The reader also has the opportunity to understands the closeness of Cassia and her family as well as the closeness of Cassia and her friend, Xander. They talk comfortably with each other, support each other, and joke around with each other.

Cassia finds out that she is Matched with her best friend. This is both good and bad. For the most part, it's wonderful. She loves him and thinks he is very handsome. He is happy about the Match, too. Both their families are happy about it. The sadness she feels is due to the fact that she won't experience the unraveling of the mystery of someone new like her comrades will experience over the next few years as they learn more about their Matches.

Cassia lives in a world that has been put together and nurtured to be strong, healthy, and long-living. They do this by making that perfect Matches and by having a rigid set of rules. Cassia looks at the tablets that she keeps in her new compact. One is blue, another is red, and another is green. She doesn't know anybody who knows what the red tablet does. This is foreshadowing that the red tablet might be very important in Cassia's future.

Cassia makes a concentrated effort to become mentally and emotionally stronger.

The youth are able to enjoy the picnic, even though they know they were manipulated into doing work with the ice cream as a reward. As the youth talk in this chapter, Cassia realizes that Xander is recognizing that there are some problems with the Match on her end. They don't really get a chance to talk about it, though. It doesn't ruin the mood for the day, and they talk a lot. Xander's actions remind Cassia of how good and kind he is. He isn't perfect, though. He's willing to break some rules himself. A student tells the Official that another student has fallen, and the Official at the top of the hill tells Ky and Cassia to stay there and keep track of who comes in. This gives them time alone. While they are there, Cassia wants to talk with Ky about the artifact, but she also wants to keep it to herself for a few days. She doesn't want him to realize that he made a mistake giving it to her. When Cassia looks at him, she notices he is doing something strange. When she asks him what he is doing, he says that he is writing. It's an old-fashioned type of script. She asked how he learned to do it since they don't teach it in the schools. He says that it is his secret. He knows her secret, and now she knows his. Cassia asks if he will teach her how to write, and he reminds her that they are not supposed to do it. She asks him. The Official wither their injured companion before he has a chance to answer her. Cassia walks down the hill with Livy, who is improving on her own hiking. The girl is very talkative. Cassia thinks about writing. As they rush to the trains, Cassia hears Kyle whispered a word. He is going to teach her how to write.

Cassia hurries to the top of the hill to talk with Ky. She shows him how she learned how to draw a letter "C" then she asks him to teach her another letter. He teases her, telling her that she could look at the letters on her scribe to learn how to write. She points out that they look different. He says that it's called cursive.

He decides to teach her the letter "A." It's the next letter in her name. He tells her that she is learning her name because if that's all she ever learned, she will have still have something. He asks if there's anything else she wants to learn to write, and he realizes that she wants to be able to write her poems. He asks her to tell him the poems so that two of them know them in their memories. It's risky business, and it will put Ky in danger. She wonders if she can trust him. She tells him one line of the poem, and he hands her something papery. He tells her to get rid of it when she is done looking at it.

After dinner that evening, Cassia realizes that Ky has given her a napkin. At first she's disappointed, then she realizes that there is something written on the napkin. It's a drawing depicting his life before she came to know him.



Cassia's father comes to tell her that there is a message for her on the port. She destroys the napkin and goes to talk to an Official who appears on the port. He tells her that it's time to get together and do something special with her Match. She and Xander will have a special meal the next night, chaperoned by an Official. After the call, Xander comes by to visit, and it feels really good to be with him. It's a different kind of good than being with Ky. She feels that she knows Xander too well to be matched with him.

After Xander leaves, Ky comes home from work. He hands Cassia a brown paper envelope. She starts to tell him that she has his artifact, and he tells her that he knows. He smiles. When she goes to return it, he tells her that she can keep it for a while more.

Cassia can't wait to get to the top of the hill and talk with Ky. She wants to hear more of his story. When she gets to the top, she discovers that Livy has beaten her there. The girl is talking with Ky, and he is laughing at something she says. Cassia notices that she is drawing something with a stick, and she wonders if Ky is teaching her how to write. She turns away. When they get down the hill, the Official tells them they will be doing something different the next day. Ky states that is is good since he was beginning to feel like Sisyphus. Ky asks her if she has anything to tell him, wanting to hear more of the poem. She is out of sorts after seeing him with Livy so she doesn't share it.

