Plot Summary

"Something Like Fate" by Susane Colasanti tells the story of 16-year-old Lani. At the end of her junior year in high school, Lani connects with a terrific guy named Jason. He is her best friend's latest crush. Lani is caught between her growing attraction for Jason and her loyalty to her best friend, Erin.

Lani isn't very close to many people, but she is very close to her gay friend, Blake. She is even closer to her best friend, Erin. As the book opens, Erin is obsessed with a new boy in her life named Jason. She asks Blake and Mani to meet him. When they do meet, there is an instant connection between Lani and Jason. Blake sees it, and Lani feels it although she tries to deny it. She doesn't want to hurt her best friend.

As the weeks go by, Lani and Jason eat together at lunch and get to know each other better. They discover that they have a lot in common. The two attend a small school and their friendship doesn't go over well with others. The kids in the Golden Circle feel that Lani left them because she was too good for them. In reality however, she stopped hanging out with them because she didn't feel connected anymore. Now the kids in the Golden Circle are suspicious of her and her relationship with Jason.

She continues to try to keep her feelings under control. Soon it becomes too difficult and Lani feels like they are fated to be together. Jason admits that he likes her and she tells him that she likes him too. He had been afraid to tell her because he thought she was dating Blake. She accidentally tells him that Blake is gay.

Even though they know they like each other, Lani doesn't want to hurt Erin so she doesn't kiss Jason. Erin leaves for camp for the summer, and Lani isolates herself at home and at work. Blake encourages her to go after love. As she works, she wonders if she is making the right choice, avoiding Jason. When she meets him in the grocery store, she feels as if it's a sign to pursue their relationship. Jason tells her he and Erin broke up and they make plans to get together soon.

She also talks with Jason and they begin dating again.

Chapters 1-10 Summary

"Something Like Fate" by Susane Colasanti tells the story of 16-year-old Lani. At the end of her junior year in high school, Lani connects with a terrific guys named Jason. He is her best friend's latest crush. Lani is caught between her growing attraction for Jason and loyalty to her best friend, Erin.

The book opens with a two-sentence comment stating that the person speaking didn't know it was going to come out like it did, but they wouldn't have taken it back if they had known.

In Chapter 2, Blake and the main character are talking about horoscopes. The weekly horoscope is an integral part of the main character's life. She checks in every Monday, and he questions how she doesn't know that it's bogus. He challenges her to prove that it isn't a waste of time. She says it won't be a problem. She goes to one of her favorite websites for horoscopes and reads it. While it's not all accurate, she argues that it isn't all applicable to her since she's only 16. The part that is accurate is extremely accurate. She tells Blake that it's not just about the horoscope, it's also about astrology in general. She is the perfect Taurus.

Blake asks what her horoscope says and she thinks about her relationship with him. They have been best friends for two years and have never fought. The only person that she is closer to is Erin, her fearless best friend. As she thinks about her friends, she reflects on the fact that Blake is wonderful and extremely handsome. Chapter 5 - They attend a small school where everyone knows everyone else. The main character doesn't really fit in any group, but she isn't an outcast either. It's just difficult for her to relate to people. She just doesn't feel a connection. Erin invites Blake and the main character to join her and Jason for pizza. Jason is late, and it makes Erin nervous. They are just about to order when Jason shows up. Erin pretends that she didn't notice that he is late, and she introduces him to Blake and Lani.

Chapter 6 - In art class, they are doing pottery, and Lani is not good at it. Connor is very good at it, and he encourages her. She appreciates his calming effect on her. As they are working, Sophie tries to sit down next to Ryan, and he verbally attacks her. Lani tells the girl that she can sit next to her. Ryan is mean to many students, especially Blake. Lani refuses to let Ryan provoke her. Sophie thanks them for letting her sit with them. Connor tells her that she can sit with them any time.

Chapter 7 - Lani is almost 17 years old, and she can't swim. The are going to have a family reunion in Hawaii the summer after she graduates, and she really wants to swim



in the ocean when she's there. She is taking a swimming class so she can learn. The only problem is, she is terrified of drowning. She is the oldest kid in the class at swimming lessons, and although her instructor is encouraging, she panics every time her feet leave the floor of the pool.

