After a brief exchange with the guards, the young, beardless knight and his companions are allowed into the city. Once inside the city, the man at arms inquires after directions to an inn called The Wandering Bard. Only once inside the city is it revealed that the cat can speak and that the knight is actually a woman.

Allana and Coram and Faithful arrive at The Wondering Bard. Windfeld, the innkeeper, has received a letter from Sir Myles, informing him that she would be arriving. After hearing the news of the realm, Alanna and Faithful head off to take a bath.

During her bath, Alanna has a vision. It is a vision that she has seen before. She sees a blue-violet gem set in a golden disc that does not reflect light. Beyond the gem, she sees a blizzard. After her bath, Alanna heads downstairs for supper. Windfeld tells her about what is going on in Sarain. The K'miri tribes hunt lowlanders and the lowlanders fight the K'miri. The mountain born are heading west in droves to escape the fighting. After he asks what brings her to Berat, Alanna shows Windfeld an ancient map. She is there to see a translator to have the map translated. After her supper, a maid brings Alanna a drink. The drink was sent to her by another redhead, who says that redheads must stay together, and wonders if she will join him after that cup.

The redheaded man comes over and joins Alanna at her table, introducing himself as Liam. Liam has been keeping tabs on her. When Alanna asks why he would do that, Liam responds that it is important to know what important people are doing, and since she has killed the powerful Conte Duke and revealed him as a traitor, she has become an important person. Alanna explains the events surrounding the Duke's death, and seems upset about having killed him. She does not like killing. Liam reveals that he knew the Duke when he tells her that he was rotten all the way through. Before Alanna can get any answers out of Liam, who seems to know her very well, Coram arrives, drunk and singing. Liam promises to that they will see each other again.

After settling Coram in his bed, Alanna heads for her room. At her door, Windfeld meets her and asks if there is anything else that she needs this night. When she asks if Windfeld would introduce her to the Shang Dragon, Windfeld points out that she has already met him, Liam Ironarm, the Dragon of Shang. Alanna is unable to sleep, and goes for a ride. In her distracted state, Alanna does not notice that anything is wrong until Moonlight refuses to walk any further. After dismounting, Alanna discovers the Goddess standing before her.

After leaving the Goddess, Alanna realizes that she is farther away from the city than she thought she was. As soon as the sun comes up to burn away the fog, Alanna rides back for the city. She is awakened with a start as she falls from her horse and hits the



ground. Alanna is angry at herself to falling asleep on her horse and falling into the mud. Before she can get back on Moonlight, Alanna hears a horse approaching. When Liam arrives, he makes no attempt to hide his smile. He teases her a little about falling off of her horse, but then has her ride with him so that she can sleep on the way back to town. He admits that he once fell off of his horse in front of the men he was to command. They didn't tease him about it, much.

After having the map translated by a friend of her father's, Alanna discovers that the Dominion Jewel is hidden at the Roof of the World. With the Jewel, a ruler can rule peacefully or be a great tyrant, depending on his personality. The Jewel bonds its power to the earth for an ungifted ruler, but for ruler with the gift of magic, it can be used for literally anything. While deciding what to do next, Alanna and Coram are attacked by rogues. They bear a message from an enemy back home. Soon, Cooper will be dead, but Alanna will die now. In the melee, Alanna and Coram are both injured. Liam shows up and kills the rest of the rogues.

## **Chapter 1 Analysis**

At the gates of Berat, the young-looking knight is challenged by the city guard. They wonder if the boy can even hold his shield. When the "young boy", who is actually a woman, smiles at them and laughs, they allow them to pass. The guards seem to like her answer.

The stable boy is surprised to see a female knight. Windfeld knew of her visit in advance, but forgot due to a fire in their stables. Windfeld generally does not go out to meet his customers, but he shows special preference for Alanna. He informs her that he represents her father's interests in Berat, and that Sir Myles informed him of her visit. Sir Myles is one of the wealthiest men in Tortall, and he has adopted Alanna as his heir. She concealed her sex to train as a knight, and has only recently been knighted. Only after Alanna hoists Faithful onto her shoulders does the inn keeper notice that the cat's eyes are identical to Alanna's own eyes. As they leave, he makes a sign against evil.

Alanna's recurring vision, first revealed in this chapter, likely foreshadows some important item or event, or both, that will come along in her quest. Alanna's quest is not defined as of yet, she has recently achieved knighthood, and now she has an ancient map that is written in an ancient language. So far, she is only looking to have it translated. The redheaded man who buys her a drink is a very large, powerful looking man. He is dressed much as she is, but wears no weapons. Alanna's first thought about him is that he is attractive, but that with his broken nose and scarred face, he shouldn't be. Her second thought about him is that only four types of people go about without weapons, sorcerers, priests, fools, and those few who don't need weapons. Alanna feels that in her world, there are very few people who do not need a weapon.

Alanna reveals in her thoughts that she is unsure how to show her interest in this man. She has never flirted with anyone before, although she has had a lover before. The man notices the pleading in her eyes, and comes over to introduce himself as Liam. Liam



knows quite a bit about Alanna, which makes her somewhat uncomfortable. Liam feels that she is a very important person, one who will make great changes. It is important to him to know what important people are doing. Before leaving, Liam calls her kitten, and tells her that he will reveal how he knew the Duke some day, but not today. Alanna realizes that Liam is flirting with her, and Liam does not deny it. Coram's timely, if drunken, arrival conveniently saves Liam from any explainations, although he does promise that they will see each other again.

Alanna has always wanted to meet the Dragon of Shang, but Liam did not reveal his identity to her. The Shang are a group of fierce warriors, the best of whom gain animal names after besting a great ordeal and living one year amongst the people. The Dragon is the best of the best, which explains why Liam does not feel need to carry weapons. With her head so full of thought, Alanna is unable to sleep.

On her ride out of Berat, Alanna thinks to herself about being a knight. She had always wanted to be a knight, but now that she is a knight, Alanna realizes that not every little village needs saving. Suffering from boredom, Alanna wants to go beyond what appears on her maps. Surely, in such foreign lands she would not be this bored.

The Goddess asks Alanna where she is going and who she is going to be. Alanna reveals that now that she has achieved her goals, she has no idea what she is going to do. She says that she is simply drifting. The Goddess tells her that if she chooses to have the map translated, it will be an interesting path.

When Coram sees Liam leaving Alanna's room, he becomes worried. He is her protector, and does not take well to the idea that this unknown man was in her room alone with her. Coram blocks Liam's way and demands that Liam identify himself. Once he discovers that he is talking to the Dragon of Shang, he decides to switch tactics, but continues to interrogate the man all the same. Liam points out that Alanna is an attractive woman, a grown woman, and a great fighter. He doesn't much like being threatened, but he does forgive Coram some because he knows that Coram is only trying to protect his lady. Harvests will be good and weather will behave. The people will be happy, and relations with other



nations will go well. In the hands of a power hungry tyrant, on the other hand, the Jewel will wreck great havoc. In the hands of someone without magic, the Jewel's powers are limited to working with nature. However, if the wielder of the Jewel knows magic, then that ruler can create anything that they can imagine with the power of magic, even bring the dead back to life. Jendrai, Alanna, and Coram discuss the history of the Jewel for the benefit of the reader, revealing the power of the Jewel in the tales of what previous rulers have done with the Jewel.

