Chapters 1 and 2 Analysis

Chapters 11 and 12 Analysis

Seth ends up breaking up with Katie when he finds out that she has been hiding the fact that Tommy Sullivan is back in town. Seth is Katie's escort for the pageant, but after they break up, he ends up dating one of the other contestants, Jenna Hicks.

Liam Ellison

Liam Ellison is Katie's younger brother. He is in between eight and ninth grade over the summer when the novel unfolds. He is working out all summer because he plans to try out for the Quahogs football team before school starts.

It is Liam that tells Katie that Tommy Sullivan is back in town. Since he has been working out, girls Liam's age seem to be following him everywhere and calling the house constantly for him. When Liam makes the team, he and Katie get into a fight when Liam finds out she has been talking to Tommy after what he did to the team four years earlier.

Eric Fluteley

Eric Fluteley is a member of the high school football team. Eric is also the boy Katie is cheating with behind Seth's back. While Katie is kissing Eric, Tommy catches them. Tommy uses this information to tease Katie and put her on edge about him trying to ruin Katie's life.

Katie ends up breaking it off with Eric. Eric ends up escorting Morgan Castle in the pageant. After Katie breaks up with him, Eric also ends up dating Morgan.

Tommy Sullivan

Tommy Sullivan is a boy that left town in eight grade and has now returned over the summer before the senior year of high school. He left town because he exposed the football team members that were involved in a SAT cheating scandal.

When Tommy returns to Eastport, most of the people do not recognize him. He's much taller and more buff than he was when he left town. Tommy returns because he lands a job as a columnist for the local paper. Tommy will be covering the sports section for the paper.



Another reason Tommy returns is to find out if he still has feelings for Katie. By the end of the novel, Tommy and Katie admit their feelings for each other.

Morgan Castle

Morgan Castle is another of the contestants in the pageant. She is a relatively quiet girl. Her sponsor for the pageant is the local healthy restaurant in town. Eric Flutely is her escort in the pageant. When Morgan finds out that Tommy Sullivan is back in town, she tries to urge Seth and the other boys to just forget about it and leave Tommy alone. By the end of the novel, Eric and Morgan are dating.

Jenna Hicks

Jenna Hicks is being forced to participate in the pageant by her mother. Jenna normally dresses in all black and she has piercings all over her face and in her ears. Her friends ambush her right before the pageant to give her a makeover, so that she looks completely different. Jenna and Seth realize that they have more in common than they thought. Jenna and Seth start dating after he and Katie break up.

Dave Hollingsworth

Dave Hollingsworth is Sidney's boyfriend and escort in the pageant. He is also the quarterback of the Quahogs football team. Katie refers to Dave as the "smootherover" because he is always trying to make everything right. Sidney ends up mad with Dave at the pageant because he chooses a blue tuxedo that clashes with her red dress. Dave also tells Seth that he can't go after Tommy after the pageant because they have to help the girls celebrate their wins.

Patty

Patty is the manager at the Gull N Gulp. She is also the one that catches Katie kissing Eric by the drink machine. Patty doesn't like gossip so all of the staff tries to be on their best behavior when Patty is working. In the end though, Katie finds out that Patty gossiped about catching Katie kissing a guy that wasn't her boyfriend. Patty also throws a surprise party for Katie before the pageant.



Objects/Places

Gull n Gulp

The Gull N Gulp is a seafood restaurant in Eastport, Connecticut. It is also where Katie works as a waitress. The Gull N Gulp is Katie's sponsor for the Quahog Festival Pageant.

Eastport, Connecticut

Eastport, Connecticut is a small seaside town. It is a relatively small town. The town population swells during the summer months when the tourists come into town. The town is known for its quahogs, which is a type of mussel and is also the name of the high school football team mascot.