Chapter 8 - At lunch the next day, Lani is reflecting on her pathetic attempts at swimming, and Jason comes up behind her. They talk and laugh together. After lunch, Jason throws everything into the garbage can, and Lani lectures him about recycling. He tells her that if she can convince him that recycling will make a big difference, he will promise to recycle for the rest of the school year. She challenges him to recycle for the rest of his life. She looks forward to showing Jason what she knows.

Chapter 9 - Erin and Lani go to town together, and this time, Lani encourages Erin to go in with her to visit a psychic. Erin tells Lani that she did a star chart and used numerology, and the results showed that she and Jason are highly compatible. The psychic, Coral, appears and tells them that she does tarot readings and palm readings. Her readings of Erin seem very accurate. Coral tells Lani that she is going to have some conflict soon.

Chapter 10 - Lani loves the kite festival that occurs in the spring. She is reading a brochure with the rules and enjoying the brightly colored kites. Jason is there as a contestant. He joins Erin and Lani, and they discuss the science behind kite flying. Lani mentions that she loves hot air balloons. Erin goes off to get a snow cone, and Jason and Lani continue talking. Jason thinks that Blake and Lani are boyfriend and girlfriend. She tells him that they are not and wonders why he asked since according to her experiences, when a guy asks if a girl has a boyfriend, it generally means they are interested. She can't believe that he is interested in her, though, since he likes Erin.

Chapters 1-10 Analysis

Chapter 1 - The first chapter only contains two sentences, but it immediately lets the reader know how the main character feels about all the events that occur in the book. She didn't like what happened, but she wouldn't change the results.

In Chapter 2, the reader meets the main character and her best friend Blake. The reader also understands that she has another best friend named Erin. There is no name given to the main character, but the reader understands that she isn't very trusting and she says that there are very few people in her life that she can count on. Blake offers comfort, and they never fight. Still, she feels closer to Erin then Blake. She and Erin have a special bond even though their friendship is more volatile. The main character is obsessed with fate, and she is aware of the fact that her best friend has a temper, and she is also fearless. Erin is a Leo so this makes sense. The main character is quieter, and she wishes she were a bit more like Erin.



Because they are so close, other kids think that the main character is dating Blake. She is the only person who knows that he is gay. He shares the secret with her, but not with Erin.

Chapter 3 focuses on the way the main character fits in socially. The first time the main character's name, Lani, is mentioned is when the fate study chart is mentioned. Erin and Lani are linked by fate as well as by their interest in fate. The chapter closes with Lani asserting that no matter what happens she knows she can count on Erin for anything, and she knows that Erin will do anything for her. There is a sense of foreshadowing that something is going to happen to change this.

In Chapter 4, the environment is very important to Lani, and this chapter gives some of her background, which explains why saving the earth is so important to her.

Chapter 5 - Erin is very excited about a new boy she is interested in named Jason. She wants to share him with her best friends. She is so busy trying to impress him that she seems unaware of the instant connection between Jason and Lani. Blake, who is close enough to Lani to share his deepest secrets, immediately sees the connection. Lani feels the connection as well, but she denies it to Blake, and even to herself. She doesn't want to put her friendship with Erin in jeopardy.

Chapter 6 - Connor is introduced during the sixth chapter. He is able to calm and guide Lani. The interactions among students in this chapter show that Connor and Lani are kind, reaching out to help the underdogs like Sophie. Ryan is very different. He is a bully.

Chapter 7 - This chapter shows a weakness in the heroine. Even though she is very much a water person, she is terrified of drowning. This doesn't stop her from trying to learn how to swim. She tries to conquer fear by taking swimming lessons.

Chapter 8 - Lani is upset with herself for doing so poorly in swimming lessons. As she thinks about this, Jason joins her for lunch and turns her frustrations around.

Chapter 9 - When Lani and Erin visit a psychic, the story takes a twist. The reader discovers that the friendship between the two of them is in jeopardy. The girls don't seem to understand what is going to happen, but the reader already has a clue since the reader is privy to the obvious connection between Lani and Jason.

Chapter 10 - Jason and Lani discover that they have more interests in common as they talk together at the kite festival. Lani is starting to realize that Jason really might be interested in her when he asks whether or not she has a boyfriend. As the chapter ends, she is questioning whether or not he is really interested in her, and this time, she doesn't try to deny it or push it away.

Chapters 11-17 Summary

Chapter 17 - Lani spends a week trying to get the courage to talk to Jason. On Monday, her horoscope says that the payback will be immense if she takes a risk when she would normally play it safe. The Magic 8 ball agrees with this. She decides that she is going to ask Jason for sure.