Cassia goes out to dinner with Xander. It's odd because the two of them can't be alone. They have the same food they always eat, just in a new location. As they go out, she remembers a time when she was younger. Her mother had a flower in her hair. Since it wasn't legal to pick flowers, she realized that her father must have bent the rules for someone he loved. As they are eating, Cassia realizes that her portions seem to be smaller than they have been in the past.

They talk over dinner, and Cassia asks Xander why he didn't kiss her the other night. He said there were too many people around. They talk about all the Officials on their street recently. Cassia finds herself thinking about Ky and who really should have been her Match.

When Ky and Cassia get home from their special dinner out, they see another air car in front of Em's house. Officials come out of her house holding something, and they look sad. Cassia finds out that the Officials are collecting all the artifacts. They are going house to house collecting them. Cassia realizes that she still has Ky's artifact, and she has to make sure that it's safe. Xander offers to help hide her artifact.

She tries to help calm her brother who is very upset that he has to give up Grandfather's watch. She finds out that her father had to go out and collect other people's artifacts. Officials can't collect from their own family members. When the Officials come to take the artifacts away, they say it's because the Government decided that artifacts promote inequality in Society members. They say they will put the artifacts in a museum so people can still see them.



Cassia is very angry about what's happening. In her anger, she almost destroys the paper Ky gave her, and she discovers that it's more of Ky's story. The Officials didn't take it away. She loves the fact that she is holding a piece of him.

The next morning, everyone is quiet on the air train. Xander whispers to Cassia, telling her where he hid the artifact. It's in the garden in front of Ky's house. Cassia wonders if he knows that it belongs to Ky, and she also wonders if he realizes that she has feelings for Ky.

At hiking that day, the youth are split into pairs. They are matched according to their ability. Cassia is paired with Ky. They are told that they have to put markers on branches near fallen trees and other rough areas.

As they go off alone, Ky and Cassia have the opportunity to talk about the night before. She tells him that the artifact is safe. He was very worried about her, not the artifact. She also tells him that Xander helped hide it. Cassia asks Ky if he had been teaching Livy how to write the date before. He told her that Livy had seen them and wanted to know what they were doing. He told her that they were drawing. Cassia apologizes for being so standoffish the day before, and Ky tells her that he likes seeing her jealous sometimes. Cassia shares some more lines of poetry with Ky, and he teaches her more writing.

Em feels horrible about the entire situation with the compact. Cassia reassures her. As they get close to home, Cassia sees that her mother is back from her trip. The two talk about the artifacts being taken away. She and her mother have a rare opportunity to have a nice meal together since Papa and Bram are out of the house. Her mother talks a bit about her trip, but there is some confidential information that she is not allowed to share. As she prepares to go to the game center with her friends after dinner, Cassia looks at the picture Ky drew. She realizes that he saw his parents die.

At the Game Center, Xander challenges Ky to a game. They decide to play a game of chance, which is very unusual for Xander. They are evenly matched no matter what game they play. Xander tells Cassia that he has noticed that Ky tends to throw games. Ky doesn't want to stand out.

On Sunday, Cassia is at work and she's having a hard time concentrating. She keeps thinking about Ky and his family and how he witnessed his parents' deaths. Nora tells her to report to the supervisor's station. Officials are there to talk with her, telling her that she scored very well on the test.

That afternoon, Cassia's mother finds out that she has to go on another trip. Cassia notices that her mother is missing a green tablet. She realizes her mother is dealing with some difficult situations.

On Monday, Cassia has a chance to talk with Ky as they walk through the trees together. She expresses her sorrow over his parents' deaths. He tells her the story of Sisyphus. She asks him why he throws games, and he says that he has to, and she



knows it's because he isn't a regular part of Society. Cassia has the realization that she is in love with Ky.

She has already learned how to write her own name, and now Ky is teaching her the letters of his name. They talk about the fact that he is an Aberration and can never be Matched. She asks him what type of person he thinks he would be Matched with if he were Matched, and he says that it would be somebody like her.