When Coram and Alanna are attacked by the rogues in the street, Liam arrives to save them. He claims to have been returning from a friend's home when he heard the commotion. While Liam is gracefully and quickly dispatching the remaining rogues, Alanna is amazed by his martial power. Liam moves from punch to kick, from enemy to enemy, with lightening speed. Alanna wonders if she will ever be able to attain such skill.

Back at the inn, Coram and Liam discuss what happened in the street. The two warriors share an herbal drink for healing purposes, and grow to admire each other better.

## **Chapter 2 Summary**

When Alanna wakes up, she finds that Coram and Faithful both trust Liam and that he is now part of their group. Coram has told Liam of the map, hoping that he would be able to advise them on what road to take. Liam advises against going through Sarain, as they are in the height of a civil war. Alanna does not want to go on a boat, so Liam suggests going around the long way along the shores, to avoid the mountainous area where the fighting is heaviest. Liam will ride with them part of the way, as he is heading in that general direction as well. After Liam leaves the room, Coram asks Alanna what way they shall go. She does not like the idea of taking any longer than needed, and is sure that they can handle any bandits that get in their way. She suggests going straight through, shaving months off of their trip. She assures Coram that she has no trouble using magic if needed to handle bandits.

Knowing that the longer she stays in bed, the longer it will be before she returns to peak condition, Alanna begins exercising the very next day. She goes out into the stable yard and practices with Coram's heavy broadsword, which is heavier and larger than Lightening. When she notices that she has an audience of stable boys, she ignores them. Alanna knows that if she acknowledges the boys, that they will turn shy and run off. Instead, she pretends that she doesn't notice them as they imitate her with their sticks. Soon enough, Alanna is correcting stances, and training them openly, as was her intent to start with.

After Alanna is content that she is at her peak, Liam challenges her to a duel. He wants to spar with her to see just how good she is with a sword. After a long, grueling battle, Alanna finds an opening and defeats Liam. Liam is impressed, admitting that it has been years since a swordsman has beaten him.

The day after leaving Berat, Liam and Alanna both meet in the same clearing to practice. They both go through their own unique exercise routines, then Liam calls Alanna over. He begins by teaching her how to punch in the Shang method. He coaches her on how to punch correctly, and has her practice it until her entire body hurts. After their practice, Liam reveals that he is afraid of her gift. Alanna doesn't believe him at first, but is convinced when Liam reminds her that everyone is afraid of something. Liam is afraid of becoming sick, dying for nothing, and the gift of magic.

When they arrive at Fortress Jirokan, they find it overrun with refugees from the Sarain civil war. Liam and Coram both agree that it would be best to remain as low key here as possible, which, unfortunately, turns out to be impossible. In the tavern, Liam is approached by a bored lady. The lady is cooing over Liam when her man returns from the privy. The large sergeant bellows his rage at Liam, who tries to tell the man that he has mistaken the situation. The man does not believe that nothing was happening, any more than he believes that Liam is the Shang Dragon. After beating the sergeant and



his men soundly, Liam makes sure that none of them are seriously injured before leaving the tavern.

As the group makes its way into Sarain, the difference is visible almost immediately. The roads are abandoned, with the leavings of the refugee camps strewn about. After their fourth day, they see the first signs of the war, a great pile of bodies left to rot. That night at camp, Faithful runs into the circle and informs Alanna that there are women and children just over the ridge. Coram stays with the horses, while Liam and Alanna go investigate. Alanna is surprised when she hears an unfamiliar voice warn that if she doesn't tell the big man to drop his sword, that she will die.

Alanna has a strange dream, in which her twin brother, a sorcerer, is standing in front of a tomb, trying to close it. His magic is not strong enough to do it alone, and he calls out to her, saying that he needs her gift and the stone around her neck. In the dream, Alanna refuses to take the gem off of her neck, as the Goddess gave it to her. When she wakes, she finds that Coram is asleep, and it is Liam that watches over them.

Alanna wakes to find Liam standing guard, with Coram asleep, and later when she sees Faithful purring happily at Liam's side. This clearly shows a change in the relationship between the characters. Liam was at first a potentially dangerous stranger, not to be trusted. Now, he is a trusted ally, standing guard over them as they sleep. Alanna was quick to trust him in the beginning, so it comes as no surprise that she accepts Liam now. It is Faithful's acceptance of Liam and Coram's obvious trust that truly marks the difference.

When Alanna ignores Liam's advice to avoid the fighting in Sarain, she risks the entire quest. Now, Coram, Faithful, and Alanna will be trekking through the mountains of Sarain, right through the heaviest fighting in the Sarain civil war.

Alanna is annoyed when Liam calls her "little girl," using the older and wiser head routine on her, but also doesn't like that she is apparently "too old" to learn the Shang method of fighting unarmed. She wants Liam to teach her to fight without weapons, as she recognizes that when unarmed, she is not a very good fighter. When Coram jokes about her ire, he shows that he and Liam have becomes good friends.

When Liam sees Alanna training the stable boys without even their knowledge, Coram informs him that she has done this before. Liam asks if she is really serious about learning Shang fighting, and Coram assures him that she is. Coram apologizes for not bringing Alanna to the Shang as soon as he saw her skill, when she was young enough to be accepted. Liam tells Coram that he chose correctly, as she is far happier being a knight than she would have been as a Shang warrior.

After defeating Liam in swordplay, Alanna asks why he didn't use any of his Shang techniques to beat her, as he easily could. Liam didn't want to beat her, only to



accurately gauge her swordsmanship without the Shang techniques. Liam is able to assess Alanna as an excellent sword. He is impressed.

After their practice in the clearing, Alanna cooks breakfast. It is revealed here that Alanna is a fearful cook in the field. Liam and coram both eat her breakfast because it is the nice thing to do, but it is clear that neither of them like it.

When Alanna summons the view of a lady for Coram so that he can watch her in the fire, Liam becomes offended and leaves the camp area. Alanna follows him to give Coram some privacy. She assures Liam that the lady has given permission for Alanna to show her to Coram and let him watch her. Liam reveals that no Shang is allowed to have the gift, and that the Shang only allow gifted healers to heal them out of necessity. Alanna is offended by this, as she likes him and is obviously gifted. Liam apologizes and tells her that he didn't mean to offend her, but that he does have a temper. He reveals that he is afraid of magic. Liam doesn't even allow gifted healers to heal him, as he fears magic in the way many fear spiders. Alanna is worried that this will stop them from forming a relationship, but Liam says that he is willing to try anyways. Despite her misgivings, Alanna allows herself to be pulled into his embrace. She will worry about their relationship at a later, less interesting time.

When the sergeant's lady makes her move on Liam, Alanna forgets that she is dressed like a boy and shows her jealousy. Coram tries to talk her down, but Alanna continues to say mean things about the lady. The lady doesn't realize that Alanna is a girl, thinking her a lad instead.

As they continue on into Sarain, Alanna and Liam continue Alanna's Shang training. Liam only teaches her a few punches, blocks, and two kicks, but he drills her constantly and relentlessly in those few moves, checking for even the slightest flaw. In the mornings, Liam is a grumpy teacher, often threatening to dump cold water on Alanna if she does not wake. As he says, if she wants to learn Shang fighting, then she must keep Shang time.

