Plot Summary

Sapphique is one of the novels in the Incarceron series by author Catherine Fisher. The story follows the characters that are living in two separate worlds - one set of characters in the realm and the other in Incarceron. The characters and the two worlds are separated by a door, which is the portal. Only one of the characters, Jared, knows how to find the portal and how to open it so that the characters can transition from one world to the next.

When the novel opens, the reader is not aware that Attia and Rix are stuck in the world that is known as Incarecon. Incarceron is the world where a prison with the name of Incarceron is in control of everything that happens in that world. Attia is a young owman that is involved with Finn, who is a former prisoner at Incarecron. Somehow, but unbeknownst to the charcetres in the book, Finn was able to escape Incarceron and he now lives in the other world, which is the realm. Finn is the future king as Prince Giles. He is engaged to be married to Claudia, who is also the daughter of the warden of Incarceron, and the future queen.

Back in Incarceron, Attia is traveling with a magician and illusionist, by the name of Rix. Rix claims to possess a magical glove, which was the creation of a famous prisoner of Incarceron, who goes by the name of Sapphique. Attia is trying to find Finn, who disappeared without coming back and Attia doesn't know where he has gone.

Back in the realm, a boy has showed up saying that he is the real Prince Giles. This leads to investigation into both of the proclaimed princes. Claudia continues to try to find the portal to Incaerceron with her tutor Jared because her father is stuck in Incarceron. Eventually, it is determined that Finn is the real Prince Giles. When the portal is opened, the realm turns out to be an illusion, where what everyone sees is not actually how the world is. While Claudia does temporarily reunite with her father in Incarceron, she ends up returning to the realm to rebuild the land with Finn.



Chapter 1

Chapter 1 Summary

Attia is a small young woman. She is making her way through the crowd that is assembled in front of a platform, where a magician, the Enchanter, is hosting a show. The platform is set up in front of the prison. When Attia arrives at the front of the stage, she sees that the Enchanter is wearing the glove of Sapphique and like the character Sapphique, the Enchanter is missing his pointer finger on one of his hands.

The Enchanter chooses three volunteers from the audience. One of the volunteers he chooses is Attia. He predicts Attia is waiting for someone by the name of Finn who has gone away to return. He says that Finn promised to return but that he hasn't. then, he plunges a sword into Attia, to take her to death.

At the end of the chapter, Attia meets the Enchanter backstage and the reader finds outs that the whole show was a set up.

Chapter 1 Analysis

It's ironic that the Enchanter knows things about Attia that she hasn't told him. For example, the story about Finn going away and not returning is true. The other ironic part is that when Attia pretended to die, she actually did see a vision of Finn, so she doesn't know what that means. The chapter also suggests that Sapphique is someone who has special powers, but has dies or gone missing, so nobody knows where he is now or how the Enchanter would have come into possession of his glove.



Chapter 2

Chapter 2 Summary

Chapter 3

Chapter 3 Summary

Attia is talking to the Enchanter. He tries to get her to guess his real name. She overhears some call the Enchanter by his real name so she finds out his name is Rix. Attia starts to wonder if Rix is sane or insane. Attia also wonders if Sapphique's glove is real or just a stage prop. She also thinks about how to get her hands on the glove. Attia tries to convince Rix to teach her his tricks.

Rix says he has a password. When he hears someone speak it one day, he'll know that's his apprentice. When that happens, Rix plans to train his apprentice—teaching him or her all his tricks and passing on his stage props too. Rix tells Attia a story about how he got Sapphique's glove from an old women he ran into when he was in the tunnels of madness at the prison.

Attia confirms that she was a slave. She asks Rix how he knew about her loving Finn and being betrayed by him. Rix tells Attia he read her mind. Attia thinks about how she waited three days in her cell for Finn to return before Attia left. She believes that Claudia must have put a spell on Finn to keep him from returning to Attia.