Jason seems to be in a very good mood when she meets him in the hallway. She is trying to find a way to talk with him when Greg interrupts them. He asks Jason if he is going to a party, and he ignores Lani. Jason and Lani both talk at once after Greg leaves, and Jason asks her if he can talk with her. They go into an empty classroom. Lani wants to turn on a light, but Jason likes it somewhat dark. She agrees. Jason tells her that he really likes her. She asks him why he didn't say anything before, and he mentions that he thought she was going out with Blake. She is so surprised that she blurts out the fact that Blake is gay then quickly covers her mouth. She tells him that she didn't mean to say that, and no one can know about it. He says he understands.

Lani tells Jason that it's extremely important that no one knows about Blake because his father will kill him if he finds out he is gay. He asks Lani how she feels about him, and she realizes that she has to tell the truth. She says that she likes him as well.



He pushes back her hair, and she tells him not to, worried that he will see her scar. She knows her reaction is weird so she explains that she has a scar on her forehead. Chapters 11-17 Analysis

In Chapter 11, Lani and Jason are getting closer. They move from an attraction and connection to a close friendship. They share quirks that link them closer together.

In Chapter 12, on Lani's birthday, she begins to show that she is shifting loyalties. She is willing to deny her friendship with Danielle in order to please Erin. Blake gives her an opportunity to get closer to Jason, and they talk about what they do to work through problems. Lani doesn't really have a release, and this shows the reader that she is unused to conflict. It also hints that there is going to be trouble when she is faced with adversity and can't find an outlet.

In Chapter 13, the art class is studying pointillism. This is a form of art where a full image is made of tiny dots. From close range, it doesn't appear like a complete image. It's only when one steps back to see all the dots that the image appears. This is symbolic for the situation Lani and Erin find themselves in. Erin is so focused on her own attraction to Jason, she doesn't see the full picture.

Chapter 14 contrasts Lani's old world with her new world. Things outwardly appear normal, but she is changing. She is no longer pushing aside her feelings for Jason, but instead of pushing away from the feeling, she decides to keep them from her best friend, and she feels guilty about this.

In Chapter 15, Jason asks Lani to join him for mentoring. She still has enough respect for Erin that she clears it with her friend before she agrees. Before they go, she discovers more areas where she and Jason share a common link. Erin sees it, too, but she doesn't seem to recognize any sort of threat.

In Chapter 16, as Lani and Jason get closer to each other, Connor comes around more frequently. Lani seems as oblivious to the fact that he wants to be with her as Erin is about the connection between Jason and Lani.

In Chapter 17, Lani believes so strongly in fate that she is ready to change her life based on the fact that her horoscope and the Magic 8 ball tell her to take a risk. The focus of this chapter is unveiling. Lani and Jason share the fact that they like each other, Lani blurts out Blake's secret, and she also shares her scar.



Summary and Analysis for Chapters 18- 23

Summary and Analysis for Chapters 18-23 Summary

Chapter 18 consists of two sentences. Lani is questioning how she can betray the girl who saved her life.

Summary and Analysis for Chapters 18-23 Analysis

Chapter 18 is the first chapter in Part II. Just like the first chapter of the book, it's extremely short, but it packs a punch.

In Chapter 19, the reader sees why Lani is so fearful of water. The reader also understands why Lani and Erin are so connected. They went through a very traumatic experience together. Erin literally saved Lani's life.

In Chapter 20, Jason picks gravel of Lani's arm - an action that shows that they are more than casual acquaintances. Lani is on edge, reading more than necessary into Erin's reactions because she is feeling guilty about the way she feels about Jason. The reader sees her struggle as she finds herself fighting and hiding her attraction to Jason. The reader sees how hard she is working to avoid betraying Erin. She didn't even let Jason kiss her after they both admitted that they liked each other. She has self control, but she is still holding back by not letting Erin in on the truth of what's really going on.

In Chapter 21, with Erin gone, Lani removes herself from temptation by isolating herself. She is spending her summer with her parents and with Blake. He is willing to stand up and displease his father in regards to the glass working internship, but both he and Lani know that the reality of his sexual orientation would turn his father completely against him. Since this comes up several times in the book, the reader understands that it's a subplot that is building momentum.

Lani's connection with her parents contrasts that of Blake and his dad. She is comfortable with her parents. This is shown when she asks her mom questions about



relationships, and her mother offers advice without prying into why she is asking the questions.

