Plot Summary

"Thirst No. 1: The Last Vampire, Black Blood, Red Dice" is the first novel in the "Thirst" series by author Christopher Pike. The story follows the main character, Alisa Perne, as she goes through her life as a modern day vampire, even though she has been one for the last five thousand years. Alisa lives her life of luxury with secret bank accounts, and even changes her identity from time to time, in order to keep her secret life hidden.

She was Sita when she was originally transformed into a vampire by her creator Yaksha. She makes a vow to Krishna, her God, not to create any more vampires, but things get complicated when Alisa, as Lara Adams, falls in love with Ray. Now, Yaksha is back to hunt Sita, which further complicates the situation.

In the end, Sita has to break her vow in order to save mankind as a whole. In her final act, she destroys one of her past loves in order to keep the Earth from being overrun by vampires, but has to sacrifice another love in the process. She also decides she no longer wants an immortal life, but just once to be a mother once again. This causes her to perform an experiment to transform from a vampire into a human once again. What Sita doesn't know is if it works.



Chapter 1 Summary

Alisa Perne is the narrator of "Thirst No. 1: The Last Vampire, Black Blood, Red Dice". She says she is a modern vampire, so that many of the assumptions made about vampires are not true. She says her current body is 18 years old. In reality, she was around before the pyramids were erected. She says she drinks blood, but also eats and digests normal food. She states that her senses are acute and her strength is great—although she doesn't kill as much as she once did. Alisa is currently standing outside of Detective Michael Riley's office. He has summoned her there to tell Alisa something. She doesn't know what he has to say.

Riley explains that he is a private detective. He starts to describe the vast wealth Alisa possesses, including her real estate holdings and investments. Without denying that his facts are true or false, Alisa asks why he is researching her and who hired him. She asks him how much he wants to keep her invisible. When he says that nobody pointed him in her direction, Alisa says that her offer to keep him guiet is nothing.

Riley threatens to make the information public. Alisa points out that she knows he's taping the conversation, has a gun on his person and one on his desk under the papers. She offers him a million dollars if he tells her who has hired him to research her. When he continues to insist that nobody put him onto her, she threatens to kill him and tells her that she is a vampire. Riley reaches for his gun but not fast enough, because Alisa kicks him so hard in his chest Riley starts to bleed. As he is dying, she gets out of Riley that a man named Slim is the one that asked him to look in to her. She finds out Riley has a son and promises to take care of him if he tells her how to find Slim. Riley dies.

Alisa notes the picture of the 18 year old with Riley on his desk. She looks in his computer to find information on Slim but there is a passcode. Alisa cleans up the mess, puts Riley's body in garbage bags and takes it to her car. Alisa buries Riley's body in the woods. Later, in her mansion by the sea, she stares at the photo of Riley and his son. She ponders why his son looks so familiar to her.

Chapter 1 Analysis

Alisa is an old soul in a young body. Because she is a vampire living among humans, it seems as if she has to create identities out of thin air. The fact that a man that goes by the name of Slim hires a private detective to research Alisa suggests that Slim suspects Alisa is something other than human. Because Alisa has to take on different human forms, since she is 5,000 years old in reality, it is possible that she knows Riley's son from one of her human forms. It even suggests that his son might be a vampire as well because Alisa says that his eyes seem familiar.



Chapter 2 Summary

Alisa says she doesn't need much sleep; a few hours will do. She admits the sunlight bothers her, but not like it is portrayed in novels, such as Bram Stoker's "Dracula". In 1899, she visited Stoker and had him sign a copy of the book, which she read in seconds because she has a photographic memory.

The next morning, Alisa contacts the three businessmen that handle her accounts on three different continents. They are all adamant that they didn't give out any of her financial or personal information to anyone. With the American businessman, Alisa establishes a new identity, Lara Adams, and arranges for her guardian Mrs. Adams to enroll her at Mayfair High in all of Ray Riley's classes. Ray is the son of the detective.

Alias says she is starting to crave blood, which happens after a week of not consuming any. She says she doesn't die if she doesn't drink it, and has gone up to six months without drinking blood. Alias also says that when she drinks the blood of a human or they taste her blood, it doesn't transform them into a vampire. Alias drives to Northern California, walks into a bar and spots a truck driver having a beer in the corner. She picks him up, and he takes her to a hotel. She bites into the back of his neck, drinking a couple pints of his blood. She bites the tip of her tongue so a few drops fall on his wounds and heal them. She tells him to forget her and he falls into a deep sleep.

The next morning, Lara Adams is in history class with Ray and his girlfriend, Pat. Lara can tell from the first time she meets Ray that he is an old soul—a man in a boy's body. Lara and Ray don't have the next two classes together, but Pat has PE with Lara second period. Pat asks why the history teacher, Mr. Castro, kept her after class and what Lara thinks of Ray. Lara is straightforward and sarcastic, yet frank, and her responses startle Pat. During PE, they are learning archery, and Lara meets Seymour Dorsten. As soon as Lara shakes Seymour's hand, she senses that his blood is sick and they he has a disease that will likely kill him in a year.

Lara feels as if Seymour is one of the mortals that can sense what she is thinking. It proves relatively true when she thinks about shooting an arrow at Mr. Castro, who is standing off at the end of the football field, talking to and touching a young blonde girl. Seymour tells Lara not to do it and that he sensed she wanted to shoot Mr. Castro. Lara laughs it off.

The next class Lara has with Ray is fourth period biology. She asks for Ray's help in moving some furniture at her house because her parents are out of town. He says he has to work and to ask Pat. Lara gives him her address—a home rented that morning for her. Lara realizes that Ray's eyes look like her husband Rama's.



After school, Lara returns to the rental home and moves all of the furniture into the garage. She goes into the master bedroom and rests. As she falls asleep, she dreams of the devil, Yaksha, who is also the first of the vampires. She thinks about how she is the last of the vampires.

Chapter 2 Analysis

Alisa is putting to rest a lot of the assumptions and falsehoods that humans have about vampires. Her entire first day at her new high school, she keeps getting the feeling of déjà vu. It is as if several, many, or possibly event the entire school is comprised of humans that have the ability to sense things, just as Alisa does. Ray and Rama having the same eyes suggests that Rama might be reincarnated into Ray's body. Pat, Ray's girlfriend, will probably pose a problem in Lara getting close enough to Ray to get Ray to open the files on his father's computer for her. While Alisa says she doesn't want to kill Pat, she will if she has to. Finally, Alisa suggests that she is the last of the vampires —as if the race of vampires has somehow gone into distinction.



Chapter 3 Summary

Alisa explains that the vampires were the original Aryans—blonde hair and blue eyes. Alias was born in 3000 B.C. in a small Indian village, Rajastan. Her name at the time was Sita and her best friend is the mother of all vampires, Amba. Sita was seven when the disease struck the village that wiped out all of the vampires, except for her.