As the show people are trying to cross into a new town, they come across a gang that guards the road. Rix offers them gold, silver or other forms of payment to get across the road. The man that steps out the darkness is half a man and half a skull—a Winglord. When the Winglord finds the magician's props, the Winglord wants to look at them. Rix begs him to take anything but their props. The Winglord says he's heard about Rix's glove, finds the glove in the prop box and slides it on to his hand.

Chapter 3 Analysis

There is an inference that Attia was once a princess or of higher status, but she fallen into poverty for some reason. It could be because Finn and Attia ran away together, but then Finn was imprisoned and left her to her own devices. Attia and Rix speak of Incarceron, which is the prison, as if it is a living being. They talk about how the building is watching them and seeing them. Attia sees the small red eyes of Incarceron staring down at her. Attia treats Incarceron as if it has a mind, spirit and soul. The Winglord sliding what Attia believes is Sapphique's glove on to his hand could give the Winglord powers because, if the glove is really Sapphique's, it possesses special powers that standard humans do not possess. If the power gets into the wrong hands, then it foreshadows problems for the rest of the world.



Chapter 4

Chapter 4 Summary

Claudia burst into Jared's room, who is her tutor. She finds the room empty, but finds a letter for Jared on the Queen's letterhead. The letter mentions Jared's work in trying to open the portal. When Claudia finds Jared, Jared is picking up hundreds of blue feathers off the floor in one of the rooms in the Queen's home.

In Claudia's head, she confirms that the portal is the way into Incarceron. She also thinks how her father is the only one that knows the secrets of Incarceron, but those secrets died with her father. Jared confirms to Claudia that he was experimenting with the portal when he ended up turning a feather into the multiple feathers that are flittering around the room. Claudia insinuates in her conversation with Jared that Incarceron is run by some sort of machine, which must be part of the portal. Claudia says she's going to learn her father's ways so she can run Incarceron.

Jared says the Queen has sent for him to meet with her. Claudia says he must meet with her so they can know what the Queen is up to. Jared leaves to meet with the Queen. Claudia goes into the room of the castle where the noble birds are kept. A man's voice comes out of the shadows. When he steps out, Claudia sees it's her father's secretary. Claudia sees a steel wolf, which she seems to know what it represents but doesn't yet share the meaning with the reader.

Chapter 4 Analysis

The Queen's mention of the portal suggests it is some kind of door that allows for time travel. It foreshadows the revealing that Finn came through the portal, which is why he doesn't remember his former life. It infers that the portal in fact duplicated Finn into Prince Giles. It seems as if Claudia intentionally brought Finn through the portal so she would not have to marry Caspar.

Claudia says Jared is one of her oldest friends. It seems as if she might love him, however, with the way she looks at him and the fact that she confides everything in Jared.



Chapter 5 Summary

As the Winglord stretches his fingers into the glove, Attia realizes that Rix wanted the Winglord to pull on the glove. Suddenly, the Winglord starts yelling that the glove is burning his hand and he begs for Rix to get it off. The glove seems to have a mind of its own as it forces the Winglord to paint Attia's name. Suddenly, the stars open in the sky and it starts raining blue feathers—identical feathers. Rix says the prison is doing it.

Rix confirms that the glove is not Sapphique's glove. Rix says he put acid in the glove, but the only reason the Winglord couldn't take the glove off is because Rix used magic so that he couldn't. Rix denies knowing anything about writing Attia's name.

Rix leaves Attia behind, so that nobody in the new village sees her with them. Rix tells her that he'll see at the act tonight. Walls of ice start to grow higher on either side of Attia as she walks further into the village. Attia thinks about how only Sapphique and Finn have ever been able to escape Incarceron.

Attia comes across an old woman knitting. The woman confiscates Attia's weapons. The old woman tells Attia where she can get a room. Attia turns to ask the woman if she gets her knife back when she leaves, but the woman is gone and only the knitting needles are clacking in the air with a trail of blood coming from them. Attia hears the old woman's voice tell her that no one leaves.