When they come across the first signs of combat on day four, Liam is clearly distressed by the pile of remains. He feels that the warriors deserved better than to be left to rot. When Alanna uses her gift to burn their remains, she sees that Liam is sweating on his horse. She can see now that he was not lying when he said that he was scared of magic. He is clearly terrified by it. Alanna is sad, knowing that there is no way that any real love can survive between them when he so greatly fears such a large part of her. It seems that her romance has been killed just as it is beginning.

## **Chapter 3 Summary**

The voice behind Alanna belongs to a young girl. This embarrasses Alanna, but at least she isn't forced to repeat the command. Liam hears the girl, and drops his sword. Alanna calls out to Coram, and discovers that he has also been ambushed by a young girl. He assures her that, aside from his dignity, he is just fine. When they are brought into the group, Alanna, Coram, and Liam find that this is a group of very tired children. The two girls that captured them seem to be warrior trained, but the remaining group is made up of helpless children who appear nearly dead on their feet. Liam recognizes the very beautiful girl behind Coram, and introduces himself and the group to Thayet, the daughter of the warlord who rules Sarain. When Buri, Thayet's K'mir companion, refuses to drop her guard of Liam, he easily gets the drop on her. Seeing that she had only captured him because he allowed her too, Buri puts away her weapon. Liam tells Thayet where they are going, but not why. Thayet tells them that they are heading in the same direction, fleeing the fighting for the sake of the refugees. Their guards have run away and abandoned them. Liam, Coram, and Alanna agree to acompany them to their destination on the way to the Roof, as they can hardly let a relatively unarmed group of children roam about undefended.

After making camp, Buri comes to Alanna and hands her a baby. Alanna has never cared for a baby before, and is dismayed by this. She is even more dismayed when the baby begins to wail. Coram shows her how to change his dirty diaper, and Alanna has her first experience with childcare.

After the children go to bed, Coram, Alanna, Liam, and Thayet meet by the stream out of earshot of the camp. They discuss the situation and form a plan. The camp has little to no supplies left, and the food that Alanna and her group have won't last long. The refugees originally planned to range for food off the land, but the other refugees and the fighters have left the countryside of Sarain fairly baren. Coram suggests that if bandits have already cleared the land of any available food, then they must find the bandits and take the food from them. The group agrees on this, knowing that if they don't, the refugees won't make it to sundown.

Liam finds signs that bandits have been nearby recently, so the group sets up camp to prepare to go in search of them. Faithful comes into the camp and tells Alanna that there are about fifty or so bandits with their women in a canyon very nearby. Alanna, Coram, Faithful, Liam, and Buri head out to take a look. There are too many bandits for such a small attack force, so Alanna decides that she must use magic. Buri and Liam are both instantly upset at the suggestion, both feeling that any fighter who uses magic is a cheater. Buri gets over it and agrees that it is the only way that they can get their much needed supplies. Liam agrees that they must, but storms off in anger.



As Liam fights a sentry, Alanna rushes to complete her spell. She envisions the Dominion Jewel as her magical focus, which was the first image to come to mind, and begins her spell. She channels her gift out and over the bandit camp, forming a net to hold them all down while the others rob the supply tent. As the others come back, laden with supplies, Alanna struggles to get free of the spell. Faithful has to bite and scratch her to break her focus on the spell to keep her from pouring her life into it. The others don't know how close she comes to dying, but they do notice that she takes two whole days to recover from the spell.

Once inside the city of Rachia, the group comes up against some trouble. An assassin fires at Thayet from a rooftop. After running him down, Alanna is unable to identify him or who he works for. He jumps from the roof onto the street, killing himself. His pockets are empty, giving no evidence as to who he was.

After the would be assassin, more trouble comes. Alanna and Buri arrive at the convent to find that the daughters of the Mother of Water have not allowed the group into the convent. Alanna is forced to threaten to report them to the Goddess herself to gain entry into the convent, where it should be safe. The leaders of the group are brought before the heads of the convent, and given terrible news. Thayet's father has died, and the new ruler has ordered everyone to turn in Thayet if they find her. The Daughters promise not to turn her in, but they can not guarantee her safety either. Thayet and Buri are not welcome to stay in the convent, but the others are. Alanna asks Buri and Thayet to join their quest, but doesn't tell them what the quest is for. The two girls agree, not having anywhere else to go.

After a three day ride out of the city, the group arrives at the border of Sarain. Soon, they will be at the Roof of the World.

### **Chapter 3 Analysis**

Alanna is embarrassed to find that a very young girl has got the drop on her. Coram is equally embarrassed to have Thayet catch him off guard. When Alanna sees Thayet, she is instantly jealous of this girl's epic beauty. Thayet is extremely beautiful, while Alanna thinks that all she can aspire to is being cute. When Liam recognizes her and introduces himself, Thayet instantly decides that they are friends and lowers her weapon. Buri does not agree, but Liam tells her that she might as well lower her weapon. He tells her that if he wanted to hurt her, he could have turned the tables on her at any point. To prove it, he effectively disarms her, then returns the crossbow to her. Buri finally puts away her weapon because she realizes that it is now useless to her against Liam, but she doesn't like it. Buri still doesn't trust them.

When Alanna is left with the infant, she is dismayed by his crying. She doesn't know what to do, but Buri returns, followed by Coram, and they coach her through it. Alanna doesn't feel that she will ever need the skills of child care, but she also feels that as a knight, she should be up to anything. She agrees to change the diaper herself, but she really doesn't know how. Coram coaches her through it, showing great parenting skills.



Alanna is surprised by this, but he explains that he got plenty of childcare experience when he was governor. He used to watch the children while their mothers worked in the fields. It never bothered him, as he likes children. Alanna wonders if Coram would have had a family and been a happy farmer had he been free to do so. Coram assures her that he is happy enough in his like of work, and reminds her that he reared her since she was very little.

When Thayet tells of her mother's death, and the death of Buri's family, Alanna doesn't understand what they accomplished. She sees no accomplishment in death. Liam tries to explain it to her, but she is too blinded by her feelings for him to accept that there could be a good reason for Liam to die. When Liam and Thayet seem to agree that Alanna is too young and inexperienced to understand, Alanna is upset.

While Buri agrees with Liam that fighting with magic is cheating, she does get over her ethical issues with it in the face of desperate need. Liam, on the other hand, agrees that she must, but he does not get over it so easily. He says that it is cheating, and tells her that when she is done, she can come give a hand with the real work if she likes. Buri tries to say that it is unfair for him to say that to her, but Liam has already left. Alanna, knowing of Liams extreme distrust and fear of magic, tells Buri that it is all right. She understands.

The use of her magical gift grants Alanna a great feeling of euphoria and power. It is so intoxicating, that when she is done, she is almost unable to break away from the spell. She realizes that she has gone too far, but is unsure how to stop from pouring her entire life energy into the spell and dying. Faithful frantically tries to tell Alanna to break free of the spell, but she can not. It is not until he wraps himself around her arm, biting and clawing her, that she is able to break free. Despite her obvious weakness after working the magic, Liam refuses to have her ride behind him. Coram has to take her back to camp.

As they ride through this desolate area, Alanna is plagued by nightmares in which the people who have died are from her land, and the burned out homes are the homes of her friends. Liam provides the cure for these dreams, adding another training session just before bed.

When the group arrives at the city of Rachia, Alanna finds that she is afraid of the city. She has become too used to deserts and plains, and is uncomfortable in the confines of a city. She worries about how she will react when she returns home, to bigger cities.