Amba is one of the first in the village to die of the plague. A priest that recently visited the village convinces the villagers that they need to allow a deity into the body of one of the corpses to get the devil out of the village. The priest chooses Amba's body, Sita thinks because she was eight months pregnant when she died. None of the women are permitted to attend the ceremony, so the men, one of which is Sita's father, take Amba's body to the woods.

Sita sneaks into the woods and hides behind a boulder. When the ceremony is underway, a stench fills the air and something takes over Amba's body—the yakshini takes it over. The yakshini kills the priest, laughs and then lies back down. Amba's belly begins to move so the men think her child is still alive. As they prepare to cut it out of her, Sita reveals herself and begs the men not to bring the child because it is evil. Sita's father gives her the option to cut it out or kill it. Sita doesn't cut the child out, but she names the boy Yaksha.

From the time Yaksha is born, the plague disappears and never returns to the village. Sita's father gives Yaksha to his sister, who is childless, to raise as her own. Yaksha grows at an alarming rate. When he is 8, he is twice the size of Sita, who is twice his age. By the time Yaksha is 20, the six men that witnessed what happened to Amba at the ceremony and Yaksha's birth are disappearing one by one. Even Sita's father vanishes, leaving only a patch of his hair covered in blood by the river. One of the men's bodies is found but it is completely drained of all of its blood.

Shortly after, Sita meets and marries Rama. Within a year, they have a daughter. One night while sleeping, Sita wakens to the sound of nails scraping on a blade. She exits her home to find Yaksha. Yaksha tries to convince Sita to exchange blood with him so they can be together forever or he will kill Rama and their daughter. Sita agrees—selling her soul to the devil's son—Yaksha.

Chapter 3 Analysis

Alias goes back to the beginning. She reveals to the reader exactly how the vampire race was born. She infers that the vampire race has an evil beginning because it is started when the son of the devil takes on a human form. This also explains why Alisa seems to be slightly on the evil side, but also has a conscience and a good side to her. It is because she was a human that was turned into a vampire by exchanging her blood



with the son of the devil, Yaksha. Because Alisa insinuates that she is the last of the vampires, it suggests that something happens to Yaksha during some point in history that kills him, or at least removes him from Earth and human interaction.



Chapter 4 Summary

Ray wakes Lara, knocking on the door. She invites him in and they drink a glass of wine before moving the furniture. A couple of hours later, Lara lures Ray out into the hot tub. They start to make out as they sit in the hot tub naked. As they sit in front of the fire in the living room, they talk while they are finishing the bottle of wine. Lara tells him to call her Sita, which she says is a nickname her father used to call her. They start to talk about Ray's dad. Lara senses that Ray has heightened senses as well. Ray admits that his father has been gone for three days without calling and that he's a little worried. He says his father was working on a big case that is supposed to pay a lot of money. He mentions that the password on his father's computer is Ray's nickname from when he was a kid. Lara convinces Ray to go check out the files on his father's computer to figure out where his dad is, and that she'll go with him.

Chapter 4 Analysis

Ray and Lara have a strong connection and bond. This could be foreshadowing that the bond stems from the fact that Lara is actually Sita and that Ray is actually Rama. Ray definitely seems to have an inner sense that there is something different about Lara. Lara has a way of convincing Ray to do and say things without inhibition, which might be part of her powers as a vampire. She is even able to convince Ray to do exactly why she asked for his help in the first place—to get him to unlock his father's computer so she can read his files and find out who put Riley up to researching her and why.



Chapter 5 Summary

They stop at Ray's house to see if his father left a message before heading to his office. When they get to the office, Lara notices minute drops of blood that have seeped into the cracks of the tile that she'll have to return to clean. She pays attention as Ray types in the password, RAYGUN, into the computer. He pulls up the Alisa Perne file. As he closes the file. Lara convinces Ray she hears a noise outside and sends him to investigate. He tells her to lock the door behind him. She pulls her file back up and uses diskettes in Riley's desk to start copying her file. She pretends like the door is stuck when Ray returns so she can finish copying the file. She deletes the remainder of the file, except for the first page.

When Lara opens the door, Ray pulls the file back up. He says it's strange because the file seems cut off and is only one page. It says who hired his father to investigate this Alisa Perne, but the rest of the contact information is cut off. While Ray seems suspicious of Lara, he doesn't say anything.

After Ray drops her off, she heads to her mansion to read the diskettes on her computer. She finds out that Mr. Slim hired Riley three months ago. Slim has a fax number, which is in Switzerland. The faxes from Slim are not in the file, but Riley's notes are. She finds out that Slim tells Riley he wants to know about Alisa's financial and family situations, and warns him that she is much more dangerous than she appears. Additionally, Slim wants to know if anyone associated with Alisa has died a violent death recently. Slim offers to pay Riley \$10,000 to start his investigation, and might hire him to investigate two other women in the region.

Riley finds a law firm that handles Alisa's account. They rebuff his inquiry to have them manage his finances as a potential client, so he thinks they solely handle Alisa's affairs. Riley talks about withholding information from Slim and about approaching Alisa himself to see how much she will pay to keep him quiet. Between September when he notes this and November when he contacts Alisa, she discovers that he found out about her passports that date back longer than Alisa has been alive, and that her gardener was brutally murdered. Alisa killed the gardener because he peeped into her windows and saw more than she wanted him to know.

Riley sends a final fax to Slim, cutting off their ties, and then changes his fax number. Riley indicates that he will arm himself when he meets with Alisa and that he'll ask her for a million dollars and will give it to Ray.

Alisa sends Slim a fax saying that she knows about him hiring Riley and that she is happy to meet with him in person. Slim replies that he is available to meet to night and asks when and where. Alisa sends back another fax with the place and time.



Chapter 5 Analysis

Slim telling Riley that he might hire him to investigate a couple of other women implies that there are other women like Alisa—vampires. Obviously, Alisa doesn't know that these other women exist, but it might be some of the people that Alisa is interacting with in Mayfair, the small Oregon town where she is now living. Alias correctly assumes that when Riley tried to cut off ties that Slim came from Switzerland to more closely watch Riley. Since Slim indicates to Alisa that he is available to meet tonight, Alisa confirms that he is not in Switzerland, but is local now.



Chapter 6 Summary

Alisa arrives at the pier, the meeting place, before Slim arrives. She is armed with guns and a knife. With her acute sense of hearing, she hears a limo pull up about a mile way. She hears the setting of a rifle in the distance too. A few minutes later, a white limo pulls up to the pier. An armed man and an armed woman step out. Alisa and Slim greet each other, and Alisa realizes that he doesn't know she is a vampire. She also realizes that Slim reports to someone else. Slim tells Alisa if she comes with him that she can meet his boss.