Chapter 5 Analysis

The feathers raining down on Attia are the same feathers that Hared created with the portal. It seems as if Attia is on one side of the portal and Claudia is on the other side of the portal. The two worlds, however, are crossing over each other. It seems as if Attia might have some powers of her own, but Attia believes it is Finn's way of trying to speak to her. Ironically, the Winglord is illiterate, so he couldn't write Attia's name with paint without some kind of force writing the name for him.



Chapter 6 Summary

The secretary tells Claudia that he is a member of the clan of the steel wolves. He tells Claudia that they want to find the warden, just like Claudia does. He tells Claudia that he has information that the Queen intends to install a new warden of Incarceron and it won't be Claudia. The secretary tells Claudia that he is not her father's daughter.

As Finn's world starts to grow black, the cobblestones turn into a forest as he passes out.

Jared enters the royal apartment to see the Queen. When the Queen enters, she asks about Jared's progress. Jared says the portal is badly damaged and doesn't think it can be repaired. He's lying. Jared does tell the Queen about replicating the feather.

The Queen tells Jared that the portal must be thought to be impossible and that Claudia shouldn't know.

Chapter 6 Analysis

It's ironic that Claudia won't be her father's predecessor. Claudia thinks that the clan of the wolves is plotting against Finn because he is in line for the thrown. The eagle screeching is a warning that someone is coming so that nobody sees Claudia speaking to her father's secretary. Finn's blackouts are some type of coping mechanism, but could be a seizure or side effect from coming through the portal. Apparently the portal is the door into and out of Incarceron. While Jared seems to control what happens on his side of the portal, he doesn't know if it is causing a reaction on the other side of the portal, such as the raining of blue feathers on to Attia. The Queen hints that Jared has some kind of condition that will eventually kill him. She also suggests that Jared go and stay at the academy, insinuating that he shouldn't return or something might happen to him to kill him faster.



Chapter 7

Chapter 7 Summary

That night at the show, Attia notices a difference in the audience members. The members of the audience seem to be young and kids. There don't seem to be any old people. The crowd doesn't huddle together. When a woman faints in the crowd, the rest step away from her rather than to see if she is okay. The audience members also seem to be unaffected by Rix's act.

Rix prepares to take Attia to the door of death and bring her back, which is all part of their fake act. Nobody in the audience is applauding.

A slave owner approaches the stage and throws a slave on the stage for Rix to bring back. The slave owner slits the throat of the slave so Rix can bring him back and prove that Sapphique's glove really works. Rix threatens revenge on Attia.

Chapter 7 Analysis

Rix's warning that they might have to leave quickly indicates that he expects an adverse reaction from this particular audience. People believe Sapphique's glove hold special powers that can bring people back from the dead. Rix will curse Attia and come up in the future to make her life difficult, especially in her journey to find Finn.



Chapter 8 Summary

Finn is awakened by a voice that he thinks is his brother, Keiro. It's Jared, however, with Claudia. Claudia dismisses the servants. Jared confirms that Finn had a seizure and then Claudia had Finn transported to the room they're in now. The proclamation ceremony is in an hour. Jared asks if it's true that the prison is so small that they can't find it. Jared confirms it is true.

Finn says he remembered something. Finn says he is a star seer. Finn isn't sure if what he saw is a real memory or a vision of some sort.

After Finn leaves, Jared says Finn is accustomed to telling lies form being in prison. Claudia thinks it's a memory of Prince Giles. Jared tells Claudia about his meeting with the Queen. Claudia confirms that the Queen won't let her go to the academy. Jared tells Claudia the Queen wants Jared to search for the way in alone, but Claudia thinks it's a plot to get Jared out of the way. Finn comes back dressed for the proclamation ceremony. Claudia and Finn walk to the proclamation ceremony.

Claudia senses that something is wrong and that they have something planned to harm Finn. A boy in the crowd objects. The boy resembles Finn. He proclaims to be the real Giles.