Chapters 15-21 Analysis

Cassia has a connection to nature throughout this novel. She feels best when she is out in the fresh air, climbing on the hill and looking at the trees. She and Ky find the opportunity to learn more about each other when they are out in in the wild. This is symbolic of their nature, which is fresh and wild. The sun comes out and brightens her mood in Chapter 15. The reader is reminded of how controlling and regimented Society is when a forbidden activity is writing in cursive - something readers will most likely take for granted, perhaps even resent in their own lives. It offers perspective on the freedoms the reader has.

Throughout history, there is an importance in a person's name. Ky teaches Cassia how to write her name so that even if everything else is taken from her, at least she will have that. In a way, he's telling her that she will always have her mind an d her own identity, and no-one can take that from her.

On the hill, they share more of the poem. This shows they are willing to take risks for each other as well as for themselves. Once again, the author uses something readers take for granted, and might even resent. It offers value to poetry and the power of words. In this chapter, Cassia is coming to terms with the value of a person as well as words. She realizes people come alive in words and even though a person is gone and physical proof of them is gone, as long as the words are alive in the mind, the person still lives on.

Once life was easy and acceptable to Cassia, but her grandfather encouraged her to open her eyes, and now she sees limitations everywhere. She points this out to Xander as they are allowed to go out together, yet they are not alone.

This chapter focuses on a shift in the relationship between Ky and Cassia. She knows that she enjoys being with him, but when she sees him with Livy, it really affects her. She is jealous to a point where she won't share more of her poetry with Ky. She is still annoyed with him when she leaves for her time with Xander. She thinks about relationships and risks. Her father takes risks for her mother and the rest of the family. As she thinks about relationships, Cassia realizes that the more she tries to understand Ky, the more she learns about herself.

The officials rifling through everyone's house looking for artifacts only serves to enhance the atrocities Cassie has begun to discover about her world. It even pulls out the worst in her as she begins to verbally snap at her brother instead of supporting him. The



situation is difficult on everyone, even the officials who are in charge of the task. However, nobody revolts or rises up against Society. The people don't agree, yet they take the intrusion in stride.

In this chapter, the reader discovers that Xander is willing to break the rules and take some risks for Cassia. He comes up with a plan to help hide her artifact that she is trying to protect. She takes the opportunity to protect Ky's artifact rather than her own.

Chapter 19 - The next morning, nobody talks about what happened the night before. The removal of artifacts was a hard hit, but nobody argues against it. Xander tells Cassia where he hid the artifact, and it makes her wonder if he knew all along that it belonged to Ky, not her. They don't discuss it.

When Cassia arrives at Activities, she discovers that they are going to be paired off. This gives her an opportunity to become even closer to Ky. She learns about a society that is different from her own. It's the one he was familiar with before he moved to her world. She and Ky are connecting mentally and verbally, and she is very tempted to connect with him physically. Still, she holds herself back from touching him.

Cassia thinks about growing up with her friends. They are taking different paths, but there are still many similarities that intertwine them. She thinks about her own past and her family's past. She and her mother are able to talk with each other, and her mother is able to help her without Cassia ever fully divulging the situation she finds herself in. The scene with her mother lies in stark contrast to what Ky experiences with his parents as he witnesses their deaths.

At the Activity Center, Xander challenges Ky to a game. This is unusual and might be a hint that Xander is challenging Xander to more than a game. He might really know about the connection between Ky and Cassia. He notices that Ky always throws games. Ky always does his best to stand back and observe others. He is careful to avoid standing out either as a failure or as one who excels.

Cassia is getting ready for the next stages of her life. She is taking the tests to see what job she should have, and she is excelling. Meanwhile, at home, her mother is dealing with some very stressful situations. She doesn't share them with the family, however. Cassia appreciates the fact that her mom protects them, and she knows the two of them are alike in the way they keep secrets.

Ky tells Cassia the story of Sisyphus. The reader knows that this will be pivotal at some point in the story. Ky makes it obvious that he relates to the story. The mood of the chapter shifts from serious to light-hearted, and Ky shows Cassia a more serious connection between them. Her name is now in her head so he teaches her his name. He confesses that he is an Aberration. She doesn't care.