Alisa agrees to go but they make her wear handcuffs and a blindfold. They get into the limo and the other limo pulls up with other men to follow behind them. As they are driving into town, Alisa convinces them to stop to allow her to use the bathroom. Slim and the woman accompany her into the bathroom and she instantly strikes at Slim and kills the woman. She takes Slim hostage by escaping through the wall behind the toilet that leads to the gas station attendant's office and out the front door.

Alisa runs at top speed through the trees with Slim in tow. The men behind her are firing their guns and she is shot in the butt. When she reaches a stopping point in the forest, she rips the bullet out with her nails and the wound starts to heal. She gets Slim to admit that his boss is Rick Graham. He hired Slim to find Alisa. Rick knew what she looked like and what her lifestyle would be like but did not know her name. Alisa admits that she is a vampire and she asks what Rick looks like. Slim says he has piercing blue eyes like Alisa's.

Alias thinks she knows who Rick is even though she thought he was dead all of this time. She kills Slim and drinks his blood.

Chapter 6 Analysis

Alias thinks she knows who is looking for her. The story infers that her father is looking for her because he has the same eyes as Alisa. It could also be Yaksha looking for her because it mentions that he too has piercing blue eyes in an earlier chapter of the novel. Even though Rick Graham knows Alisa's description and the lifestyle she leads, it doesn't explain how they would be able to find her out of the all of the women and all of the places in the world she could be living.



Chapter 7 Summary

While Alisa is burying Slim's body under the stream, she can hear the police arriving at the gas station and having a shootout with the limo boys. The boys win and drive off. She finds a payphone, calls information and calls Seymour. When he answers, Lara tells him she needs him to come and get her and bring a change of clothes. She tells him not to tell his parents and asks why he's awake. He says he just woke up from a dream he was having about her.

Seymour arrives an hour later, astonished when he sees Lara covered in blood. She says someone attacked her and that's all she'll say. She strips down naked, gets a towel from Seymour to wipe the blood off, and then changes into the clothes he brought. She buries her bloody clothes but keeps her keys and Slim's wallet that she removed from his pants' pocket.

As they drive away toward Lara's car at the pier, Seymour tells Lara about his dream. He dreams she is warrior goddess on a battlefield full of demons. She has a long flickering tongue, which the same thing the demon that possessed Amba's body had. As the Lara in Seymour's dream walks around the battlefield, she is collecting demon heads and making a necklace out of them. The demons that are not dead - she slices open their throats with her nails and drinks their blood. Lara thinks that the dream is a metaphor for her entire night and that Seymour definitely has a supernatural ability and has formed a bond with her.

He says a birdlike vulture appears in the sky and that the dream Lara seems afraud of it. Lara tells Seymour that the vulture is the symbol of a forsaken ending. Alisa feels as if Yaksha is circling her, but also feels as if her God, Krishna is nearby too. She wonders what Krishna promised Yaksha, too.

Lara confronts Seymour about his dying from AIDS. He wonders how she knows it, but says that he had a blood transfusion from a car accident a few years ago. Since Seymour likes to write, she asks him to write a story about her dome day. She says she'll read it if she ever gets the chance to do so.

Chapter 7 Analysis

Seymour's sense and Lara being drawn to him suggest that Seymour is either a vampire or has some kind of special connection to Lara. Seymour's dream seems to be a premonition. He is dreaming of how events are to unfold for Lara, starting with her battle tonight. It seems as if the God, Krishna, might have struck some kind of deal with Sita and Yaksha. It sounds as if Krishna promised to set Sita free from Yaksha if Sita keeps up her side of the bargain. Alisa is now wondering if Krishna also struck a deal with Yaksha as well.



Chapter 8 Summary

When she gets to her car, Alisa speeds off to her mansion at a hundred miles per hour, leaving Seymour behind. She believes that she has to get to Ray because Yaksha is using Ray to get to Alisa. Alias admits she doesn't know why he is using Ray because Yaksha knows her vulnerabilities.

When Lara gets to Ray's house, Pat answers the door and tries to stop Lara from coming in. Lara calls out to Ray and he comes downstairs. Ray convinces Pat to go upstairs because Lara insists on talking to Ray alone. When Pat is gone, Lara admits to not being totally honest with him. He says he knows because the file size was much larger when he left than when he returned.

Lara admits that she is Alisa Perne. She says the man that hired his father abducted her tonight and that she thinks they might be after Ray. too. She tells him that his father didn't part on good terms with his employer.

She convinces Ray to return to her mansion with her. He is surprised by her Ferrari and the mansion. On the way to the house, she tells him what she can of the truth, including that she is a vampire. When they return to the house, she and Ray make love and she sends Ray into a deep sleep. As she looks at Ray, she sees Krishna in him.

Chapter 8 Analysis

Alisa confirms to the reader that she believes Yaksha is alive and after her. She believes that Rick Graham is Yaksha's current identity. The promise Krishna made to Sita is to protect her if she believes in him. Therefore, she believes that having Ray with her when Yaksha attacks will protect them both because Ray has Krishna inside of him—even though he doesn't know it.



Chapter 9 Summary

Sita returns to a village with Yaksha. She is a vampire, but doesn't fully realize it at this point. She is sensitive to light but has not yet realized her craving for blood. She enjoys the nights now and with her heightened senses she goes to Yaksha and tells him of the pain she feels in her chest and her fear that she's dying. He tells her the only way to stop the pain is to drink blood. At the same time he tells Sita she is sterile and unable to have children now.

About a month later, Yaksha brings Sita the body of a boy with his necked vein already ripped open. She drinks blood for the first time and is taken by the feeling that she drinks until the boy dies. Although she is sad, the killings coming easily after this. They move from village to village, transforming others into vampires and killing.

They hear of a man named Krishna, that supposedly has greater powers than even Yaksha. As the clan approaches the village where Krishna lives, they attacked by arrows. The arrows kill many of them, even the first girl that Sita turned into a vampire. Retreating to the woods, Yaksha and Sita come upon Radha, one of Krishna's consorts. They take her hostage and agree to set her free only if Krishna meets Yaksha in combat.

Krishna sends word back to Yaksha about where to meet and his conditions for combat. Krishna choose the battle to be the two men in snake of pits playing their flutes. Whoever tames the snakes and keeps them from biting and killing him wins. Krshna wins because Yaksha ultimately shows fear and the snakes start to attack him. Krishna has Yaksha pulled from the pit. He tells Sita that wherever his love is there is his grace. He whispers something in Yaksha's ear. Yaksha agrees and Krishna heals his wounds. Yaksha won't tell Sita what Krishna said to him. and Sita won't tell Yaksha what Krishna said to her.