Chapter 8 Analysis

Claudia believes Finn really is Prince Giles. This is because Claudia believes that prince Giles is all of their savior. Jared, however, is not convinced that Finn is indeed Prince Giles and the answer to their needs. As Claudia and Finn walk through the crowds, Claudia thinks the cheers are muted, which indicates that Finn isn't popular enough among the people. This indicates that Finn might in fact not be their savior. It seems as if Finn is walking into his assassination instead of his proclamation.



Chapter 9 Summary

It's Keiro that picked up Attia on the horse and is now riding away with Attia. Keiro tells Attia that she did well and that Finn would be proud of her. Attia remembers how Finn had once saved her life. They ride for hours and then stop under an archway of ice to rest. Attia tells Keiro how a few odd things happened when she was with Rix and how she thinks it was because of the glove. Attia thinks about the single metal fingernail beneath Keiro's glove that indicates he is not entirely human.

Keiro takes out Sapphique's glove to inspect it. Keiro removes his own glove to try Sapphique's glove on. Attia urges Keiro not to try it on, but Keiro says he's been waiting a lifetime to try it on. Before he can put the glove on, they hear a chink of armor in the distance and they hide. Keiro tells Attia to get on the horse.

The boy steps up to Claudia. Finn confronts the boy saying that he is the real Giles. The boy accuses Finn of being an escaped prisoner and imposter. The Queen beckons everyone to have the discussion in private.

Behind closed doors, the boy recounts memories of growing up. Each one in attendance confirms what the boy says is true. The boy says he disappeared to make the Clan of the Steel Wolves believe he was already dead. The boy presents documents to support everything he says. Finally, he shows a tattoo on his wrist of the family crest.

Chapter 9 Analysis

Attia infers that Incarceron created at least some of Keiro, which is why he is not wholly human. Ironically, Finn wants to reunite with his brother because he misses Keiro. Keiro, on the other hand, wants to find Finn to seek revenge for leaving Keiro behind. Keiro and Attia can sense the danger out in the shadows. Keiro seems to know who the monster is that is lurking in the shadows.





Chapter 10 Summary

The chain gang comes closer to Keiro and Attia. The chain gang demands food from Attia and Keiro. The chain gang attacks Keiro. Keiro demands for Attia to shoot him. Attia fires.

Jared brings Finn into a room he believes isn't bugged. Jared tells Claudia that she has always believed that Finn is Giles. Finn asks Jared if he believes what the boy claims. When Claudia enters the room, she tells them that the Queen is allowing the boy to stay in court. Finn shows the same tattoo the boy showed, but Finn's is faded.

Claudia sees a vision of her father looking down on her. Her father speaks to Jared saying that he thought he damaged the portal enough, but he underestimated Jared's prowess. The warden warns Jared not to send anything living through the portal. Jared realizes that the feathers made it to Incarceron when the warden returns them to Jared.

The warden reveals where Keiro is—fighting the chain gang, and how Finn isn't there to have his back. The warden reveals that he no longer has the keys to the portal and therefore he is a prisoner now too.

Chapter 10 Analysis

It seems as if Finn is acting as if he is Giles. Jared, however, doubts that Finn is in fact Giles. Claudia receiving her inheritance hinges on the fact that Finn is Giles. The portal might have kept a younger Giles in the form of the boy but sent forth an older version of Giles, which is Finn.



Chapter 11

Chapter 11 Summary

Chapter 12 Summary

Attia and Keiro continue to ride their horse for hours. Keiro believes he has made a deal with Incarceron to keep them from getting lost and to turn over the glove to the prison. They stop again in the forest to rest. Attia sees a building in the distance, at the edge of the forest, she tells Keiro its' like Rix's story of the princess in the castle. It's as if the prison is a creation that someone controls. In this case, they believe it is the warden, which is Claudia's father, that controls Incarceron. Buildings in the novel come to life, so they have characteristics and personalities as if the buildings are alive and breathing.