The assassin on the rooftop appears to be a simple drunk, probably hired out of a random tavern for a single gold, which he has already likely drunk up. It is disturbing that an attempt was made on Thayet so soon after they arrived in the city. The group knows that they must hurry for the convent.

The head Daughter is Thayet's distant cousin, and it is hard for her to deliver the news to Thayet. However, the Hag-Daughter has no trouble telling them how it is, in fact she is quite blunt. Alanna admires this, saying that at least she was honest. When it

Thayet begins to reveal more about her personal life. After hearing about Thayet's childhood, Alanna begins to appreciate her own more. Thayet's father wanted only a son, and got only a daughter. Her mother was the only one in the family who truly made her feel loved. Now Thayet will not be queen, which she does admit disappoints her some. Thayet had planned to change things in Sarain. Sarain women have no rights, and are simply the property of their husbands. Alanna feels that this is barbaric, as in Tortal, even women can inherit lands. While it is rare that any woman holds a title, many women have been the heirs to their lord husbands and fathers, inheriting whole estates. Thayet tells Alanna that she thinks that Tortel seems wonderful. Alanna begins to form a plan to take her to Tortal after the quest is over. She is interested to see how Jon will react to Thayet, who was originally supposed to be his wife.

When Coram and Alanna were adopted by the Bazhir, they became able to join with the Voice. The Voice of the tribe is an individual who is bound by Bazhir law to connect magically with anyone who wants to at sundown each day. This way, the Bazhir can hear news and trade information instantly. Alanna has never joined with the Voice, but she does know that Coram has done the rite everyday since they left the tribe. She didn't want to do it because she doesn't like the idea of someone else being in her head. After Jon became the Voice, and they had their falling out, ending their relationship, she certainly didn't want to join the Voice. Alanna specifically ordered Coram never to speak to her of the Voice and the rite, but now she asks him about it. She is more worried by the loss communication via magic than she lets on.

When Liam is mean to her about the dress, Alanna becomes very upset. She loves Liam and wants to impress him, but he can be very cruel sometimes. Thayet explains that he doesn't mean what he is saying sometimes. Much like Alanna, he did not ask to fall in love. It just happened. It is taking him by surprise just as it is Alanna. However, unlike Alanna, Liam, the Shang Dragon is practically obsessed with self control. He always feels that he must be in control of everything, especially himself. It seems that every time that Liam thinks that he has figured her out, she shows him something new. He is not able to define her easily and put her in a neat little box like he does the rest of the group.

Alanna is surprised to discover that Liam has had his palms read. He says that it is different from the kind of magic that Alanna uses, and that it does not bother him so much. Thayet leaves the group for some privacy after hearing her fortune, but it is unclear just how she feels about it. Both Coram and Buri ask that the seer whisper their fortunes to them, and she does. Jon tells him that she was strong before Roger sent his sickness and magic at her to attack her, but Roger says that that was different. He is not the same man who did this, and that was not the reason that she died. Jon says that he knows, but George doesn't seem to understand. He is looking fiercely at Roger. Alanna wakes. Faithful uses magic to charm Liam so that he will remain asleep, and Alanna heads out.

On her way up the mountain, Alanna struggles just to take a few steps. She realizes that she will be lucky to make it up into the pass, much less back. Jon is worried that he will not be able to comfort his people. He hopes that Alanna will actually be able to bring the Dominion Jewel to him, and decides that he doesn't want to be a king that just sits in his palace waiting on the people to come to him. Once this is all settled, he will go to every corner of Tortal, to see his people, so that they may know and love him.

Thom is resentful of Roger's apparent good health. While Thom was the one who raised Roger from ten months of death just seven months ago, Roger appears to be in perfect health, while Thom is sickly. It doesn't seem fair to Thom. Thom also does not like the fact that Jon keeps at him to spy on Roger. He wants to know if Roger is trustworthy and if his gift comes back. While Thom is obviously unsettled, Roger seems to be almost disinterested. He asks Thom what he would have him do next, but Thom tells him that he is neither his jailor or keeper. George is clearly still in love with Alanna, and Alanna does not necessarily feel otherwise about him, but her relationship with Liam is still complicated, if not over. George and Liam are amiable enough to each other, each knowing that the other is in love with Alanna and has at some point been her lover. Alanna shows that she still loves Liam when he carries her to bed. He leaves her in her bed and calls her lioness. Jon courts Thayet, so Buri sticks fairly close to Alanna, preferring her to the nobleman's company. The duke seems to be conspicuously innocent, which only heightens Alanna's mistrust of him. On the festival of Beltane, Jonathan summons Alanna. He wants her to help smooth over a conversation that he is going to have with George. When George arrives, Jon hands each of them a scroll. Alanna notices that the writing on George's scroll is the flowing script of a court scribe, not Jonathan's precise hand. George becomes very upset when he reads his official pardon. Jon explains that he learned much from George, and that George has earned it. however, there is more to it than even that, as Jon does not want to ever have to sign George's execution warrant. Jon feels trapped by the crown, and Alanna is too well known now. Jon needs someone who can move freely without being recognized as one of the king's men. He wants George to take the pardon, and to work with him in secrecy. George grudgingly agrees and accepts the pardon and the title as Baron of Pirate Swoop and the income that comes with it.

Later in the day, as Alanna walks aimlessly around the city, she finds herself in the coronation chamber. This chamber is used only for one purpose, to bind a king to the land. It has sat unused for many years, but now servants had opened it up and cleaned it out. Alanna is surprised to see the Goddess in the chamber. The Goddess tells Alanna that she can no longer guide her. She has grown into her powers fully now, and it is up to her to make her own future from this point on. If the gods continue to give people hints and show them the way, then where is their freedom to choose? When Alanna begs the Goddess for just one hint about the future, she laughs and denies her again. Before the Goddess fades from view, all of the other gods arrive beside and behind her. Alanna is forced to cover her eyes, and when she opens her eyes again, the gods are gone.

On her way back from the Hall of Crowns, Alanna is surprised to see Princess Josiane and Delia talking together. They greet her with sarcasm, and she bows to them as a man would. Delia tells, very bitingly, of the times that she "had to" dance with Alanna



when she posed as a boy. Alanna remembers things a little differently, saying that she thought that Alanna was a boy, and was just a woman hater. She chased after Alanna trying to make Alanna fall in love with her to show off to the court. After several more biting insults from both sides, Delia finally calls Alanna a slut and pulls Josiane away.

Back at Myles's home, Alanna tells Liam and Myles of the incident with the ladies. They discuss the danger that those two might pose, and the likelihood that there are warrior groups in the city to kill Jonathan. They haven't seen any proof of them, so it would appear that the soon to be king is as safe as possible. Si-cham arrives, and surprises Alanna by revealing that he knows both Myles and the Dragon of Shang. He reveals also that George has sent for him to treat Thom.

Thom took several days of convincing before he finally agrees to see Si-cham. Once he does agree, Si-cham and Thom are sequestered away in Thom's study alone for many days, and no one is allowed in. After a while, a courier summons Alanna to visit Thom. Thom begins the visit by prying into her personal life, which not only annoys her but also shows that he is feeling better. Si-Cham explains that they need Alanna to hold a small part of Thom's gift for a week so that he can think and work clearly. This should give him the time to make the infusions that he needs to heal. The only condition, though, is that she should not try to use her gift while holding the parcel of his gift.