In Chapter 22, once again Lani turns to fate to see how she should act and behave. She asks Energy to step in and show her a sign as to what she should do with Jason and their attraction to each other.

In Chapter 21, it shows that Lani doesn't like to drive because of the negative environmental impact. This goes along with her passion for Earth and recycling habits. However, in Chapter 23 a different reality emerges. Lani isn't good at driving - especially standard vehicles.

She sees the signs from Energy that she is looking for as she runs into Jason in the grocery store. When he tells her that he and Erin broke up, she doesn't seem to be upset by the fact that he did it by mail. She also doesn't jump right into his arms. Lani waits until she gets home before calling him to tell him that she wants to get together with him because she misses him.

Lani says she can't do this to Erin, and Jason says Erin would want her to be happy then he kisses her. The evening is so perfect, Lani forgets to keep her eye on the time. She has an 11 o' clock curfew, and it's already 1:15 am. Jason drives her home, and neither one of them wants the evening to end.

In Chapter 26, Dad is doing a crossword puzzle and Lani helps him. She loves spending time with him even though they don't talk much. Dad comments on her good mood, and she considers telling him why she's so happy but decides against it.

She and Jason have been seeing each other daily. Greg sees them and comments on it while they are at work. He tells her to stop it since Jason is with Erin. She points out that Erin is her best friend.

Her parents were upset that she missed her curfew so they gave her a set curfew rather than a flexible one. They know she hangs out with Jason, but they don't realize how serious it is. Her parents think the teens are just friends. Lani feels guilty every time she gets a letter from Erin. In the letters, Erin writes about how upset she is that Jason dumped her when she thought everything was going well.

Lani wants to tell Erin about their relationship, especially when Erin starts writing about another guy, but Jason wants her to hold off on telling her. He tells her this while he is rowing. Jason is taking steps to help Lani become more comfortable with water.



In Chapter 27, the day is extremely hot, and Lani is helping her mother in the garden. She uses examples to fish around and question what's going on with Jason, Erin and herself. Her mother gets right to the point, and Lani knows that Erin is going to be hurt, and she can't stop it.

The curfew is bogus and Lani begins to sneak out at night to meet up with Jason. One time while they are out, Greg calls to tell Jason to come to a party. He doesn't want to go.

In Chapter 28, school starts in two weeks. Jason and Erin agree to tell Erin about them when she gets home. They try to stay away from the public eye. Lani goes to the beach, but she won't go in the water. Jason is lifeguarding, and she is trying not to look at him. Connor joins her and asks her out on a date. She says that she's seeing someone, but it's a secret.

Summary and Analysis for 24-28 Analysis

In Chapter 24, even though Jason and Lani are honest with each other, their relationship is not worry-free. When they are out together, Lani is constantly on edge if they are in a public place. She doesn't want people to see them together. As they talk about their lives, Lani realizes that they are more connected than she ever previously imagined. She opens up to Jason and admits her fear of water. Instead of ridiculing her, he is quick to offer help. Her desire to overcome her fear of water is more powerful than the fear itself, and she is willing to consider letting him help her. This is symbolic of the fear she feels about hurting Erin. She needs to face the situation head-on.

In Chapter 25, on the Fourth of July, Jason and Lani share a perfect evening. They are so enthralled with each other that they miss curfew. It's an evening of liberation, and it's also the first time they kiss.

In Chapter 26, Lani has a great relationship with her father, and that is shown in this chapter. She doesn't talk with him much, but she loves being with him. She and Jason are getting together regularly, and she thinks it's time to tell Erin, but he persuades her not to. She listens to him, but feels guilty. Jason helps her get a bit more comfortable with the water, and she is also becoming more comfortable with their relationship.

In Chapter 27, even though Lani is very close to her parents, she is still willing to break their rules in order to meet up with Jason. This is shown as she sneaks out of the house at night.

In Chapter 28, Jason and Lani do what they can to keep their relationship a secret until after Erin comes home. Connor is more blatant about his interest in Lani when he asks her out. She trusts him enough to let him know she is seeing someone else. He takes it well.

In Chapter 38, at school, the poster that Jason and Lani made for One Earth is symbolically in shreds, just like their relationship. She spends some time alone reflecting on all the people she is affecting. All along she has been feeling as if she is betraying others, and now in Communications class, she is the betrayed. It gives her different perspective.