Chapters 22-28

Chapters 22-28 Summary

Cassia is in her Language and Literacy class when a message comes across the port calling her to leave with an Official who will escort her out soon. She is told that she has committed an Infraction. This rarely happens, especially in public. Cassia wonders which Infraction she has committed. The Official is the same one who talked with her after the Match card showed Ky's image. She tells Cassia that Cassia did a wonderful job on her sorting test, and that she has the highest score of the year. She could get almost any job she wanted. Unfortunately the Official might have to tell the work centers that Cassia is unfit for sorting-related work due to her choices in personal relationships.

As the Official warns her about her relationships, Cassia mentions that Ky is just a friend that she hikes with. The Official says that feelings towards people who are different from a Match are common, but in this case, it's unacceptable since Ky is an Aberration. She knows it's more than a friendship. She warns Cassia that if the relationship continues, Ky can be sent back to the Outer Provinces. Cassia asks her what Infraction she has committed, and the Official says that was an error. She hasn't committed an Infraction.

When Cassia gets home that day, she discovers that a package has arrived. It's a piece of her dress from the Match Banquet. She realizes the Society is good at offering pieces of life, and not the whole thing. Cassia looks at the latest image Ky has given her. It's in color this time. She recognizes her Official in the drawing.

Cassia wakes up to the sound of loud shrieking. She hurries to find her brother. Everyone is gone from their beds. She finds her family outside in their sleepclothes. This hasn't happened since Ky's father wandered outside in his sleepclothes after his son died. The Society decided that the maple trees in the neighborhood are a problem so they are cutting them down. Cassia's mom says it's a warning, and her father thinks it's his fault while Cassia is thinking it's her fault. Her mom clarifies that it's a warning for her.

During hiking, Cassia talks with Ky and tells him about the Official's visit. She says the Official knows about them. Ky hands her a poem he got for her. She is close to crying so he reads it to her at her request. It's beautiful, and she feels herself wrapped in the poetry. Ky kisses her on the cheek.

Cassia is filled with hope, and she lets herself imagine a future with him even though she knows it will never happen. She dreams of a relationship with him where they are free to go out together and enjoy their artifacts together.

The next day, on the hike, Ky talks with her about the Prisoner's Dilemma. The only way to stay safe is if neither prisoner betrays the other one. They get as close to each other



as they can, but they know they cannot kiss each other except for on the cheeks. Once they truly kiss, they have committed an Infraction.

One Saturday night, Cassia is in the showing theater with Ky and Xander. She is holding Xander's hand when her Official comes by. She gives a small smile of approval. Cassia feels guilty about her relationship with Xander, but she doesn't want to give up anything that she has with Ky.

Ky asks her about her memories sometimes, and she remembers the first day that Bram went to school. He didn't want to go and was having a fit until she calmed him down and got him on the train before her family got into trouble. She told Bram that there were games on the scribe, and she would show him the games if he went to school. Because she loved her brother, she created the games.

Ky tells Cassia that Bram's first day of school was the first day he really noticed her. He asks when she noticed him. She wants to say that it was when she saw his face on the screen after the Match Banquet, but she doesn't think that's the right thing to say so she tells him that she first really noticed him on top of the first hill. That night, she realizes that she forgot to ask Ky more about his story. She wants to know what happened to him when he was taken away.

One day when they are hiking, Ky tells Cassia how to obtain illegal items such as the poem he gave her for her birthday. There are Archivists at the Museum who save information, and they're willing to part with the items if the prices high enough. Ky and Cassia talk about singing, and Ky points out that the voices they hear in their hundred songs are manufactured voices. He tells her that he has heard real singing in his life, and it is nothing to compare to it even though it doesn't sound as perfect as what they hear in their own music there in Society. The two bury her birthday poem so they don't get in trouble.

Ky asks Cassia about her Match Banquet. He wants to know how she felt and what she thought about. She tells him that she thought about angels. The next day, Cassia asks him why he was crying at the showing. He tells her that the images on the screen were real. It could have been his own village. Cassia asks him to close his eyes, and she writes "I love you" on the ground. She tells him he doesn't have to write it back, and he tells her he doesn't want to. He verbally tells her the same words. They almost kiss, but the whistle blows and saves them.