A few days before the coronation, Thom does indeed look better. Alanna has finally gotten used to the extra burden, though she still refuses to work even the smallest spell out of fear that it will poison her gift as it had her brother's. Instead, Alanna must present it to him at the end of her oath as King's Champion. Alanna thinks that her lines are ridiculous, but Jon tells her to wait until she hears what he has to reply to her with.

#### **Chapter 7 Analysis**

Alanna doesn't want to be the King's Champion and she doesn't feel like she belongs in council. She is a roaming warrior, and she belongs out in the open. Alanna realizes that Jon is trying to hint that she would make a good Champion, so instead of accepting it, she tries to put it off on someone else. Alanna talks about how great warriors some of her friends are, but Jon tells her that he likes them all exactly where the are, and that she needs to be the Champion. He tells her that it's not really up for debate, and that she just needs to say thank you. Eventually Alanna accepts it and just says thank you.

Jonathan has asked Alanna to marry him before, back when they were still enough alike and unchanged by the various adventures that Alanna has had. He doesn't want to feel like he has gone back on his word, so he asks her again. He doesn't want to marry her, but he does love her. Alanna doesn't want to be queen, as she prefers action to kingly



stuff anyways, but she does love him. They pretty much agree to be just friends, and she finally accepts who she is now as the King's Champion.

George is angry at Jonathan for giving him a pardon. He accuses Jonathan of having his fun with his low born, and now throwing him a bauble. George is tired of the Rogue anyways, and he tells Jonathan that he intends to leave and settle in some other city. George wants to travel, and doesn't particularly want to be made respectable. However, Jonathan needs him, and George can not abandon his friend.

In the Coronation chamber, Alanna wonders why she can't have the best of both worlds. She has worked hard and earned pretty much anything that she wants. She wants to be both warrior and woman. She wants to be a knight and to marry and be able to travel. She wants to serve Jon, but also roam about the realm. When Alanna sees the Goddess, she wants to know what will happen. The Goddess refuses to tell Alanna the future, and hints that if she did, she would take away Alanna's freedom of choice. After the Gods fade, Faithful tells Alanna that people like her are the fulcrum on which all things sit. One way or the other, people like Alanna change the world, and even the gods don't know what will happen in every case. At some point, it comes a time that only a human can change the world.

Alanna is glad to see Si-cham, but surprised to find that he knows Liam and Myles as well. She is glad that he has come to help Thom, but is worried that Thom will not accept any help.

When Alanna tries to convince Thom to see Si-cham for healing, he is furious. He is angry that they went behind his back and summoned his old teacher. Thom's pride would gladly kill him if it were not for his old friend George and his sister Alanna, who are more concerned for him that he seems to be for himself. When Alanna comes back, Thom pries into her personal life and analyzes her. She become agitated, and Thom apologizes. He remembers how much he hates it when people do it to him.

The night before the coronation, Jonathan must endure the King's Ordeal. Alanna doesn't know what is going on in the Chamber of the Ordeal, but she is glad that she is not in there with him. She begins to have a vision. The Dominion Jewel shines brightly off the doors to the Chamber and it comes closer and closer to her. She is in the Chamber of the Ordeal again. She sees Roger lying on a black stone slab. He tells her to come dance with her, and they dance along the Chamber. Alanna wants to scream, but she knows that screaming is forbidden in the Chamber of Ordeals. She can see the love and madness in Roger's eyes. When she comes to, she finds that she is indeed in the Chamber, and is glad that Jonathan is in a trance and doesn't seem to notice her.

Jonathan's Ordeal only lasts fifteen minutes, and afterward he and Alanna both go to their rooms to sleep for a little bit before the coronation.

In Alex's suite of rooms, he and Lady Delia prepare for the rebellion. He sharpens his weapons, and Delia worries over her physical appearance. A squire arrives and confirms that all arrangements have been made for the attack. Alex reminds the man that he is to wait for the signal before attacking, and that the attack will not come until AFTER the crown rests on Jonathan's head.

The coronation ceremony begins. It is truly a beautiful sight. Mourning is officially over, and all of the nobles are blooming with vibrant color. Alanna stands on the wall watching, grateful that she doesn't need to be down there in the ceremony. The moment that the crown touches Jonathan's head, and the magic of Tortal embraces its new king, the ground begins to rumble and is covered in Blood colored magic fire. Alanna feels a great pain in her stomach, that she immediately realizes means that Thom is under attack. She yells for others to protect the king, and heads for her brother's quarters. George stops her on her way, but after hearing her explanation, follows along with her. When they reach Thom's quarters, Alanna is worried. Something is wrong.

With the earthquakes and the magical fire, many of the commoners try to flee. Several nobles in cloaks throw off their cloaks, revealing their colors and their weapons. Myles races for Jonathan's side, informing him of the attack. Jonathan doesn't know what is going on, but he will find out as soon as he has a chance. The King's Own break into two squads. One will defend the king and the nobles, the other will go out and fight the nobles from Eldorne and Tirragen.

In Thom's quarters, Alanna feels the instant attack trying to drain her magic from her. She steels herself and sets out to find her brother. He is in his room. He is in terrible shape, and she can see the gift literally being drained from him. She tries to reach for her magic to save him, but Jonathan stops her. He warns her that when he brought Roger back from the dead, Roger's gift bound to him, but Roger was still able to control



it. Roger some how set draining spells there, and is draining all of Thom's gift into himself, becoming more and more powerful. However, since Thom gave Alanna some of his gift, she now has some of his and some of Roger's gift. Roger can only drain one person at a time, but if she uses their gifts to try to save Throm, then she'll be caught in the draining spell too, and Roger will become very powerful indeed. As Alanna holds him, trying to save him, Throm's gift is gone, and so is his life.

On his way out of Thom's quarters, George runs into Coram, who had followed them. He tells Coram that he must take the Jewel to Jonathan, but out of the shadows comes Claw and his men. He demands that George give him the Jewel, and promises to let both men go if they do. Coram and George prepare for a fight.

More and More nobles are throwing off their cloaks, revealing these traitorous colors on heavily armed men. They have their very specific targets. They attack the king, the king's guards, and anyone else who fight back. The fight is not going well for the king's men.

As two more Tirragen guards come to Claw's aid, Coram and George fight them off. Finally, George lunges for Ralon himself. The Claw finds himself exactly where he does not want to be, in a knife fight with George, who was a better knife fighter even before Ralon lost an eye and much of his nerve. The others refuse to interfere, which also leaves Ralon no escape. He tries to fight George, but eventually ends up lying on the ground with George's knight hilt - deep in his chest.

Alanna remains at Thom's side, holding him, until Faithful latches on to her to snap her out of it. Thom is dead and there is nothing she can do about it, however, she is needed by her king. Si-Cham arrives, missing his right hand. He tells Alanna to open her mind to him, and she does. He fills her head with the knowledge of what has happened. Roger was stronger than Si-Cham, who had not practiced in years. He stole his right hand to steal his magic, and has set up leaching spells by the gate. Si-cham uses Alanna's gift to form a link between Si-Cham, Alanna, and Jonathan. He give all of Alanna's magic to the new king, making her pass out.