In Chapter 39, Connor shows that he is a great friend who cares about her happiness when he helps Jason reach out to her. As he talks about fate, Lani starts viewing it differently. She wonders if she can be more proactive, changing her destiny with her own decisions.

In Chapter 40, Jason shows that he is ready to step up and make his own fate when he confronts her in the hallway. She knows how she should react, but she doesn't. Lani's own reaction doesn't make her happy. It makes her cry.

In Chapter 41, Blake and Lani are good friends once again. They enjoy spending time together and just like in the beginning of the book when he encouraged her to date Jason, he now prods her to return to Jason. Characters

Lani

Lani is a 16-year-old girl when the book begins. She loves the earth and she is obsessed with fate. She isn't super popular, and she isn't an outcast, either. The girl doesn't feel a connection with most people so she only has a few close friends. She considers Erin to be her best friend, connected to her for life due to a tragedy that brought them together.

Even though she feels loyal to her friends, Lani discovers that she is falling for Erin's boyfriend. She tries to hold her feelings back, but they eventually take over. She begins dating him herself. Still, she doesn't want to hurt Erin so she tries to keep the relationship secret. When the truth comes out, she chooses her best friend over her relationship with Jason. Lani becomes an outcast int he school and has to figure out who she really is before she can fix the mess she has created with those who are closest to her in life.

Jason

Jason is an easy-going popular boy who sees life in a unique manner. He sees tastes in colors and shapes, makes up codes, and talks in an abbreviated language. When he's upset, he likes to walk the train tracks as he sorts things out. He is dating Erin, but feels an attraction for Lani. He breaks up with Erin by letter.

The teenage boy is a lifeguard who patiently teaches Lani to swim without ridiculing. He has in interest in flying kites. When Lani pushes their relationship aside, he is understanding even though he doesn't agree with what she is doing. Instead of lashing out at her or rejecting her, Jason waits for her to sort out her own feelings. He is ready for her when she wants to get back together again.

Blake

This character is one of Lani's closest friends. He shares a secret with her that she accidentally lets out.

Erin

This character is Lani's closest friend. Although they are drifting apart as this story begins, they have a bond that will last forever because when they were younger, they survived an accident together when this character saved Lani's life.



Mom

This character is an environmental-health specialist. She also loves gardening. She offers advice without prying.

Dad

This character builds greenhouses. He also loves doing crossword puzzles.

Coral

This is the psychic that Lani and Erin went to see when they were in town. She told Lani that she would have several loves in her life.

Danielle

This character is Lani's friend who feels betrayed when Lani doesn't invite her to her birthday party and lies about what she planned to do that evening.

Ryan

This character is a bully who picks on Blake. He overhears the conversation between Jason and Lani.

Sophie

This character is in Lani's art class. When Ryan is mean to her, Lani is kind.

Connor

This character is from Canada. He is interested in Lani romantically, but when that doesn't work out, he still supports her as a friend.

Bianca

This character is part of the popular crowd. She is very suspicious of Lani's relationship with Jason.



Greg

Erin tries to set Lani up with this character, but she has no interest in him. He sits at the Golden Table and invites Jason to events while ignoring Lani.

Uncle Rick

This is the character who takes Blake into his home after Blake's father kicks him out.



Objects/Places

Cafeteria

This is where Lani and Jason sit together and learn more about each other. It's also where Lani feels completely isolated when everyone turns against her.

Echo Lake

This is right behind Lani's house. She sits on her porch and looks out over it.

Under the stairs

This is a secret place Lani goes to be alone. She overhears girls talking about Blake while she is here and learns how the rumors got out.

Classroom by the Guidance Office

This is where Jason and Lani admit they have feelings for each other. They don't know that everything they say can be heard through the vents.

Water

This is what Lani is terrified of and yet she wants to overcome the fear.

Art Class

Lani struggles in this, but Connor encourages her.

Horoscope

Lani is addicted to this and checks it every Monday. She gets Blake interested in it as well.

Psychic

Lani and Erin go here together and Lani finds the results amazingly accurate.



Magic 8 Ball

This is what Lani turns to for advice. It confirms her decisions to try new things.

Pizza Parlor

This is where Erin takes Blake and Lani to meet Jason for the first time.

The Fountain

This place has amazing gelato. Lani thinks of it as her special place to go with Jason.