Chapter 13 Summary

Claudia goes to Jared's room looking for Finn in the middle of the night. Jared tells her he's leaving for the academy tomorrow. Jared says he's homesick. Claudia says they'll both go home as soon as Finn is on the thrown. Claudia sees that the portal and the systems of the prison are all live and humming. Jared gives Claudia a silver cube on a chain. The silver cube on a chain is Incarceron.

Finn is lying in the grass. He thinks of how Claudia will marry the new Giles and become queen because that is what she is meant to do. He plans to find Incarceron and release all of the people in it when he becomes king.

When Keiro and Attia enter the room of the house, there is a pile of furniture and other items stacked up against the door. Attia notices it's all toys. The toys range from miniature ones to gigantic ones. Keiro and Attia hear voices inside of the music box.

Claudia says her father is inside and he took both keys with him. Keiro says he knows that the prison wants to build a body. Jared tells them that the warden sabotaged the portal. Jared tells them to find the warden to help them.

Suddenly Finn is speaking to Attia. Then Finn asks for Keiro.

Chapter 13 Analysis

It appears as if the world that Jared and Claudia now live in is outside of the Incarceron. At one time, however, they both lived inside of Incarceron. It appears that since Incarceron is small enough to fit in a cube on a chain that the objects inside of Incarceron are miniature too—explaining the miniature toys Keiro and Attia find. In the real world, or the world outside of Incarceron, are normal size, which explains the gigantic size items. Finn speaking to Attia and Keiro through the portal and through the music box foreshadows an argument between Finn and Keiro. It will also reveal additional information on how Finn wound up outside of Incarceron but Keiro got stuck inside of it with Attia.



Chapter 14 Summary

Attia asks Finn what happened to his plan to get them out of Incarceron. Jared asks if they are close to a system because some strange signals are coming through. Attia starts to say it must be the glove, but Keiro tells her to shut up. Attia starts to scream about puppets and then static comes through on Jared, Claudia and Finn's end. A lifesize puppet comes to life and tells them that he told them not to betray him. Keiro promises that they haven't betrayed the prison and that they are still bringing it the glove.

Claudia and Finn escort Jared to the stable so Jared can ride off to the academy. Claudia resents Finn for coming along so that she can't say goodbye to Jared alone. Jared asks Finn what Attia was talking about when she mentioned the blood. Finn says Sapphique made a bet with the prison. When the prison lost and vanished, Sapphique took the skin and made a glove out of it. He says the glove holds power.

They reach the road that goes on to the academy. Jared tells Claudia and Finn to turn back and that he'll make the rest of the journey alone. It starts to rain as Claudia and Finn return. Finn's horse collapses with Finn on it. Suddenly, Claudia realizes that it's a hail of arrows that are striking her and Finn.

Chapter 14 Analysis

The inference is that Finn escaped Incarceron as part of the plan to free them all from Incarceron. The prison is taking on the form of the puppet in order to communicate with Attia and Keiro. Incarceron was supposed to be a paradise but that something or someone caused it to turn evil. Claudia's resentment of Finn's presence indicates that she has romantic feelings for Jared. Jared is acting as if the separation from Claudia is more than just going on to the academy. It's as if he is returning to Incarceron without Claudia. Claudia and Finn are both under attack - an attack that it seems Jared set them up to come under.



Chapter 15 Summary

Finn yells at Claudia to get down and asks if she is hurt. Neither are hurt. They make an inventory of their weapons. Claudia says it's the steel wolves that are ambushing them, but Finn says that it isn't them because they could have killed him the previous night when he found a steel wolf's head by his head when he was lying in the grass. It's the area of the palace where the portal is that's on fire.

Chapter 15 Analysis

The peasants are there as illusions of the realm to lure them into danger or another attack. Claudia realizes how convincingly Finn can be when he is lying. This indicates that Finn might not be the real Giles. Finn seems to be much more mature and more experienced than Claudia, who seems to have lived a sheltered life. With the portal set aflame, it keeps Finn and Claudia outside of Incarceron and everyone in Incarceron inside.