The Wall

The Wall refers to the wall on the school gymnasium. Someone spray painted "Tommy Sullivan is a Freak" in dayglo orange on the wall. Katie has a very expensive camera on layaway. She is using the money she makes at the Gull N Gulp to make payments on it. Toward the end of the novel, she only owes \$400 more dollars. After she admits everything at the pageant, the editor of the newspaper and the camera shop owner give Katie the camera and return all of the money she paid toward the camera because they hate Quahogs, too.

Corner Booth

The corner booth in the Gull N Gulp is reserved for VIPs. VIPS in Eastport are the Quahog football players and their guests. After Katie speaks out against the Quahogs at



the pageant, the restaurant decides not to reserve the booth anymore. They starts seating people there on a first come first serve basis.

Newspaper Office

Katie is dropping off photos for the pageant when she sees Tommy meeting with the editor of the paper at the newspaper office. She asks the editor what Tommy was doing there. Later, Katie finds out that Tommy was meeting with the editor because Tommy is going to write the sports column when their senior year starts.

Pageant Tent

The pageant tent is a tent at the festival. It is where Katie and the other pageant contestants gather and get ready to participate in the pageant. It is also where the contestants and their escorts are when they find out that Tommy Sullivan is back in town.

Gull N Gulp Parking Lot

The Gull N Gulp parking lot is behind the Gull N Gulp. This is where Katie sits with Seth in his truck to makeout after her shifts are over. The parking lot is also where Sidney catches Tommy and Katie making out.

Answering Machine

The answering machine at Katie's house is always full of messages from girls for her brother Liam. Tommy also leaves a suggestive message on the machine that tells Liam and Katie's parents that something happened between her and Tommy. This sparks an initial disagreement between Katie and Liam.



Themes

Truth

The primary theme throughout the novel is that of the truth. Katie continuously struggles with telling the whole truth. It is as if Katie cannot help but to lie. At one point, she even thinks about how her brother used to call her "Liar, liar, pants on fire," when they were younger.

Katie chooses to lie in order to protect herself. She also seems to tell lies to protect the feelings of others. For example, she lies about Eric and sneaks around with Eric behind Seth's back. She does this because she doesn't really want to be with Seth, but she also doesn't want to hurt Seth's feelings.

The biggest truth Katie struggles with is the truth, or the lies, she is telling herself. She tries to convince herself throughout the novel that she is who she is pretending to be. In the end, however, the truth comes out. Katie admits her feelings about the Quahogs and about Tommy Sullivan.

Coming of Age

One of the other primary themes that run throughout the novel is growing up and coming of age. Katie struggles with who she is and how she feels on the inside compared to who she is and what other people want her to be on the outside. Katie deals with the consequences in life that comes with telling lies and then having to confess the truth.

Katie also faces the rite of passage of having her first true love. While she has been dating Seth for years, Katie has always known to some extent that she doesn't love him. She was more in love with the thought of Seth. When Tommy Sullivan returns to Eastport, Katie realizes that she has true feelings for him.

Family

Family is another central theme in the novel. This is because the storyline is about the lives of this particular family—the Ellisons. While every family has their trials and tribulations, Katie's family has its own family dynamics that are the same and that are different from those of other families. In the end though, they are a family and they will get through it together, one way or the other.



Style

Point of View

"Pants on Fire" is written in the first person point of view. The narrator of the novel is also the main character of the novel, Katie Ellison. The narrator is telling the story as it unfolds, but she also switches back to some past events in her life to provide the reader with some perspective.

The point of view of this novel is an intimate one that allows a reader to connect closely with the main character, who also happens to be the narrator of the story. The point of view also allows the author to inject her own opinions into the narration and to expand on the events taking place to her, the members of her family and the people of the town without having to move out of character or interrupt the flow of the narration. Language and Meaning

The language of this novel is modern. The language of the novel is not formal and appears to be set in modern times, such as the 21st century. The language is educated, strong and descriptive enough that it creates a flow that leaves the reader impressed with the words as much as the plot when the novel ends.

The language of the novel is appropriate to the plot because it is accurate to the characters in the novel and the education level of the writer.