When they get down to the bottom of the hill they see some Officials. Cassia recognizes one from her sorting test. The Official is there to take her to the on-site portion of her sorting test. Cassia is taken to the place where Ky works. She knows he worked in a tough setting, but she never realized how bad it was. It's a very harsh environment. At first Cassia thinks that it's her job to sort through this situation and determine what could be more efficient. She is told that that is not her job. She is supposed to sort the better workers from the other workers. The better workers will be will be relocated. Some might even have to leave the city. She does the sorting, and she knows she has done a good job. There is a worker who is right in the middle. She realizes that it is Ky. This



makes the decision very difficult. If he goes into the higher group, she won't know what will become of him. If he stays in the lower group, he will die early. She makes her decision, putting him into the higher group.

When they are on the hill the next day, she asks Ky more about where he came from. He tells her about the red and orange colors in his homeland there that are so different from the browns and blues and greens where they live now.

Cassia moves so fast on her exercise machine that she wipes out. She quickly gets up before any Officials notice. She gets a call from an Official regarding her sorting job. She is told she did a wonderful job, and they ask if she wants to make any changes. She doesn't.

Later, Cassia talks with her mother about Matches and love. Cassia doesn't tell her about Ky, but her mother knows something isn't right. They speak about her trip. People are growing forbidden crops, and she had to write them up. Cassia wishes everything would go back to normal.

Ky notices things are changing, and warns Cassia they are running out of time. He tells her he knew his data was interfered with, and he knows Cassia is his match. She goes off and decides to tell Xander everything. He is very hurt.

Cassia thinks about taking the green pill for some calming. At hiking, they are told that the summer Activities are shortened this year, so they will stop after that day. Ky and Cassia decide to break rank and go all the way to the top. Ky tells her that he knows about the sorting, and he is part of the group that isn't staying. At the top of the hill he hands her is artifact, telling her that Xander will teach her to use it to find him if he leaves. He gives her a paper with the last part of his story, and they kiss.

Chapters 22-28 Analysis

Chapter 22 - The Official that works with Cassia tries to wake her up the ramifications of her actions. She knows about the girl's relationship with Ky and warns her off. She tries to get Cassia to realize how crazy the world would get if everyone could make their own choices, without rules. This is exactly what Cassia's grandfather wanted her to open her eyes to. There are few things she can do to really take control of her own life, but staying true to Ky is something she will definitely cling to.

Chapter 23 - Things are not going smoothly in Cassia's life. She is on edge, knowing that she is defying the rules of Society. When she wakes up to shrieking, her immediate concern is for her family. The entire neighborhood is discombobulated. Society is taking away another piece of beauty. First the Officials took their artifacts, and now they are taking the very trees their street is named after. Trauma is linked to Ky's family as it's pointed out that the last time someone was seen outside in their sleepclothes before this occasion was when Ky's adoptive father was running around after his son died. It comes to light that Cassia isn't the only one rebelling against Society. Her mom and dad both take this situation as a warning to them based on their own actions.



Later, Ky gives Cassia a gift. He tells her how to obtain illegal information. There is a crescendo of tension building in the book so the reader knows this information will most likely become pivotal to the story. Nature once again adds serenity to a tense situation.

Chapter 24 - In a dark world, Ky's gifts offer Cassia hope. Still, she doesn't feel free enough with him to be completely honest with him. Just as she holds things back from Xander, she holds the truth of when she really noticed Ky back from him when he asks. He tells her when he first noticed her, and it's a scenario which shows her caring and creativity - a creativity she personally thinks she lacks.

Chapter 25 - Cassia compares her time with Ky to a part of nature - a storm. It suits her and her family's history to compare their lives with nature. Ky tells her how to get a hold of illegal items. The value put on different objects is interesting. Cassia holds her poetry in such high regard, she doesn't think she could ever part with it. They talk about their attraction to each other, and Cassia finds she can't tell Ky the truth about her seeing his face on the screen. This shows that even though their connection is strong, she's still holding back. Cassia's eyes are opened to the harsh realities outside her immediate world as she talks with Ky about the screening.