After killing Ralon, George backs away to regroup with Coram. Twelve more men have gathered to watch the combat, and now that it is settled, they can all get back to their fighting. Fierce tho they are, Coram and George alone are no match for close to fifteen men. With a sound that momentarily makes George think that another quake has begun, Liam the Dragon roars down the hall and into the fighting men. After taking out several, the remaining six break and run. They three men know that they can not follow Alanna down the path she is on now, so they all head to Jonathan to ensure that the Jewel gets to him in time.

When Alanna wakes up, she finds Si-Cham fighting someone off at the door. It turns out to be Josiane, who chops him down with an ax. She tells Alanne that Roger told her that she could have her if she cold manage to kill her. She tries, but Faithful gets in the way. As Josiane kills Faithful, his strength is returned to Alanna, giving her the strength and



speed to cut Josiane down in one swift move. She places Faithful on the table, and heads out to find Roger.

Liam, Coram, and George finally reach the fighting near the king. Liam heads off to do some fighting, and Coram thrusts the jewel into Jonathan's hands before grabbing a sword and taking his place as defender of the king. George, Liam, and Coram set themselves for a long morning, as more and more attackers make it through.

Racing down the old forgotten passageways, Alanna finally comes to Alex. He is waiting for her, and challenges her to a duel. He orders his men to remain at their posts, but the of course disobey and watch the duel. Alex is the first to disarm Alanna, but Alanna manages to defeat him unarmed, crushing his windpipe and ramming the bones of his nose up into his brain. Alex's men flee. Alanna continues down, down into the catacombs. In the ancient tomb, she finds the gate that steals magic, and the remains of an ancient temple. Standing nearby is Roger, who invites her to come to him. He is surprised at first, to learn that she has no gift, but he shrugs it off. Roger has planned for most of the outcomes that might occur here, including Si-cham stealing Alanna's gift. He calls to Lightening, which is made from parts of a magic sword that Roger himself forged. The sword leaps to life to go Roger, but Alanna is able to hold it for a while. Eventually, she realizes that the only thing that Roger DOESN'T expect her to do is to stop fighting. She stops fighting. She releases the sword. Roger doesn't notice until it is too late to call off the summoning spell that the sword is flying through the air straight for his chest. Roger laughs as the life leaves his body once again. The designs on his clothes and the floor melt, and the blood colored fire consumes the remains of Roger.

### **Chapter 8 Analysis**

In his fancy suite of rooms at the palace, Alex plots his rebellion. Delia, he lumps up with the other conspirators, who mean to steal the crown for themselves. Little do they know that to Roger, they are only pawns. Alex is amused at the idea of Delia and the others thinking that they are going to get the crown. He alone knows what his master is planning. He alone will laugh at the fall of the others once they are of no more use to Duke Roger.

Alanna is glad that she does not have to be part of the ceremony. She is tired from her all night vigil with Jonathan the night before, and doesn't think that frequent yawning would be proper for the king's coronation.

When the blood colored fire takes over the floor, and the earthquakes begin, Alanna instantly knows that something is wrong with her brother. The color of the fire is the new color of Thom's magic. She explains to George that while her brother's color used to be purple, it is not that blood orange red color due to the corruption of his gift. Just before they arrive at her brother's quarters, George is struck by a fearful idea. What color would Thom's purple and Roger's orange make? Alanna realizes that the combination of the gifts would make the same blood colored magic they see now.



When Alanna finds her brother dying, she instantly tries to save him. Thom stops her, knowing that this is what Roger wants, and that if she releases her magic, then Roger will drain her too. Throm seems proud that, while Roger grew stronger with Thom, Thom's magic was still stronger. Alanna doesn't see how this matters, as Roger is still somehow killing her brother, and stealing his gift as well. Thom tells Alanna that she must stop him, and not allow him to get the rest of Thom's gift and Alanna's along with it. His last words are that he still doesn't know how Roger is doing it.

As the pandemonium grows in the Hall of Crowns, Buri I torn between her training as a warrior and her duty to Thayet. Thayet solves the ethical issue for her by taking up sword against the attackers.

Standing by her brother's side, Alanna can't help but feel that somehow this is all her fault. If it were not for Faithful, there is no telling how long she would have remained there, by her dead brother, while the kingdom tore itself apart in the grips of Roger's dark magic. When Si-Cham arrives, he admits that he made a foolish mistake by thinking that he was unbeatable when in truth he had gone unchallenged for so long. He doesn't bother asking Alanna if she minds him sending all of her magic to Jonathan, probably because he knows that she would not allow it. instead, he does it without asking, knowing that this is what Jonathan needs to defeat Roger.

As George looks his death in the eyes, he thinks about his oath to Alanna. He promised that he would get the Jewel to Jonathan. George may be at thief, but he is no oathbreaker. It bothers him that he is unlikely to be able to uphold his promise. George is as happy about Liam's arrival for that reason as he is any other.

Alanna is tired of Si-cham and his high handed way of ordering people's lives. She means to give the man a piece of her mind, but is sorry that she will never get the chance. As Josiane steps over his body, she wonders aloud at why he didn't just strike her down with magic. Alanna knows that it is because of Roger's draining spells. Si-cham would rather die than give his gift to Roger, to make him stronger. He does exactly that.

Alanna is surprised and disappointed to find Alex waiting for her. He always wanted to be the best, and was obsessed with beating Alanna. This time, they don't spar, but actually duel to the death. Alann is tired, and slightly slower than her best. She knows that this might well make the difference with an opponent like Alex. She is disarmed, but then relies on her Shang training to eventually defeat him.

When Alanna finds Roger, she notices fresh blood on the ground, probably the blood from Si-cham's hand. Roger seems prepared for each eventuality as she tries to stop him. He even isn't bothered by the fact that Si-cham has drained her gift. All he needs is to chop of a small piece of her, which will give him access to her inner self, and then to the magic that protects Jonathan. As Alanna tries to fight Roger, she decides that she probably can not defeat him. Instead of fighting, she decides that she must give in. when she does, Roger's own arrogance costs him his life. He is so sure that he has all of his bases covered, that he doesn't really pay attention to what Alanna is doing. He



doesn't realize until it is too late that she has released the sword, and that it buries itself deep into his chest.

When Alanna is brought to the surface, she is sickened by the bodies and ruin all around her. The Hall of Crowns was all but destroyed and so many are dead. Nearly everyone else is injured. Jonathan sits alone, with new silvery hairs on his head that weren't there that morning. Lady Delia tried to assassinate Jon herself with a dagger, but Rispah figured out her plan and tied her up. Jonathan tells Alanna that he did all that he could to hold the land together, but that he could do nothing else. Liam stepped in front of him to take the eight arrows that would have otherwise killed Jonathan and cost them the kingdom. Liam died doing what he felt was his duty. To Liam, an honorable warrior's death for a reason is better than living for no reason. Jonathan understands this, but also understands that Alanna loved the Dragon still. He tries to tell her in the gentlest way possible, but he knows that she still hurts. Despite her many hurts this day, she knows that Liam died the way he wanted to, and that the kingdom is safe because of him, because of all of them.



# **Epilogue**

## **Epilogue Summary**

After the fall of the very short lived, but brutal rebellion, Jonathan sends out curriors all over the kingdom to explain that there will be no weeks long celebration of Coronation Day. Instead, in honor of those who died, Tortall will mourn and rebuild. One year from this day, they will have a great festival, and Jonathan will ride out amongst his people as no king has since his grandfather's day.