Attia is making her way toward a stage that is set up in front of the prison, which is Incarceron.

When Attia reaches the front stage, she becomes part of the stage show. It turns out Attia is working with the magician, Rix, to create an illusion for the audience. Attia teams up with Keiro, which is Finn's oathbrother from prison. Attia works with Keior throughout the novel trying to find Finn.

Attia and Claudia in competition with one another for Finn's affection. While Attia is Finn's friend, she is really in love with him. When Claudia and Attia finally meet when Claudia comes to Incarceron, the two women do not get along.

Rix

Rix is a magician that lives and works in the world of Incarceron. He enlists Attia to help him pull off his magic tricks to convince the audience that he has magic powers. Rix also has a collection of gloves that he keeps on hand. One of the gloves Rix owns is the real glove of Sapphique, so it is a glove that has magical powers.

At certain points in the novel, it seems as if Rix is convinced that he really is Sapphique. Rix also seems quite unstable. There are times during the novel when Attia is not sure if Rix really is crazy or if he is just acting as if he is crazy.

Rix insists on being able to speak to Incarceron face-to-face. Incarceron indulges Rix. While Attia, Keiro and the warden are trying to open the portal to find Finn and reunite the warden with Claudia, Rix is being selfish, so all he cares about is himself and whether or not he can stare Incarceron in its eyes.

Finn

Finn is a former prisoner of Incarceron. He is now living in the realm. Finn has lost his memory so he doesn't know how he escaped Incarceron. He is thought to be Prince Giles, the stepson of the queen and the next in line to take the throne as king.

Finn is engaged to be married to Claudia. He is also Attia's best friend. When an impostor boy comes to the castle stating he is the real Prince Giles, Finn challenges him to a duel. Finn regains his memory and recalls that he in fact the real Prince Giles. At



the end of the novel, Finn rescues Caludia from Incarceron, plans to wed her and rebuild the realm as the king.

Claudia

Claudia is engaged to be married to Prince Giles. This also puts Claudia in line to be the next queen. She was offered the option to marry the queen's other stepson, Caspar, but instead works to help Finn regain his memory and prove he is the real Prince Giles.

Claudia's father is the warden of Incarceron. Claudia finds out that she was born in Incarceron and that her father stole her from the prison, which means he is not her real father. Claudia seems to struggle with her love for her tutor Jared and her love for Finn. In the end, Claudia makes it to Incarecron to try to free her father. Once Finn regains his memory, he saves Claudia from Incareceron and she and Finn vow to wed and rebuild the realm together.

Queen Sia

Queen Sia is the stepmother to Prince Giles and Caspar. She rules the world that is known as the realm. When the illusion of the realm is sabotaged, the queen is no longer beautiful and in control. She is old and decrepit instead.

Throughout the novel, the queen tries to prove that Finn is the real Prince Giles. Ultimately, though, this is a guise because she is really trying to create a situation where Caspar becomes King instead of Finn. The queen hires an impostor to claim he is the real Prince Giles. The queen also pays Jared to leave the kingdom, so he doesn't tell Claudia and Finn about her plan.

Caspar

Caspar is Prince Giles's stepbrother and the stepson of Queen Sia. Caspar does whatever the queen tells him to do. Caspar is in love with Claudia and tries to get her to marry him. Claudia shuns Caspar's advances.

When the illusion of th realm disappears, Caspar is heartbroken. He cannot believe that is stepmother is really old and decrepit. Caspar cares for the queen as she passes away.

Keiro

Keiro is a former prisoner of Incarceron. He was in the prison with Finn. Finn and Keiro became oathbrothers, so they vowed to also help and protect each other. Keiro teams up with Attia to find Finn. When Keiro trades places with Claudia, putting Keiro in the



realm and Claudia in Incarceron, Keiro becomes very greedy to possess the clothing, food, and other things he sees in the realm.

