 10 Summary

At the same time Aria is in the bathroom at the séance shop, Emily is arriving at the Zook Amish farm in Lancaster. She starts to wonder if A sent her here because Ali is hiding out here. Emily thinks about all of the time she and Ali plotted to run away from Rosewood. As Emily is knocking on the front door of the farmhouse, she notices a boy slipping out the back. a teenage girl that turns out to be Lucy opens the door.

Lucy assumes Emily, who is posing as Emily Stolzfus, is there for Mary's wedding on Saturday. Lucy shows Emily where she can sleep, in her sister's bed. Then, Lucy takes Emily out to help her milk the cows. Emily starts to wonder if A has sent her on a wild goose chase.

Chapter 10 Analysis

Emily starts to think that A is sending her to a place where Ali might have run away to live. Because Emily and Ali often talked about running away together, it wouldn't surprise Emily is Ali is hiding out in Amish country. Although, it would be ironic that such a progressive girl like Ali would go to such as a non-progressive place to live, such as Amish farm in Lancaster, Pennsylvania.



Chapter 11 Summary

Spencer is checking in for her spa day with her mother. She thinks how great everything is going. Her parents have been very attentive. She aced her AP econ test and Andrew asked her to the Valentine's Dance in a couple weeks. After the spa, Spencer and Mrs. Hastings go to lunch at the bistro next door.

Spencer finds out that her mother was at Yale Law School with her father and that's how they met. Mrs. Hastings got pregnant with Melissa and dropped out. She asks Spencer not to tell Melissa. Spencer starts to think about the night of Ali's murder. She remembers her sister talking to their father as if their mother was missing.

Chapter 11 Analysis

Spencer finds out that her family situation is the opposite of what she thought. Spencer always thought she was the unwanted one and her sister was the wanted one. It's actually the other way around. The fact that Mrs. Hastings was missing the night of Ali's murder and Melissa telling Spencer Mrs. Hastings didn't like Ali makes Spencer suspicious that her mom might be involved in Ali's disappearance.



Chapter 12 Summary

Hanna is in the cafeteria on her first day. So far, she thinks things aren't so bad here. She's trying to decide where to sit, when a nerdy girl asks if she wants to sit with them. While Hanna is sitting with three nerdy girls, she spots a blonde that looks a lot like Ali. The blonde walks over to the table and asks if she's Hanna. The girl introduces herself as her roommate Iris. She tells Hanna they don't hang out with losers and escorts Hanna away.

Chapter 12 Analysis

Hanna used to be overweight and a nerd. When she became friends with Ali, everything changed for Hanna. Now, Hanna is thinner and more popular. Ironically, Hanna has turned into one of the mean girls that always used to tease and make fun of her. Now, Hanna is the one turning her nose up at the nerdy girls that are at mental hospital.



Chapter 13 Summary

Aria and Mike re hanging out at home with their father and his new pregnant girlfriend, Meredith. After the adults leave the room, Mike mentions that Noel saw Aria yesterday, but he doesn't say where. When the doorbell rings, Aria hides, thinking it's the press. Instead, it's Noel. He asks to speak to Aria alone. He ends up telling her he was at the séance to try to talk to his brother Jared that hung himself a few years ago.

Chapter 13 Analysis

Aria is starting to learn that everyone has their own secrets. She also learns not to stereotype or judge a book by its cover. She has always assumed Noel is a jock and perfect and doesn't have any problems. When he tells her about his brother, she realizes that his problems and secrets are just as real as her own.



Chapter 14 Summary

Emily and Lucy have been busy doing chores. The two girls start to confide in each other. Lucy assumes Emily was sent to them because she did something wrong in her own community. Emily tells her it has to do with a boy, thinking about the Isaac situation. Lucy says she's having as similar problem because she met a en English boy her parents don't approve of. She mentions that her sister Leah went off during rumspringa and never returned.

Emily thinks about a text A sent her with a picture of Jenna Cavanaugh and Ali with a caption saying that something doesn't belong. Emily listens as Lucy tells the story of her sister's disappearance and the assumption that Leah is dead.

Chapter 14 Analysis

Emily realizes that she and Lucy are not that different. Even though they live different lifestyles, the two girls still share the same emotions. Both of them like a boy that one or the other's family disapproves of them being with. Emily also starts to feel as if her trip to Lancaster has not been a total disappointment. While she didn't find Ali, Emily has been able to find a sense of peace—that it's okay if Ali is in fact dead and gone.



Chapter 15 Summary

Spencer and Andrew are sniggling on the basement couch while flipping through the TV channels. They see a news story about Ali's DNA testing and some interviews with her classmates. When they switch the channel, it's the reporter chasing after Aria as she gets out of her dad's car. Spencer thinks about what Ian said to her the day he broker house arrest. Spencer Hastings

Spencer Hastings is one of Ali's best friends and Ali's neighbor. As Spencer starts to receive text messages from "A," the messages lead to Spencer finding out Ali's mom and Spencer's dad have been having a long-term affair. In fact, Spencer finds out that Ali and Jason are likely her half-siblings. A conversation with her sister Melissa and information Spencer uncovers leads Spencer to believe that her mother might be responsible for Ali's murder. Spencer also finds out she was carried by a surrogate.

When Spencer confronts her mom, her mom finds out about the affair. Spencer's mom also adamantly denies killing Ali and throws Mr. Hastings out of the house. When Spencer returns home from the police station, she finds out the girl across the street, Jenna is the new victim of Ali's murderer.

The girls find out Mona is sending the etx messages when Hanna is run over by Mona with Mona's SUV. Hanna breaks her arm in the accident and spends some time in the hospital. Hanna's father and stepmother believe Hanna is suffering from post traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). He checks Hanna into a mental hospital, where Hanna believes she meets Ali's true killer, a fellow patient by the name of Iris.

Now that Hanna is thin and popular, she often wishes Ali could come back and see the person she is now. Hanna is the second of the girls to be arrested for Ali's murder before ther police discover the true killer.

Alison DiLaurentis

Ian is the one sending the girls instant messages to help them each figure out who is responsible for Ali's murder. In the end, the police say that the real killer was posing as Ian in order to lead the girls in the direction he wanted them to go.

Melissa Hastings

Melissa Hastings is Spencer's older sister. Melissa is away attending her first year of college during the novel, but appears in the novel several times. Melissa is dating Ian at the time of Ali's disappearance and murder. Melissa is also the one that leads Spencer to believe that their mother dislikes Ali. What Melissa says ultimately leads Spencer to believe her mother is the murderer.



Mrs. Hastings

Mrs. Hastings is Spencer and Melissa's mother. Mrs. Hastings was a Yale law school student when she got pregnant for Melissa. This caused Mrs. Hastings to drop out of school. Later, when Mrs. Hastings tried to have Spencer, she and Mr. Hastings had to hire a surrogate instead. Mrs. Hastings reveals all of this to Spencer as the novel unfolds.

Themes

Relationships

One of the primary themes running through the novel is relationships. This leads Spencer to finding out that her parents had to plan her birth, including hiring a surrogate to carry Spencer, while her older sister turns out to be from an unplanned pregnancy that caused Mrs. Hastings to drop out of law school.