Shortly after, Yaksha starts hunting down and killing the vampires that are across the globe. He leaves Sita alone, however. Later, word reaches Sita that Yaksha was thought to be a witch, so he was burned at the stake.

Chapter 9 Analysis

Yaksha and Krishna symbolize the bad and the good side of things—the dark side and the light side. Both men have immense powers. Yaksha has dark powers and uses his powers for evil. Krishna possesses light powers and uses his powers for good.



Chapter 10 Summary

Ray wakes as the sun is setting. Sita tells him he must leave so that he will remain alive. She can feel Yaksha is on his way. To get Ray to leave, she tells him the truth about his father. He doesn't want to believe her because he says he loves her and she loves him. She says he reminds her of her husband Rama. When Sita hears the sad song of the flute down by the ocean, she sees Yaksha's figure and knows it's too late. Against Ray's protests, Sita goes down to talk to Yaksha alone.

Yaksha admits that he is there to kill her because of the vow he made to Krishna. He promised to kill the evil he created and Krishna would grace him. Yaksha admits that he hasn't killed Sita before because he loves her and it made him happy to know that her beauty was somewhere out in the world. Yaksha says he knows how much Sita loves Ray. He says she has one night, which is the length of time it takes to make a vampire. When she refuses, she watches as Yaksha plays a note that shatters the glass window Ray is leaning against in he house. Sita watches as he falls to the ground. Part III, Chapter 3 Analysis

Since the military cops don't check Andy's car or trunk for him to get past security on the compound, it foreshadows Sita hiding in the trunk of Andy's car in order to access the building where they are holding Joel. Additionally, the fact that Andy has a vampire DNA model indicates that he has been studying vampires for awhile. This means that even though Sita thought she and Yaksha were the only living vampires, she was wrong.



Part III, Chapter 4 Summary

Sita talks about when she was living in the 13th century. She met a priest of the Catholic church that was also an alchemist. They fall in love with each other, even though the priest and alchemist, Arturo Evola, is not allowed to be with women. One day, Sita saves the life of a little boy that fell off a roof and crushed his spine. Arturo sees what she did, so she tells him what she is. Arturo suggests that they make hybrid humans—half vampire, half human—using her blood. He says he even has the power to turn her back into a human so that she can have another child.

Part III, Chapter 4 Analysis

Since Arturo Evola is the only other person Sita has ever known to know of the vampire DNA, it infers that Andrew Kane is Arturo Evola. It would explain how he has the DNA model in his home and why it seems as if there are other vampires roaming the Earth that Sita was not aware of before.



Part III, Chapter 5 Summary

Sita heads to the compound in her new Jeep to study the layout from the outside. She is astonished by the amount of security the base has. She watches as an aircraft she's never seen before lands on the landing strip. Using the Geiger counter she has, she notices that the radiation is at three times the other levels here. Some soldiers drive by in a cart and she can tell that they are transporting some kind of thermonuclear missile.

He is still pondering how Andy Kane has the knowledge of the vampire DNA, just as Arturo Evola once did. As Sita starts to leave, she notices her skin is glowing once again. She rushes to her Jeep and drives away. She pulls off the road and stands naked in an area off the road. She notices that her skin is translucent.

The reason the compound has such high security is because they are conducting supernatural experiments, possibly trying to create superhumans. Andy Kane having the same knowledge as Arturo Evola from the 13th century indicates that Andy Kane is Arturo. Sita's skin turning translucent form her exposure to the radiation from the compound implies they are working on a formula to make people invisible.



Part III, Chapter 6 Summary

Sita is Lara Adams again, the name she used to enroll at Mayfair High two months ago. She enters the casino and stands next to Andrew Kane while he is gambling. Sita can control the dice when she rolls them, so she puts the numbers she wants to come up in her before throwing the dice. As the night wears on, she and Andy win a lot of money. After too many drinks, Sita lures Andy to the Mirage coffee shop for some food. Andy tells her he is "mad scientist." He mentions a little about his work, saying that something isn't being fully exploited at work and that they need disciplines from all over the world to truly exploit it. He says he likes Lara and he feels like they have met before.

Part III, Chapter 6 Analysis

Sita is using her powers to get Andy to like her. Once she gets him to like her, she plans to use him to rescue Joel. The reason Andy feels as if he and Lara Adams have met before is that Andy is Arturo and Lara is Sita.



Part III, Chapter 7 Summary

Lara and Andy return to Andy's house. Andy is more sober now, but he starts drinking again when they arrive. The booze loosens Andy's tongue so he tells Lara more about his work. He ends up telling her that they are working on a DNA experimenting, where they are altering DNA. Andy says he started working on the project about a month ago, which means he's been working on it longer than Eddie was a vampire.

Sita thinks one of Eddie's vampire's must have made another vampire without Eddie knowing. She thinks this vampire was captured by the government. Lara tells Andy to meet her at her hotel room the next night so they can gamble and have a late dinner. He says he likes Lara because he can trust her.

Part III, Chapter 7 Analysis

Although Sita thought she was the only vampire, it is proving not to be the truth. Ironically, Andy trusts the one person that is trying to use him. Sita's plan to free Joel is going to be more complicated now that there is more than one vampire in the government's possession.



Part III, Chapter 8 Summary

Sita recounts how she gave Arturo her blood in exchange for being able to hold her daughter in her arms again. After Arturo takes Sita's blood, she convinces him to break his vow and make love to her. Arturo starts experimenting with crystals and Sita's blood on a street boy that is also retarded. Arturo is able to transform the boy into a normal boy. This represents his ability to change the mind.

Next, Arturo experiments on a woman with leprosy. A few days after the transformation, her fingers and toes start to grow back. Even though they tell her not to tell anyone, the woman tells everyone. This causes rumors to spread. After this, Arturo only experiments on the retarded, dead and blind.

It is at this time that Arturo starts building the vampiric DNA model. He realizes if he can conjoin the two DNA makeups—human and vampire—that he can create the perfect human being. Arturo wants to experiment on Ralphe.

Sita can't find Ralphe anywhere one day. When she asks Arturo about it, he says he doesn't know where Ralphe is. Sita can tell he isn't lying but he isn't telling the whole truth either. that night, she goes out hunting for blood and hears blood curdling screams. She finds five bodies with their limbs torn off. She goes to the one woman who is still alive. As the woman is dying, she says it was demon child that looks like an angel that did this to them. Sita knows the woman is talking about Ralphe.

She hears more screams across town. She finds more victims, but this time she finds witnesses. An angry mob is heading into the woods to go after Ralphe. Sita finds Ralphe first. When Ralphe starts to nibble on Sita, she breaks his neck and kills him.

The villagers find her cradling Ralphe. They recognize that she and the priest cared for Ralphe. They imprison both of them. Sita testifies against Arturo and they burn Arturo at the stake, like any witch.