Medlicote

Medlicote is the leader of the Silver Wolves. He believes that Finn is not the real Prince Giles, so he and the other members of the Silver Wolves are trying to discredit and kill Finn. Medlicote is also a good friend of the warden who is trying to free his friend from Incarecon throughout the novel.

Warden

The warden is in charge of Incarceron. He is also Claudia's father. The warden chooses to stay at Incarceron even though Claudia urges him to come through the portal so he can live in the realm.

Jared

Jared is Claudia's tutor. Jared has an illness that is killing him. Throughout the novel, Jared injects himself with some type of medication. Jared is the only one that knows where the portal is and how to open the portal that allows transition from the world of the realm to Incarceron and so forth.



Objects/Places

Incarceron

Incarceron is the name of the prison. It also represents that world that exists outside of the realm and the other side of the portal. The way the author portrays Incarceron in the novel, it is not only a building. Incarceron also seems to have its own spirit, soul and voice. The world outside of Incarceron is filled with poverty and disease. If the realm is the world of good, then Incarceron represents the dark and evil side of the world.

Sapphique's Glove

Sapphique's glove is made of a material that is believed to be a dragon's skin. The glove has magical powers. Rix, Attia, Keiro, and the others that believe in Sapphique believe that he threw the glove back to Incarceron when Sapphique escaped. Rix possesses the glove. Keiro takes the glove from Rix and Incarceron is continuously trying to get the glove back throughout the novel.

Keiro's Nail

Keiro has one fingernail that is made of metal. The nail is a symbol if the fact that Keiro is half-man and half-machine made by Incarceron.

Realm

The realm is the name of the world in which the queen, Claudia and Finn live. In reality, the realm is all made of illusions. It looks as if the realm is beautiful, possesses beautiful objects, items and food. In reality, everything is old, decrepit, worn out, and dying.

Portal

The portal is the door or time warp between the two worlds. Throughout the novel, Claudia, Jared, Finn and the others are searching for the portal. Those in Incarceron want to find the portal to escape the prison. Those in the realm are looking for the portal to get to the people that are stuck in Incarceron. Ultimately, Jared is able to open the portal, which allows some transitions between the two worlds.



Jared's Room

Jared's room is where the tutor keeps all of his studies, papers, and documents. Since Jared is the only one that knows where the portal is and how to open the portal, Claudia and Finn search Jared's room for answers.

Wardenry

The wardenry is the house and estate where the warden lived with Caludia. It is the place where Claudia returns to try to find the portal. Claudia is trying to find the portal because she is trying to reunite with her father. While at the Wardenry, the queen and her army arrive to fight with Finn, Claudia and the others inside of the wardenry.

Warden's Office

The warden's office is inside of Incarceron. While the world that sits outside of the prison is decrepit, old, and rotting, the warden's office is the direct opposite. The office has ornate furnishing and decorations. It's also a warm and cozy place.

Sapphique Statue

A huge statue of Sapphique sits outside of the prison. It's as if Sapphique is guarding the prison and looking down on the people of Incarceron. It is under the statue that Attia and the others seeks shelter from the cold temperatures that the prison is sending their way in an attempt to freeze them to death.

Steel Wolf Head

The steel wolf head is a symbol of the group that is trying to take down Finn. The steel wolf head is part of Medlicote's walking stick. It's also a piece that someone, presumably Medlicote, leaves near Finn when he falls asleep in the courtyard, revealing that the group is after him and watching his every move.



Themes

Good versus Evil

The primary plot throughout the entire novel is that of good versus evil. Biblical symbolism can be found throughout the book such as Rix telling biblical stories with his own twist. Finn has an inner struggle with good versus evil and so do each of the characters that are involved in the story.

The two worlds that exist in the novel are symbols of the sides of good and evil. Incarceron represents the evilness in the world. The realm symbolizes the good in the world. Even Claudia and Attia are symbols of good and evil. Attia is forced to use deception and her street smarts to survive and find Finn. Claudia leaves a good and sheltered life. She too resorts to some forms of evil, however, to win out against the queen and to stand up for Finn.