Hawaii

This is where Lani is going after graduation. She is determined to overcome her fear before she goes there.



Themes

The Role of Fate in Life

Lani is obsessed with the idea of fate. She checks her horoscope every Monday to see what is coming up in her life. She confirms decisions that she is going to make by checking with her Magic 8 Ball. Sshe goes to a psychic to see what her future holds according to a palm reading and tarot cards. Lani feels that she was destined to be connected with Jason because fate threw them together in a horrific accident. She also feels that she is meant to be together with Jason due to a cosmic connection and the words of the psychic.

When Lani is uncertain about whether she should pursue a relationship with Jason, she asks for Energy to show her sign. Later on in the book, it seems as if everything is against her, and it makes her question the concept of fate. She comes to the realization that she doesn't have to wait around for things to happen to her. She can change her fate by becoming proactive in some of her own actions. This spurs her to stand up for herself and confront Erin, and they become friends again. Her own proactive actions also lead to a true connection with Jason.

Friendship and Betrayal

Friendship is a very important element in this book. As the book opens, Lani is not connected to many people through friendship. She has chosen not to be part of the popular crowd because she doesn't feel connected with them, and she doesn't feel drawn to many people. She has a close core of friends which includes Lake, Erin, and Danielle.

As the book progresses, the reader discovers that the few friendships that Lani has are in jeopardy as she inadvertently betrays her closest friends. She accidentally let out a secret about Blake which leads to his being bullied at school and losing his home. Her connection with Jason jeopardizes her friendship with Erin who was certain that she and Jason were fated to be together. She almost loses Jason because she is trying to please Erin. When all seems lost, Connor befriends Lani, helping guide her through the tough times.

Secrets and Witholding Truths Can Harm

The main conflicts in this book arise from concept of keeping secrets. Blake shares the secret that he is gay with Lani, and she inadvertently let the secret out, putting their own friendship in jeopardy. Lani keeps her feelings about Jason a secret from Erin, and her lack of honesty nearly destroys their friendship.



Lani even loses her friendship with Danielle because she keeps her birthday party a secret from the other girl. When Danielle hears about it, she is hurt and feels betrayed. She doesn't want to continue being a friend with Lani, especially since Lani also lied to her about her own feelings for Jason. Destruction and betrayal follow as each of the secrets comes to light. Lani loses Danielle as a friend, Erin lashes out against her, Blake doesn't want to be with her, and her relationship with Jason is cut off as she tries to regain Erin's friendship.



Style

Point of View

"Something Like Fate" is written in a first-person and subjective point of view. The story is told from Lani's perspective. Because it's written in this perspective, the reader is privy to her thoughts and torn emotions. The reader also understands how she thinks others relate to her. This is important because the story revolves around secrets, and Lani has the best of intentions, but they backfire on her. Since the reader can see her thought processes, the reader can relate to her and sympathize with her even when she makes the wrong choices.

Setting

This story takes place in a small community where everyone knows each other in school. This is an essential detail in the story because Lani can't escape the gossip that comes out when everyone hears how she betrayed Erin. The same holds true for Blake. Lani is very connected to the earth and the environment. She lives in an area with farms, and she works on a berry farm. She has a lake in her backyard, which is ironic since she is terrified of water. Challenges surround her, but she overcomes them in the long run.

Language and Meaning

Lani is entering her senior year of high school, and the language in this book reflects this. It's relaxed language, filled with typical teen lingo that fun the gamut from sarcasm to online chatting and abbreviated working. However, Lani also uses some bigger words and lingo appropriate for her education level and upbringing. She is particularly knowledgable on language related to the environment, which makes sense since she is involved in the environmental club at school, her father makes greenhouses, and her mother is an environmental-health specialist.

Structure

"Something Like Fate" by Susane Colasant consists of three parts. Each part begins with some quotes. All the chapters in the book are labeled only by numbers. Part One covers the months of April and May of Lani's junior year in high school. It contains 17 chapters. Part Two covers the months of June through August. It includes chapters 18 thought 29. Part Three covers September and October of Lani's senior year. It includes chapters 30-43. The chapters vary in length, and the first chapter in each part contains only two sentences that hold significance on what is to come. The final page of the last chapter highlights a postcard that Lani writes to Jason from Hawaii. The reader knows she was going to Hawaii after graduation. This postcard is followed by



acknowledgements grouped under headings such as "The Sun," "The World," and "The Star."