Part III, Chapter 8 Analysis

Sita compares herself to Frankenstein because she says she is the modern day Frankenstein—a creation. Arturo's plan to transform human beings is beyond what Sita knows and believes. She foreshadows that his experimentation leads to something more sinister than even she could have dreamed up on her own. Sita likens Arturo wanting to create the perfect human being with the goal of Hitler to create the perfect human race.



Part III, Chapter 9 Summary

Lara Adams is gambling at a table with a rich Texan. She ends up winning all of his money. She invites him and his buddies to come with her and she'll give him his \$50,000 back. When she gets the group of men to the desert, she admits she is a vampire. She ends up allowing three of the armed men escape. She keeps, feeds on, and kills the rich Texan.

Part III, Chapter 9 Analysis

Sita has to keep up her appearances as Lara Adams. She also has to entertain herself until Andy shows up for their date tonight. Additionally, she needs blood to build up her strength. She will needs all the strength she has once she convinces Andy to help her break into the compound and free Joel.



Part III, Chapter 10 Summary

When Sita gets back to her hotel suite, she calls Seymour. She admits that Seymour is her psychic twin. He often knows what is happening to Sita at the time it is happening. When she asks Seymour about any stories he's writing about her, he says he was writing a story about her being an angel.

Sita tells Seymour everything that has been happening, including how she had to turn Joel into a vampire to save his life. She also says she feels like she is missing something, but can't figure out what it is. Seymour insists that Sita has to take out the general when she first gets into the compound, even before she frees Joel. He says the general is the key to making her plan work.

Seymour also insists that Sita practice her new power of levitation. He insists that she doesn't know when that trick might come in handy. Seymour also tries to convince Sita to turn him into a vampire a couple of times. She insists Seymour is not vampire material.

Part III, Chapter 10 Analysis

Sita's skin glowing and her thoughts of possibly blowing up the compound with a nuclear bomb could explain why Seymour has a vision of Sita flying in the air and giving her the appearance of an angel. While Seymour doesn't know exactly what danger Sita faces by trying to break into the compound, telling her she has to control the general to control the situation foreshadows that Andy is the general and that Andy is also Arturo.



Part III, Chapter 11 Summary

Andy arrives in Sita's suite. He kisses her hard and tries to push her to do more, but she is able to stop him. She convinces him she wants to go downstairs and gamble first. They go downstairs to gamble and after a few rounds, Andy is drunk. Sita thinks she is unable to read his thoughts because of the booze scrambling his brain.

They head to another casino and continue to gamble. When they return to the hotel suite, Andy starts to complain about his job. He tells her too much—even how they are trying to clone something that could be very dangerous. This is when Sita takes control of Andy and admits that she is a vampire. She tells him that Joel, the prisoner, is her friend.

She demands that Andy help her get into the compound so she can rescue Joel. She gets Andy to admit that they have another vampire in custody. He says they picked him up about a month ago. Andy says that Joel is sick. When he describes the symptoms, Sita tells Andy Joel is sick because he needs blood. Andy ends up telling Sita where they have Joel and what kind of cell he is in.

Part III, Chapter 11 Analysis

The real reason Sita cannot read Andy's thoughts is because he is Arturo. As Arturo, he knows vampires inside and out so he is able to block his mind from being read by Sita. It is suspicious that Andy shares all of this information freely with Sita. She is not even compelling him or hypnotizing him into telling her these things. It seems as if it is a trap to imprison Sita as well. If Andy is Arturo, then he would want to freely share this information with her so that he can take her prisoner to pay her back for what she did to him during the Inquisition.



Part III, Chapter 12 Summary

Sita has a dream where she is talking to Krishna. Krishna tells Sita a story about a fishermen that will only eat fish. One day, his wife disguises lamb inside the scales of the fish. Her husband eats it and starts to have a reaction to what he is eating. He asks his wife what it is and she says it's some fish mixed with lamb. As he dies, he tells his wife, doesn't she know who he is.

Krishna says the man's body changes right in front of his wife. He turns into a fish. As a big fish, all he can eat is smaller fish.

Part III, Chapter 12 Analysis

Krishna is using Sita's dream as a way to communicate with Sita. Krishna is trying to warn her about her impending invasion of the compound. He is trying to tell her that the truth is right in front of her, but she has to look more closely at what is hidden beneath the surface. In short, Krishna is trying to tell her that Andy is Arturo.



Part III, Chapter 13 Summary

Lara is in Andy's trunk. She's dressed in a scientist coat and is equipped with a name badge and card to open doors to get out of the compound. Her story is that she is Dr. Lara Adams visiting from the Pentagon — because scientists from the Pentagon have been visiting lately.

Once she gets into the compound, she goes straight to the general's house. He isn't home. She goes down to the cell where they're keeping Joel. She sees the monitor on Joel but not on the vampire in the adjacent cell.

Sita compels the guards and makes them collapse. She enters the cell where Joel is. As the door slams shut behind her, Joel yells out no to her. it's too late though. Now Sita is trapped with Joel. Andy comes on the monitor to talk to Sita and right away she sees what she has missed the entire time. Andy is Arturo.

Part III, Chapter 13 Analysis

Sita doesn't see the monitor on the other vampire's cell because there isn't another vampire. Andy-Arturo made it up. It is as Krishna tells Sita in her dream. Arturo was standing in plain sight, right in front of her the entire time, as Andy. She just didn't see it until it was too late.



Part III, Chapter 14 Summary

Sita pieces together all of the clues that should have led her to the conclusion that Arturo and Andy are one in the same. Sita apologizes to Joel—taking the blame for the situation they are in. One of the first things Sita does is feed Joel some of her blood. It makes him feel a little better. She can't give him too much because she needs as much strength as possible to get them out.

She admits to Joel that she and the man on the monitor go way back but she doesn't go into detail. Sita and Arturo speak to each other through the speaker in the cell. She tries to convince Arturo not to continue with his plan or he's just going to end up creating a bunch of Ralphes—monsters.

Arturo admits that he did experiment on himself and that is why he is still alive. He admits to never reaching full hybrid status from his experimentation. He tells Sita he created Ralphe by allowing the full light of the sun to shine through her vial of blood while Ralphe was on the copper sheet. Arturo asks for and says he needs Sita's blood. Sita says he'll have to come and get it, and no amount of guards or bullets will kill her.

Part III, Chapter 14 Analysis

Arturo is so hung up on creating his hybrid that he is about to repeat mistakes he has made before. Instead of learning from his mistake, Arturo is about to conduct a similar experiment to went awry when he did it during the Inquisition with Ralphe. If Arturo somehow overtakes Sita to obtain her blood and completes his experiment, the city might be running amuck with monsters like Ralphe.