Thayet and Buri come to visit Alanna at her tribe. They bring news of the school that Thayet has started back in the capital city, and they talk of other things. However, it is nearly a week before Thayet talks about the real subject that has brought her here. She wants to know if it is truly over between Alanna and Jonathan before she agrees to marry him. Alanna assures Thayet that she has no interest in being qeen or Jonathan's wife, and that she actually hopes that Thayet would like Jonathan by now. Alanna tells Thayet that she would make the better queen anyways.

The Wildcat of Shang arrives with a message for Alanna. Liam had written her the day before he was killed. If he lived, she was to destroy the letter. If he died, she was to deliver it to Alanna. A few days after the Wildcat leaves, Alanna begins to feel that it is time for her to leave as well. She has made a gift for George, and will bring it to him herself. Instead, George arrives in her tent, covered in dust from the road. He bears news of his new keep and of Jon and Thayet's betrothal, though he figures with Jon as the Voice, she would already know. Alanna agrees to marry George, and they kiss passionately. They go to tell the tribe of their betrothal.

### **Epilogue Analysis**

No one is in a festive mood after the Coronation Day ceremonies, as they all are injured and mourn for their losses. Jonathan's plan to have a one year anniversary festival instead shows that he is practical and respectful of those who died for him, but still understands that the beginning of his reign is to be celebrated, as much for the people of Tortall, who need such things to keep up their morale, as for the king himself.

Jonathan sentences the captured traitors to exile, and Delia to life imprisonment. Technically the law calls for executions for treason, but Jonathan refused to begin his reign with executions. Instead, he gives out more pardons in his first week as king than his father had in his entire reign.

Alanna is tired. She has had a long year, and she requests that Jonathan allow her to go to her tribe to rest for a while. Jon agrees, and tells her to take all the time she needs. After several weeks of rest, Thayet and Buri show up. Alanna has a good idea of what they want, but Thayet won't talk about it for a while. Thayet feels like Alanna, who is one of her best friends, is still in love with Jonathan and that she would like to be his



wife and queen. She tells Alanna that as her friend, she can not take her man. Alanna assures Thayet that she is still close and will likely always be close to Jon, but that the romance part of their relationship is over. She admits that she had schemed to get Jonathan and Thayet together from the start, and that she had rather hoped that Thayet would at least like Jon by now. By the end of the conversation, it seems clear that Thayet will happily marry Jonathan, now that she doesn't worry that she is stealing him away from a friend. That night, Thayet asks Alanna if there is another man for her. Alanna tells Thayet that she doesn't know, but she thinks of George while they talk.

Liam's letter apologizes for his death. He is not sorry that he died, only sorry that he was never able to make her truly understand how his people saw death. Liam loves Alanna to the moment of his death, but he had sensed change in Tortall for quite some time now. He feels that if he has to die to protect the new king, and what ever it is that he is beginning, then he will have truly died a Dragon.

Alanna is in love with George. When he arrives and fishes for answers about why she gave Thayet her blessing to marry Jon, she admits it to him freely. He is glad, and says that he finally tamed his lioness. Alanna corrects him, saying that she's not quite tame. They agree to marry, and prepare to tell the tribe of their betrothal.



## **Characters**

#### **Alanna of Trebond and Olau**

Alanna is the adopted daughter of Sir Myles as well as the adopted member of the Blood Hawk tribe. She has always wanted to become a knight, despite her being a woman. When she was young, Alanna disguised herself as a boy and took the name of Alan. She trained as a page, then a squire, and finally attained knighthood. Only then did she reveal that she was truly a woman.

Despite the common belief that it is unnatural for a woman to a knight, and the noblemen who believe that Alanna can't be a good fighter because she is a woman, Alanna takes on a series of grueling tests and trials and overcomes each one. By the end of her quest, the commoners are singing her praise. She is a hero and a legend, and even becomes King's Champion, the first woman to ever hold that tile in the history of Tortall.

Alanna is a fierce fighter, but when it comes to love, she is a bit confused. Alanna has a habit of thinking that she can either be a woman or she can be a knight. #### **Anvil**

Anvil is Coram's horse.

#### **Drifter**

Drifter is Liam's horse.

#### **Bother**

Bother is the packhorse of the Sarain group of children led by Thayet and Buri

#### Buri

Buri is a K'miri guard who is also great friend to her charge, Thayet. Buri is proud, and in the beginning, her pride keeps her from opening up to the other members of their party.



## **Thayet**

Thayet is the daughter of the warlord of Sarain. After her father's death, she agrees to accompany Alanna back to Tortall.

#### **Jonathan**

Jonathan is the son of the king and queen of Tortall. He was once Alanna's lover, and has even gone so far as to ask her hand in marriage. When his parents die, he takes it very hard. Jonathan was not expecting to be king for many many years. On his coronation day, Roger leads a rebellion that nearly destroys the realm. It is Jonathan's use of the Dominion Jewel that curbs Roger's magic enough to allow him to be defeated.

### Roger

Roger is the Duke of Conte, and the king's cousin. He has planned a great rebellion that will leave his cousin dead and him on the throne, that is until Alanna kills him. While Alanna is away questing for her king, her brother raises the sorcerer from the dead, giving him one more opportunity to take over the kingdom.

#### **Thom**

Thom is Alanna's twin brother. He is a proud and powerful sorcerer, but his pride becomes the death of him. In his pride, he allows Delia to goad him into raising Roger from the dead. When Roger mounts his rebellion once again, Thom is killed by his gift draining spells.

#### George

George is a lowborn thief. He goes from leader of thieves guild to the baron of Pirate Swoop, and Alanna's husband, after betraying the Rogue to save Jonathan.



# **Objects/Places**

### **Shang**

The Shang are a group of people who are totally devoted to martial arts. They train from a very young age.

#### **Tortall**

Tortall is the kingdom that Alanna calls home.

#### **Hall of Crowns**

The Hall of Crowns is used for the coronations of Tortall kings only. Any other time, the Hall is closed.

## Lightening

Lightening is Alanna's sword. She made it from two broken swords, one of which was a magic sword made by Roger.

#### Sarain

Sarain is a kingdom split by civil war. It is the home of Thayet and buri.

#### The Voice

The Voice is the magical leader of the Bazhir people who can magically link to all of the tribes to share news.

#### Chithril

Chithral is the dangerous mountain pass that holds the Dominion Jewel, as well as the great entity that guards the jewel.

#### ominion Jewel

The Dominion Jewel was created by Chithral. It is a powerful magical item that can be used only by rulers. A good ruler can use the jewel to ensure years of good harvest and a happy reign. Selfish rulers, on the other hand, can use it to form terrible empires.



## Gigt

The gift is the spark of magic that is in all natural born sorcerers. There are other kinds of magic that others can use who are not gifted, but that magic comes from the land.

## **Roof of the World**

The Roof of the World is the highest elevation in the world and is north of all of the kingdoms.



## **Themes**

## **Duty**

Duty drives most of the characters of this story. Despite her arguments with Jonathan, Alanna still recognizes him as her king, even before his coronation. She feels that it is her duty as sworn knight to do what ever will best serve his reign as king. It is out of her sense of duty that Alanna braves civil war in a hostile nation, roving bandit groups, and brutal snows as well as the powerful elemental who brought them about, all to bring the Dominion Jewel back to Jonathan. When she returns home, her duty will call her to fight to put down a rebellion at the hands of a powerful sorcerer.