Chapter 26 - In Chapter 26, Cassia is faced with a challenge greater than any challenge she has face in her life. She must sort the workers in Ky's work area. Not only does she have to block out the horrors of the actual workplace, and the mental horror as she learns of poisoning, but she has to make decisions on who is going to have the opportunity to leave the place although their destination is unknown. When Cassia finds out that everyone lied to her, she isn't as willing to trust their love. She feels as if she is a pawn in a game. She comes clean with the story to Xander, who feels betrayed, rejecting her.

Chapter 28 - Even when everything is falling apart, Cassia still resists all urges to take a drug to calm herself down. On the last hike, she apologizes to Ky for doubting their love. The two break the rules together first by climbing to the top of the hill so they no longer



feel like Sisyphus, then by truly kissing. Ky gives Cassia his artifact, showing that he knows his own future even if she does not. It will help her find him. For one brief moment, their world is perfect.



Chapters 29-32

Chapters 29-32 Summary

In the morning, Cassia wakes up to the sounds of screaming. This time it really is human screaming. Ky is being taken away, sent as a soldier to the Outer Banks. His family knows it's a death sentence. The Officials come in and tell everyone to take their red tablets. Cassia destroys hers, and her Official knows it, but doesn't address the issue.

Chapters 29-32 Analysis

The shrieking in Chapter 29 is jarring after the perfect moment in which Chapter 28 ended. The shrieking of the trees going down earlier in the book was a foreshadowing of the shrieking of human agony depicted in this chapter as Ky is taken away. Cassia's love is taken away, and her world is falling apart, but she still won't resort to taking the tablets. She's rather live with the harshness of reality than with the utopian ignorance Society chooses for its people. The guilt she feels over her part in Ky's deportation weights heavily on her, even though she knows she tried to help him, and he doesn't blame her.



Both Cassia's and her mother's decisions are turning against them. They tried to be honest and do their best to make life better for those they loved, and their lives changed for the worse. Ky is taken away, and the family is banished.

Cassia tries to discover Ky's whereabouts using the information he offered her on the hill. She realizes she doesn't have to give up items of value, and she can choose her own path to get back to him. Conversations she had with Ky helped prepare her for this situation from Sisyphus to the Prisoner's Dilemma.

The only saving grace in the situation is the support of their friends. Even though Xander is jealous and hurt, he really comes through to support his childhood friend and Match. On the journey to their new land, Cassia's parents offer her their support and understanding even though the situation is extremely difficult for them. The reader discovers this when she is in her final sorting project and has an emotional quandary yet lets practicality override emotions. Cassia is pretty, and she isn't like many others. She is the only girl at the Matching Banquet to choose the green gown. She is uncommonly close to her grandfather, and she listens when he encourages her to think outside the box. She wants to be more creative, yet she doesn't seem to realize she is already creative. This is shown when she comes up with games for her brother. Cassia doesn't want Society to dictate her life even if living outside of Society causes her pain. She falls in love with an Anomaly, and she is willing to risk things and break rules for those she loves.

Ky

Ky is a hardworking teenager who hasn't had it easy in life. He lived in the Outer Region with his family until his parents were killed. Due to unusual events Society allowed him to be adopted and raised by his aunt and uncle, even though he was an Anomaly. Since he had this status, he was given horrible work to do and he wasn't treated like other youth his age. He didn't get to go to banquets or get a Match. Ky is athletic, and he loves words and poetry. He cares about other people, respecting them even when they turn against him. Not wanting to stand out, Ky tries to perform in the middle in all that he does, even though he is smart and has the ability to excel. Ky falls in love with Cassia, and he is willing to take risks for her. He shares information about the underground with her, and he understands when she inadvertently sends him to his own possible death with her sorting.

Xander

This is Cassia's best friend. She is Matched to him at the banquet.

Grandfather

This old man is unusually close to his family. He gives Cassia an old handwritten note before his death.



Bram

This is Cassia's younger brother. He is very close to her, and she tries to protect him.

Father

This character helps restore old neighborhoods, turning them into new Boroughs. He is interested in history and historical gadgets. He is close to Cassia, although she is upset at him for a while.

Molly

This character is Cassia's mother. She works in the arboretum and has to make a tough decision that will affect other lives. She has a close relationship with Cassia.

Norah

This individual is Cassia's boss at her sorting job. She is not very friendly.