Part III, Chapter 15 Summary

Inside the cell, Sita is using her powers to influence the thoughts of the three guards covering the cell from an exterior office. She is formulating a plan to make the guards fear her, believing she will kill them, so that she use this to her advantage when she breaks out of the cell. Sita is successful in making two out of the three guards deathly afraid of her and her abilities.

Sita whispers to Joel that she is making a plan. She tells him to follow her lead. As she plants in the minds of the guards that she is coming for them, she is also compelling the general to come to the building where the cell is. Arturo is warning the general that he shouldn't do anything that opens the cell door because if he does then Sita will act.

While reading the general's mind, Sita knows that he plans to use her blood for himself and to dispose of Arturo. The general also has fantasies of raping Sita. Armed soldiers start to surround the cell door. Sita breaks all of the lights in the area with her mind powers so that there is total darkness. As Arturo begs the general not to open the door, he does. Sita takes the first guard hostage. She tells him she won't kill him if he puts on a good act. Sita and the guard pretend as if she is ripping his heart out. She opens one of his veins and splatters his blood outside the door, but doesn't truly harm him.

When Sita takes the second guard hostage, she mutilates him. In the end, she kills eight of the soldiers and guards in the hall. The general and Arturo escape to the second floor of the building but Sita takes Joel and goes after them.

Part III, Chapter 15 Analysis

Sita is using psychology to make her escape. When she convinces the guards that she is coming after them, she is also able to lure the general and Arturo into the building. She is putting the pieces in place to escape from the cell. Ultimately, her goal is to destroy both Arturo and the general, so that neither of them can make the hybrids and destroy the world.



Part III, Chapter 16 Summary

On the path that Sita and Joel continue through the building and the compound, Sita continues to kill soldiers. Joel begs her to stop. They make it through the maze that leads into another prison. Sita turns the lights on so that Joel can see better and the general can see the carnage she has caused.

Sita barters with the general, who is now in the same room as Sita and Joel, to give her a nuclear bomb. The general has the bomb wheel out on the railroad cart near where he is sitting. When the general refuses to give Sita the code to set the bomb to detonate, Sita grabs him by the throat and forces the general to look into her eyes—the eyes of the witch that's going to kill him.

Part III, Chapter 16 Analysis

Sita intends on blowing up the compound with the nuclear bomb. She knows she has to destroy the vampire blood vials so that nobody can get their hands on them or the notes from Arturo's experiment. In addition, Sita also knows that she has to kill the general and Arturo so that they don't repeat their work and the experiments. Sita is also willing to sacrifice her own life and Joel's life as collateral damage if it saves the world.



Part III, Chapter 17 Summary

The bomb is set to detonate in 15 minutes. As time ticks down, Sita demands that the general command some of the soldiers to go. She is trying to diminish the amount of lives that are lost from the explosion. Arturo tries to continue to convince Sita to stop the bomb and allow him to create the perfect hybrid.

Part III, Chapter 17 Analysis

Yaksha's blood flowing through her, and possibly Krishna's grace, save Sita's life. She is meant to outlive the explosion. Krishna must have a higher purpose for her, allowing her to live. There is foreshadowing of Sita flying to Arturo's home. Since Arturo told her that everything she needs to make herself human again is in his basement, it foreshadows her experimenting on herself to turn herself back into a human again. Additionally, this means she will be able to have another child, which is why she had agreed to help Arturo back during the Inquisition.



Epilogue

Epilogue Summary

Sita arrives at Arturo's home and finds everything she needs in his basement to make herself human again. Sita calls Seymour and tells him her plan. Sita sets everything up and positions herself on the copper sheeting. She closes her eyes and feels the magic as it begins.

When Sita wakes up, she feels strange and different. There is a pounding in her head. There is also someone pounding on the front door upstairs. She groggily makes her way to the front door. When Sita calls out to see who it is, the man responds that it's her darling. She recognizes the voice, but it doesn't sound like Seymour. He tells her to open the door, but she wonders if she should.

Epilogue Analysis

It seems as if Sita has made herself human again, but the novel ends before she confirms this either way. There is also no indication who is at the front door. It could one of several lovers that Sita has had over the years. The ending of the novel is the perfect way to set up the beginning of the second novel in the "Thirst" series.



Characters

Alisa Perne/Sita/Lara Adams

Alisa Perne is the main character and narrator of the novel. She is a vampire that is five thousand years old. In her current body, she is a pretty blonde girl. She looks like she is about 19 or 20 years old. Alisa has a lot of money, secret bank accounts and business managers spread out across the world to maintain her accounts and different identities, in case someone gets too close to finding out she is a vampire.

When Alisa was first transformed into a vampire, her name was Sita. Periodically, throughout the novel, Alisa reveals her true identity as Sita to some of the other characters. Primarily, she reveals her real name to the few men she falls in love with over the years, including Arturo, Ray and Joel. As Sita, she made a vow to her God, Krishna, not to create anymore vampires, so she tries to live out her years without breaking her promise. Some of the situations that unfold in the novel cause Sita to have to break her vow for the overall good.

When Sita has to go undercover as a high school student, she changes her identity to Lara Adams. She uses the identity again when she is on the run in Las Vegas and trying to free her love, Joel Drake, a former FBA agent she has to turn into a vampire in order to save his life. Lara Adams is a red-head and the orphan daughter of a rich father who left all his money to his only daughter.

Detective Michael Riley

Detective Michael Riley is a private detective. He contacts Sita, saying that he wants to meet with her. When the detective meets with Sita, he says his client hired him to check into Alisa Perne's background. Riley is trying to uncover how such a young girl can have so much money but not trace where the money came from. He also mentions that there are some inconsistencies in her past.

Alisa tries to force out of Riley who his client is and why he hired him to check into Alisa. When Riley tries to blackmail Alisa instead, Alisa kills Riley. In the process, Alisa finds out Riley has a son that is in high school. She thinks the son, Ray Riley, might be able to help her figure out the password on his father's computer, so she can access his files and find out who hired Riley to check into her background.

Alisa buries Riley's body under a lake in the woods. Riley keeps copious notes in the file on his computer. When Sita accesses it, she finds out that Riley was hired by someone named Slim, but that Riley decided it would be more lucrative to blackmail Alisa than continue to work for Slim. Riley intended on using the money to send his only son, Ray, to college.



Ray Riley

Ray Riley is Michael Riley's teenage son. Ray is very attractive and sweet. He is also an athlete at school. Ray first meets Alisa as Lara Adams in history class at the high school Lara enrolls in to meet Ray. She feels an instant connection with Ray because he reminds her of her husband before she became a vampire.

Ray and Lara end up falling in love. Ray also finds out Lara's true identity, Sita. When Yaksha returns to kill Sita, Yaksha causes Ray to fall out of a second story window, fatally wounding Ray. In order to save his life, Ray agrees to allow Sita to transform him into a vampire.