Liam, the Dragon of the Shang, is perhaps one of the most duty and honor driven characters in this story. He trained from a very young age to fight with and without weapons. His would gladly give his life if he can die for something important. To Liam, it is more important to die for something important than to live safely, which is exactly what he does. When Jonathan is absorbed in the magic, trying to stop Roger's magic from ripping the land apart, Liam steps in front of eight arrows and trades his death for that of the new king. It is his duty that prevents Liam from allowing his relationship to continue with Alanna, as he believed that she would marry Jonathan.

Jonathan is bound by his duty to the land as king, and must defend it with everything that he is. He is also bound by the duty of his word and will marry Alanna even though he doesn't really want to, just because he cannot break his word.

Coram has helped raise Alanna and Thom since they were in diapers. Coram continues to follow Alanna to the ends of the earth and back, forsaking his own love, to fulfill his duty to Alanna as her guardian. Despite all of his drunken adventures when they stop at inns, Coram's main priority is the safety of Alanna. He has fought many a battle in defense of Alanna, many times after being told to leave.

#### Love

Alanna falls in love with several people over the course of this story. Alanna reveals the history of her relationship with Jonathan, a relationship so strong that it leads him to ask her to marry him later on. She remembers George fondly, but immediately falls in love with Liam. Liam and Alanna fall so deeply in love that they are willing to ignore the major issues that will eventually split them apart. Alanna is a gifted sorceress, and Liam is terrified of magic. Alanna is beginning to wonder about settling down and getting married, but Liam is the Dragon of Shang, and will likely never settle down. When Liam does finally break his relationship to Alanna, he later reveals that he doesn't really want to. He still loves her and only did it out of duty.

Alanna falls in love with George all over again when they meet again in the second half of the book. George has been in love with alanna all along, and has even asked her to



marry him in the past. Alanna always said no before, because of the difference in their social status. However, as the story progresses and Alanna grows, she finds that she loves George regardless of his station, and would gladly marry him. In the end, Alanna tells George that she loves him and that she would like to marry him and have as many children as he wants, after a year or two of having him to herself first, of course.

#### **Lust for Power**

The lust for power drives several of the characters of this story, and becomes vital to the plot. Roger, who has been recently returned from the grave by Thom, still has his old desires of holding the throne. Now, his lust for power has grown, and he would rather be a god instead. Roger is able to use several other nobles, due to their lust for power, as tools to launch a rebellion that almost destroys all of Tortall. Roger intends to drain the gift off of several sorcerers to feed his own, making him super powerful, even more powerful than some of the gods. Roger's lust for power has driven him mad, and he will stop at nothing to gain that power, even the destruction of his own land.

Josiane's lust for power as well as Delia's blind them to Roger's true goals, as well to the fact that Ralon is not to be trusted. Roger warns them that the Claw will betray them as he has everyone else before them, but they are too blinded by their lust for power to listen. Ultimately, each of loses everything when the rebellion fails.

Even Alanna's quest to gain the Dominion Jewel is driven by a lust for power. She doesn't want the power for herself, and she only wants Jonathan to use it for the good of Tortall. However, Alanna is still driven by the image in her head of what Jonathan can do with the power of the jewel. By seeing it as a powerful tool to be used to manipulate the environment with magic, even though she does not intend to use it for evil or for herself, Alanna has given in to her lust for power.



# **Style**

#### **Point of View**

The point of view of this novel is subjective third-person with multiple viewpoints. The narrator generally follows Alanna, showing the world through her eyes and revealing her feelings. However, in a few sections the narrator instead follows a different character. In some parts of the book, Alanna is nowhere near, and the narrator instead follows George, Alex, or Jonathan. This viewpoint allows the author to tell the whole story as it happens, even as multiple important events take place at the same time in different places. This choice of viewpoint is interesting because it shows the world and events surrounding each focal character in turn, as well as their emotions, but does not provide an all knowing, bird's eye view of the story. Had the author chosen omniscient third-person point of view or bird's eye view, it would have been more difficult to maintain the suspense and keep from revealing crucial plot twists.

## **Setting**

This story takes place in a fantasy land. The story begins in the kingdom of Tortall, where Alanna and her companions are from. They head out of Tortall into Tusaine, then into Sarain on a quest for the Dominion Jewel. The technology and social development of the time in this story is similar to our own middle ages. Here, magic is real, and is a big part of society.

Weather follows normal patterns based on location and time of year for the most part, however, in some cases, gods and magic do effect the climate. Chitral creates great blizzards in his mountains to deter Alanna, and Roger uses magic to create earth shaking earthquakes. Even the kings who have the Dominion Jewel use its power to control the weather and harvest to a lesser degree.

There are many gods and goddesses in this world, many of whom take an active role in the day to day functions of human life. The Goddess Mother often appears to Alanna to give her guidance. The ancient being Chitral, who Alanna must face in order to gain access to the Dominion Jewel, itself a powerful and intelligent magical object, claims to be far older than the gods. He calls himself an elemental instead, saying that the gods of their realm are but children compared to him and his kind.

#### Language and Meaning

The language of this novel is relaxed and informal for the most part. In only a few places is the language stiff and formal. When it is, it is generally only between nobles, and often time overly formal to show sarcasm. In contrast, with Coram and many of the lowborn, the language is quite base, and contains a great deal of contractions and slang.



Most of this story is told through very vivid descriptions about the world as seen through the eyes whichever character is acting as focus for the narrator. Most of the world building and action take are delivered through exposition, while the dialogue shows most of the emotional aspects of character relationships.

#### **Structure**

This novel is made up of eight, long chapters, and one, rather short epilogue. The book spans three hundred and eighty - four pages and about a year of story time. The chapters are numbered. They are also named for some event or place that occur in the chapter. These long chapters do tend to slow the pace a bit, but the easy language and smooth flow of action, along with the suspenseful viewpoint changes, do help to pick it back up a bit.

The obvious plot of this story is Alanna's quest for the Dominion Jewel. In this respect, the story actually starts slightly before, and ends slightly after Alanna's quest. The story begins with Alanna roaming about, fairly well lost about what to do. She has a map, but doesn't know what it says. After discovering the map's secret to be the location of the Dominion Jewel, Alanna decides to go on a quest to get it, and the majority of the remaining story follows this. After she has found the jewel and returned home, the story does not end, however. Rather, it continues on past Jonathan's coronation and a failed rebellion, finally ending several weeks later. Another plot that would better use the full course of this book is that of Alanna's own personal development and grown, or that of her love life. Alanna begins this book as a newly proven knight, with at least two men that she is in love with. Soon after the beginning, add another man. The story follows mostly Alanna, showing how she grows and changes over the year and through her many great adventures. At the end, Alanna is a world-famous hero, the Champion of the King, and in love with only George, who she will soon marry.

Throughout the story, Alanna's view of life goes through some very profound changes. What does she believe about marriage and her life in the beginning of the story? What does she feel about it at the end?

Discuss the lust for power. Who in this story is driven by a lust for power? Did these characters act on their feelings? What are the results of their actions?

Discuss duty. What part does the sense of duty play in the lives of the characters of this story?

Liam and Alanna both view death in very different ways. How do Liam and Alanna feel about death? How does it affect their relationship?