Em

This character is a good friend of Cassia. She is prone to panic attacks, and Cassia shows her friendship by letting the girl use her compact for her Match Banquet. As she hikes through the woods she realizes that Ky didn't give her the compact back. This is a strange, new artifact.

Lon

This character is a student in the hiking class who is always getting in trouble for speaking out of turn. Ky admires this.

Livy

This character is a student in the hiking class who talks non-stop and climbs almost as fast as Ky and Cassia.

Tennyson

This is the poet Cassia reads and connects with. Even though his poetry is outlawed, it reaches her soul.



Patrick

This is Ky's adoptive father. He was found wandering the streets in his sleepclothes after his son died.

Aida

This is Ky's adoptive mother. She is wailing the morning that they take Ky away.



Objects/Places

Compact

This is what Cassia receives on her birthday from her grandfather.

City Hall

This is where Cassia and Xander go for the banquet where they find out who their Matches are.

Mapletree Borough

This is where Cassia lives. It is known for being tight-knit and exemplary neighborhood.

Artifact

These are approved materials that hold special meaning to members in the Society. Each individual is allowed to have one until they are taken away by Officials.

Maple Trees

These are what are taken away because the Government decided they were a problem.

Green Tablet

These were taken to help calm people down. They were each allowed one per week.

Blue Tablet

This acts as a nutritional supplement.

Red Tablet

This erases the memories of most people who take it. Ky and Xander don't feel the effects of it.



The Hill

This is where Ky and Cassia are partnered during their Activity time. They talk a lot during there meetings here.

Watch

This was a gift for Bram from his grandfather. It is taken away from him and he is devastated.

Cottonwood Seed

This is what floats in the air at the beginning of the story. Cassia associates it with beauty and freedom.

Scribe

This is what Cassia used to make games for her brother when he was reluctant to go to school.

Port

This is a communication device used in homes and schools.

Farmlands

This is where Cassia's family is deported to.

Outer Regions

These are the areas around Cassia's world. They are filled with warfare and suffering. Ky is sent off to fight in this area.



Themes

Love

Love is a very important theme in the story. As the story opens, Cassia is on her way to a banquet to find out who her life is going to be linked with. Society determines who the best Match for each individual is and they discover this in the year following their 17th birthday. They get to know their significant other by getting information off microchips and having meetings with their Match before they are truly united.

Conflict arises when Cassia's card shows two different matches. This opens her eyes to the fact that her original Match, her best friend, might not be the only person out there for her. She is torn between the passion and love that she feels for Kai and the love that she has for her best friend, Xander. Her love for Kai is a forbidden love since he is not accepted by Society.

Different types of love are highlighted throughout the novel. Cassia has a deep love for her brother, who she goes out of her way to calm such as on his first day of school. She also has a loving relationship with her parents and grandfather. Her grandfather gives her a special gift, and she loves and respects him enough to begin to see the world in a new light. Her parents show love for her by bending rules for her and supporting her, even though it means she will be leaving them.

Cassia, Grandfather and Kay also show a love for the written word. Ky risks punishment by teaching Cassia how to write in cursive. Grandfather gives her a banned poem as a gift, and she and Ky memorize the beautiful words of the poetry, internalizing the words.

Rules and Regulations in a Society

It can be argued that every place and situation has rules and regulations, but the ones in Cassia's world are extreme. Children come from approved, mandated Matches, everyone has a curfew, each individual has a specified diet, and each person is assigned their work and play. Within these strictures, the individuals are given enough choice to make them feel free, even if they are not free in reality. For example, each youth has to do an Activity, but they have choices regarding what Activity they want to do. Cassia and Ky choose to hike for their Activity. Once this choice is made, they have to follow the rules and guidelines for the Activity. The only time the two ever reach the top of the hill is when they break the rules and make a run for it.

Cassia always felt comfortable with the rules, blindly accepting them until her grandfather encouraged to really look at things. She began to see how the rules were unfair and harsh. Not only that, but they didn't work. Even with all the regulations, Society around her is breaking down. The individuals in her world have lost beauty along with freedom. They don't know what real music is, they don't know the power of words, and they can't express themselves in color and art.