While Ray is with Sita in L.A. trying to stop a rogue vampire, he sacrifices his own life by setting on fire a warehouse that is full of all the known vampires recently created by the rogue vampire, Eddie.

Pat McQueen

Pat McQueen is Ray's teenage girlfriend. She is rather plain. She doesn't have fancy clothes or wear a lot of makeup. Pat and Ray are truly in love, however. Pat feels as if Lara Adams is trying to move in on her relationship with Ray. Pat thinks Ray dies in the explosion at Lara's home, which is how they cover up the fact that Ray is now a vampire. Lara is heartbroken when she thinks Ray dies.

Yaksha

Yaksha is the baby that was born in Sita's village from a dead woman while a priest is performing a ritual over her body. Sita believes Yaksha is a demon child. Yaksha is given to Sita's aunt to raise as her own. Yaksha grows up faster than normal until he is a big strong man.

Sita believes Yaksha is responsible for killing each of the villagers, including her own father, that was present the night Yaksha was born. She later finds out Yaksha was turning them into vampires, and killing the ones that didn't agree to become vampires.

Yaksha comes to transform Sita into a vampire shortly after Sita marries Rama and gives birth to her daughter, Lalita. Yaksha agrees to allow Rama and Lalita to live if Sita comes with him and lives as a vampire. When Yaksha enters a contest with Krishna, Yaksha loses, so he vows not make any more vampires. Sita and Yaksha part ways, but it is Yaksha that is responsible for finding out about Alisa because he wants to kill her and take his own life at the same time.



Slim

Slim is in the man that supposedly hired Michael Riley to look into Alisa Perne and her background. Slim is using a Swiss fax number to correspond with Riley. When Alisa faxes a message to Slim, he agrees to meet her in a town near where Alisa is living. Slim tries to take Alisa hostage, but when he does, Alisa is able to kill him and get away from Slim and his entourage.

Krishna

Krishna is Sita's God. He plays a flute and seems to be a soulful person when she meets him as Sita. Krishna is the one that challenges Yaksha in a snake pit and wins the challenge. He makes both Yaksha and Sita vow not to make anymore vampires. He makes Yaksha make an additional vow, which is to kill all of the existing vampires.

Throughout the novel, Sita often thinks of things Krishna says to her to help get her through situations. Sita also has many dreams where Krishna appears and talks to her to help her figure out the situation she is in.

Joel Drake

Joel Drake is an FBI agent that is in charge of investigating the rash of mysterious murders in Los Angeles. This is how Joel and Alisa originally meet. When Joel follows Alisa to the Fender residence, where Eddie lives with his mother, Joel exposes himself to Eddie Fender. Later, Eddie takes Joel hostage because Eddie knows that Alisa cares for Joel. Alisa tells Joel her real name and that she's a vampire. Against his choice, she turns Joel into a vampire to save his life after Eddie tries to kill Joel.

When Sita and Joel are trying to escape the police, they fly in to the Nevada desert. Joel is captured by the military, where they take him to a compound and conduct experiments on him. Sita is trying to break Joel out of the compound when she ends up blowing it up with the nuclear bomb. Joel dies in the explosion.

Eddie Fender

Eddie Fender is an employee at the morgue where Yaksha's body is taken after the explosion at Sita's house. It turns out that Eddie finds Yaksha still alive in the woods around Sita's house, but Yaksha's legs are blown off. when Eddie finds out Yaksha is a vampire, Eddie starts drawing Yaksha's blood and injecting it into himself to turn himself into a vampire.

Eddie is the one responsible for turning more people into vampires around LA. These same vampires are the ones responsible for the rash of murders in LA. Sita ends up killing Eddie by chopping his head off in the walk-in freezer at the Fender residence.



Arturo/Andy Kane

Arturo is a priest during the Inquisition. Sita meets him during this time. Arturo is also an alchemist. When he finds out that Sita is a vampire, he tries to conduct an experiment to create a hybrid—part human and part vampire. When he experiments on a young orphan boy, Ralphe, he turns Ralphe into a killing monster that ends up getting Sita and Arturo caught and tried as witches.

Arturo returns later as Andy Kane. Andy Kane is a "mad scientist" who is working with the military. In her disguise as Lara Adams, Sita doesn't recognize Arturo, so she uses her disguise to get close to Andy. Her plan is to break Joel out using Andy as her inside source. It isn't until after Arturo has lured and trapped Sita in Joel's cell with him that Sita recognizes that Andy is Arturo.

Seymour Dorsten

Seymour Dorsten is a nerdy high school student Sita meets when she is enrolled as Lara Adams. Seymour has AIDS from a blood transfusion he had after a car accident. Seymour turns out to be Sita's psychic twin. He has dreams that are about Sita, what is happening to her and what is going to happen to her. Seymour is also a writer, so he turns these dreams and Sita's experiences into stories.

Sita tells Seymour who she really is. She has gives him a blood transfusion and he is cured of AIDS, but she does not turn him into a vampire. Throughout the novel, Sita calls Seymour or goes to him for advice and to help her see the situation she is in from a new light. At the end of the novel, Sita calls Seymour before she attempts the experiment to turn herself back into a human.



Objects/Places

Mayfair, Oregon

Mayfair, Oregon is a relatively small town in Oregon. It is the primary setting when the novel opens. Mayfair is where Alisa is living when Detective Riley starts investigating her. it is also the town where Alisa enrolls in high school as Lara Adams.

Mayfair High

Mayfair High School is where Alisa enrolls as Lara Adams, a high school student that just moved to the area. The high school is where Lara meets Ray Riley, Detective Riley's son. Additionally, Lara meets Seymour Dorsten, who turns out to be Alisa's psychic twin.

Alisa Perne File

The Alisa Perne file is a file that Detective Riley has on his work computer. Alisa enrolls in the high school to get to know Ray Riley. Her hopes are to have Ray help her unlock his father's computer so Alisa can read the file. Once Alisa gets her hands on the computer file, she is able to track down Slim, the man who hired Riley to look into Alisa's background and financials.

Los Angeles, California

Alisa Perne jets off to Los Angeles, California to investigate a rash of murders taking place in the city. The reason she wants to investigate is the bodies are completely drained of blood—insinuating there is a vampire on the loose. While Alisa is in Los Angeles, she meets Agent Joel Drake of the FBI. Alias returns to Los Angeles to continue her investigation. It's while she is in Los Angeles that she tracks down Eddie Fender as the rogue vampire, where Ray ends up getting killed and where Sita has to turn Joel into a vampire in order to save his life. A police chase ensues from Los Angeles to Nevada when Sita and Joel escape from police custody.