The warden struggles in choosing between good and evil as well. He knows that his role is in Incarceron. Once the portal is open again, however, the warden knows he can move between the two worlds and rebuild a relationship with his daughter again.

In the end, it seems as if good will win out over evil now that the portal is open. Finn and Claudia have a plan to marry and to rebuild the realm, which was an illusion but which they plan on making a reality.

Coming of Age

One of the primary themes that run throughout the novel is growing up and coming of age, even against adversity such as having to fight battles in a war or fight off the evil world of a prison to get to a good world. Finn struggles with the fact that his coming of age requires him to act as a prince and king in line for the throne should act. Claudia struggles with choosing true love from what is expected of her so that she can become queen.

During her coming of age, Attia struggles and fights to find her friend that has left her behind. Even Incarceron transforms and changes as it has complete control to being at a loss of power when it can gain back Sapphique's glove. The warden too comes of age when he realizes that he too is a prisoner in Incarceron, even though he is the only human being that is truly in charge of the other people at the prison.

Friendship/Relationships

Friendships and relationships are a third major theme that runs throughout the novel. First, there is the line that separates the classes of the people that live in the realm



versus those that live in Incarceron. Second, it is even the class of relationships that exist among the people of each world.

Claudia has two loves, Finn and Jared. She knows however that she cannot be with Jared. Claudia knows that she has to be with Finn and she has to to take the throne as queen. Attia is in love with Finn, but Finn sees Attia as just a friend. It's Attia's friendship and love for Finn that drives her to continue to search for Finn.

It's even Claudia's love for her father that hurtles her into Incarceron. She is able to confront her father on the fact that he is not her natural father. They are able to rekindle their father-daughter relationship and build a new foundation for a new kind of relationship.



Style

Point of View

The novel is written in the third-person point of view, from the perspective of the author and narrator. The novel swings back and forth between the present and the past. The present represents the time when Finn and Sapphique have left Incarceron. The past represents the time in history when Finn and Sapphique were still prisoners of Incarceron.

The point of view of this novel is intimate, allowing a reader to connect closely with several of the characters. The book written in this manner allows the reader to get inside the heads, thoughts and inner struggles of the characters. The reader cares what happens to the characters even though most of them struggle between good and evil. The point of view also allows the author to inject her own opinions into the narration and to expand on the events taking place around the other characters and the occurrences taking place.

Setting

The novel has two primary settings. One setting is in the world of Incarceron. The other is in the world of the realm. The setting is a combination of what we think of as reality and fantasy. The main characters are trapped in the worlds in which they live and are unable to get to their loved ones that are trapped in the separate world. They are all hunting for the portal, which is the door that allows them to move between these two worlds.

The setting of this novel works well with the plot. At first, the reader is not aware that the characters are operating in two different worlds. However, as events unfold, the two worlds and the hunt for the portal is a constant part of the plot, the lives of the characters and even the outcome of the novel.

Language and Meaning

The language of this novel is complex and hard to understand at times. The author interjects many foreign and made up words. The language is descriptive enough that it helps to explain the situations, but is not always detailed enough for the reader to truly understand what is happening in the story.

Structure

The novel is divided into 35 chapters. The length of each chapter ranges from two pages to 20 pages long. The chapters tell the story primarily in exposition and some



dialogue. The narrator injects her own voice and thoughts throughout the book, providing her opinions and feelings of the events unfolding in the novel.

The novel contains one main plot and several subplots. The main plot is the struggle of choosing between good and evil. One subplot is the coming of age of each of the characters. Another subplot is the relationships that the characters form amongst each other.

Discuss the attacks on the people of Incarceron. What impact do the attacks have on the characters of the novel? How does it motivate them and how does it derail their lives? Who ultimately is responsible for the attacks?