Sacrifice for Family and Friends

Just as love is a main theme in this novel, so is self-sacrifice. In the world run by rules, individuals show love and compassion for each other by breaking the rules. If they are caught, they are labeled by Society. Ky was labeled because of his father's actions, yet the label meant that he had a horrible job and couldn't participate in "normal" Society activities such as receiving a Match.

Cassia and her family and friends bent and broke the rules for each other, putting themselves at risk many times. They also went out of their way to cover up for each other. When Em has her panic attack, Xander slips her his green tablet, even though he knows he can get into trouble. He does this as a sign of friendship. Ky risks getting caught when he teaches Cassia how to write. He also gets her an illegal poem for her birthday. Cassia's father picks flowers illegally for his wife, and he also destroys Grandfather's samples at Grandfather's request. Cassia teaches Ky a poem and she also hides his artifact for him.

Arguably the best example of self-sacrifice in the book, Xander hands Cassia a bag of blue tablets for her journey. This is significant because he is putting himself at risk by helping her even when he feels hurt and betrayed by her love for Ky. The bond of friendship and the special love between them is enough for him to steal the tablets for her even though she doesn't ask for them.



Style

Point of View

"Matched" is a story about Cassia. It is written by the author, Ally Condie, who is a retired English teacher and a mother of three sons. The novel is written as a first-person narrative, which helps the reader delve into Cassia's mind and her innermost feelings. As a youth on the cusp of the adult world, Cassia's thoughts and feelings about the future are highly relatable. The world she lives in is different enough from our own to be intriguing, yet similar enough to ours that the reader realizes the book is a true political statement.

The first-person narrative allows the reader to step into Cassia's shoes while the reader remains omniscient. The reader understands actions and repercussions for the actions so there is a real connection as the reader watches Cassie go through her thought processes - as she tries to come to terms with her life and her love.

The author highlights both Kathy's dialogue and her own thoughts so the reader can clearly see the process behind your decisions. The reader also this to see how others react to the decisions that she has made such as when Ky faces the life path he must follow based on her decisions and sorting. Because it's first-person, the reader feels truly connected to Cassia, and by the end of the book it feels as if Cassia's journey is just beginning, which is good since the book has a sequel. The reader will most likely want to see where Cassia's decision lead.

Setting

The setting for "Matched" is very similar to our own world as we know it. It's also different enough to be considered fantasy. We have our own government, and Cathy's world has Society. We have rules and regulations, and she has rules and regulations to the extreme. We have cars and trains, and she has air trains. We have iPads, and she has a Scribe. We have Skype, and she has a Port.

Cassia lives in a Utopia that seems all shiny and happy at first glance, yet cracks and ugliness begin to show as the novel progresses. It's a world with no poetry and with synthetic music. Nature is around, but carefully controlled. Food is practical rather than savory. The people in her world are given just enough freedom to make them think they are happy and free, yet they still have to bow to Society's dictates. When unpleasant things occur, they are synthetically altered to forget the atrocities Society place upon them.

There are other places on the fringe of Cassia's world. They are called the Outer Provinces. These wild regions are filled with fire and poison and warfare. When Cassia first sees them in a showing, she thinks they are fictionalized. Ky grew up in the Outer



Provinces and told her they were real. The darkness of this area threatens to encroach on Cassia's world, and she is ready to go through the harshness to find her love.

Language and Meaning

The author weaves old ideas and new ideas together in this futuristic story. She brings literature to light, showing her passion for words. This is fitting since she is a retired English teacher. Her dialogue and word choices are standard for a teen and she uses words that will become outdated. She also avoids any type of swearing that could offend readers.

Poetry is cherished in the novel, and the author uses poetry from Tennyson to demonstrate the power of words and to show how words can stand the test of time and keep a person alive. She uses the poetry to demonstrate how one can use words to stand up against unfair treatment. The futuristic language and ideas are easily understandable since they are spinoffs of our own materials, words, and scientific knowledge.

Structure

"Matched" by Ally Condie has 32 chapters. It's a straightforward book with the typical cover, title page, copyright page, and dedication before the chapters begin. Each chapter is labeled with a number instead of a title. The chapters range in length from under 5 pages to under 15 pages. The book closes with acknowledgments and a brief blurb about the author.