Las Vegas, Nevada

The primary setting for the third part of the novel is Las Vegas, Nevada. Sita crash lands the helicopter Joel and she are on into Lake Meade. This is where the military captures Joel and Sita is forced to try to break Joel out of the compound. Las Vegas is also where Sita meets Andy, who turns out to be Arturo. Finally, Las Vegas is where Sita blows up the compound with a nuclear bomb and tries to turn herself back into a human with Arturo's equipment and supplies.



Blood Vials

Throughout the novel, blood vials are present. Especially at the end of the novel, blood vials are a pivotal point of the storyline because Andy/Arturo is taking vials of Joel's blood to try to complete his experiment to create a hybrid. At the end of the novel, a blood vial, copper sheeting and lighting is what Sita uses to try to turn herself back into a human.

Compound

The military compound is where Joel is taken when he is captured. Sita spends much time evaluating the compound's security so she can break in and get Joel out. When Sita does find her way into the compound, she ends up taking Arturo and the general hostage. Ultimately, it leads to Sita flying away as the compound explodes from a nuclear bomb.

Copper Sheet

The copper sheet is one of the primary supplies Arturo uses in his transformations. Sita lies on a copper sheet in Andy's basement when she tries to transform herself back into a human. The copper sheets is the conductor in the transformations, along with the vial of vampire blood, a crystal and a light source.

Helicopter

Sita steals a helicopter while on the run in Los Angeles. She uses the helicopter to whisk Joel and herself off to Nevada. Military and police helicopters are also in pursuit of she and Joel throughout the chase. Sita ends up crashing the helicopter into Lake Meade to make the military and police think she dies.

Nuclear Bomb

Sita knows that she has access to a nuclear bomb inside of the military compound. She orders the general to bring her a nuclear bomb at the end of the novel so she can blow up the compound and all of the evidence. She sets the nuclear bomb to explode in 15 minutes and continues to try to bargain with the general and Arturo before it goes off. the nuclear bomb explodes, killing Arturo,. the general, Joel and many other people on the compound.



Themes

Good versus Evil

The primary plot throughout the entire novel is that of good versus evil. Biblical symbolism can be found throughout the book. Alisa has an inner struggle with good versus evil and so do each of the characters that are involved in the story.

Alisa struggles with the good and evil of having to turn the various men she loves into vampires in order to save their lives. On one hand, she knows that transforming them into vampires saves their lives. On the other hand, she knows the struggles they will have to endure as vampires. Additionally, Alisa struggles with drinking enough blood from her victims to gain her strength and choosing to kill her victims. The bottom line is as Sita, Alisa made a vow to Krishna not to create any more vampires. Every time she is forced to make another vampire, she struggles with whether she is doing the right thing to save someone's life, while also breaking a promise to her God.

Both Ray and Joel have a constant struggle between good and evil once they are transformed into vampires. While they both understand that Sita did it to save their life, they struggle with what they have to do to stay alive—such as drinking blood. Joel even struggles with watching Sita kill at the end of the novel, even though she is doing it to save their lives and the lives of humankind as a whole.

Mental States

Another primary theme in the novel is the mind or mental state of the vampires, especially during their transformation or transitioning period. Primarily, the focus falls on whether or not Sita is having visions, blackouts or just dreams. There are also questions on how sound in mind Yaksha is when he returns from being on the run to kill Sita, his final vampire to complete his vow to Krishna to kill all of the vampires he created.

Arturo also seems to have his own mental problems. Arturo is fixated on using Sita's vampire blood and his alchemist knowledge to create a hybrid—part human and part vampire. In the end, Arturo's mental state ends up causing his death. Sita feels it is better to end Arturo's life, and sacrifice the life of numerous others in order to save the human race.

It seems as if Ray sinks into a deep depression once he becomes a vampire. He misses his old life, even though he wouldn't have a life to live at all if Sita hadn't saved him by transforming him. Sita practically has to force him to drink blood and Ray is constantly in a state of unrest. While he kills himself to save the vampires from running rampant in Los Angeles, it seems as if he wanted to die anyway to escape the life of being a vampire.



Friendships/Relationships

Friendships and relationships are a third major theme that runs throughout the novel. First, there is the line that separates the classes of the vampires, such as those that create more vampires, such as Eddie and Yaksha, and those that try not to create anymore vampires, such as Sita. Second, it is even the class of relationships that exist between the humans and the vampires. Sita seems to have a demeanor where she gets along with most of the characters she encounters, but she also forms closer relationships and trusts some people more than others, such as Ray, Joel and Seymour. Even Seymour struggles with his relationship with Sita because he wants Sita to transform him into a vampire.

Sita struggles to have true and meaningful friendships and romantic relationships because she is trying to keep it a secret that she is a vampire. When she does reveal she is a vampire, she either has to kill the person or trust that they can keep her secret. As more and more characters in the novel find out Sita is a vampire, it puts them in danger because of their relationship with Sita.



Style

Point of View

The novel is written in the first person point of view, from the perspective of Alisa Perne. The novel swings back and forth between the present and the past. The past represents the time when Alisa is living her life in the past, such as during the Inquisition. The present represents the time throughout history, before Sita was a vampire and during historical periods when she was a vampire, such as the Inquisition.

The point of view of this novel is intimate, allowing a reader to connect closely with the main character, Sita. The book written in this manner allows the reader to get inside Sita's head, thoughts and inner struggles. The reader cares what happens to the narrator even though she has struggles between good and evil. The point of view also allows the author to inject his own opinions into the narration and to expand on the events taking place around the other characters and the occurrences taking place.

Setting

The novel is set primarily in Oregon, Los Angeles and Las Vegas. The novel seems to be in the 21st century, but also touches on ancient stories and things that occurred in historical times. The main characters are involved in the investigation of Alisa's Perne's background and the mysterious attacks on humans in Los Angeles, where they bodies are drained of blood.

The setting of this novel works well with the plot. At first, the reader is not aware that the character has different identities and that while she appears to be innocent, Alisa is possibly one of the most dangerous characters in the novel. However, as events unfold, Alisa's identity and the mysterious murders are a constant part of the plot, the lives of the characters and even the outcome of the novel.

Language and Meaning

The language of this novel is relatively simple and easy to read. The author, however, interjects many foreign words to fit into the setting of the novel. The language is from the 21st century, which is when the novel is set. The language is descriptive enough that it helps to explain the situations, but is not always detailed enough for the reader to truly understand.

Structure

The novel is divided into three parts. Each part contains 13 to 17 chapters. The length of each chapter ranges from four pages to 30 pages long. The chapters tell the story



primarily in exposition and with some dialogue. The narrator injects his own voice and thoughts throughout the book, providing his opinions and feelings of the events unfolding in the novel.

The novel contains one main plot and several subplots. The main plot is the struggle of human beings and vampires in choosing between good and evil. One subplot is the mental state of mind of each of the characters. Another subplot is the relationships that the characters form amongst each other.
