Plot Summary

"Wife by Wednesday" by Catherine Bybee is the story of Sam Elliot and Blake Harrison whose romance begins in the most unusual and unexpected way. Blake Harrison is a wealthy businessman and also happens to be the Duke of Albany, a small European country. His father passed away some time before and left a will that reaches out to Blake from the grave. Blake is a playboy and a womanizer. He is averse to commitment and marriage – his relationships never last past a year. But he faces a dilemma. If he wants the \$300 million fortune from his father, the ancestral home and his title, he has to meet the marriage stipulation laid out in his father's will.

Blake thinks of a way to have his inheritance and avoid commitment. He contacts Alliance which is a matchmaking company. He arranges to meet the company's president, Sam Elliot, at a coffee shop to begin the process. He is stunned when a petite, pretty red-head turns out to be Sam – Samantha Elliot. But she is confident of his skills and her company's abilities and convinces him that she is up for the challenge. She will do a thorough job for him and find a slate of candidates that very afternoon for his review. And she will make sure that these women know that they will not be living a fairytale marriage as a wealthy duchess. The girl he selects to fill the role of his wife will know that the marriage will end in one year.

Sam is a normal female and immediately recognizes that whoever is selected will have a hard time not falling for the handsome and charming duke. She makes a note to advise the girls that they should plan to spend most of their year-long marriage far away from the attractive and sexy man. Sam is thrilled with the assignment. She needs a high-profile client like Blake Harrison to boost her business. And she is facing financial difficulties because most of her money is funneled into an exclusive rehab home for the care of her younger sister, Jordan, who had become disabled from a suicide attempt. Sam has had a troubled past. Her father served time in prison for tax evasion, her mother committed suicide and her sister tried to.

Blake finds Sam fascinating and when he learns about her troubled background and financial difficulties, he arrives at what he determines to be the perfect solution. He offers Sam the year-long contract to be his wife. At first she is hesitant but her financial issues compel her to accept the offer. She reminds herself that she can't think of this very attractive man as her real husband and that their relationship is just a business one.

But the two are very attracted to each other and soon after their marriage in Las Vegas, the inevitable happens. Husband and wife become lovers. And, although they don't vocalize their feelings, they begin to fall in love with each other. A vindictive former lover of Blake's tries to drive a wedge between Sam and Blake but in the end true love wins out. After a bump in the road in the form of the will demanding that there be an heir on the way, the growing bump in Sam's stomach solidifies their love and relationship as well as meets the requirements of the fine print in his father's will.

Analysis

Chapter One

Blake Harrison is looking for a wife but not in the conventional sense. He is a Duke from European royalty and will lose his inheritance and ancestral home if he is not married by the end of the month – just a few days away. He enjoys his playboy lifestyle and isn't prepared to marry for love and make a serious commitment; he wants only a financial



arrangement with the appropriate woman. His father is deceased but his lawyers are charged with carrying out his wishes – that Blake be married and settled down by the timing that he has ordained.

Blake needs to find a woman that he is not in love with or even attracted to, who wants and needs a financial deal and who is willing to end the arrangement in a year. The prenuptial arrangement will provide the woman with a fortune once the year is up. Neither one of his current lovers will fit the bill so he has decided to employ the services of a professional matchmaker. He wants to be presented with candidates who will meet all his needs and who fully buy into the arrangement. At this point in the story, Blake is not an endearing character due to his cynical approach to marriage. But maybe there is hope for him.

Blake has made arrangements to meet Sam Elliot at a coffee shop to start the search. He has only a week to find the woman, enter into the prenuptial contract and get married. When Blake meets Sam Elliot he is stunned that Sam turns out to be Samantha. Immediately, the possibility that a relationship will blossom between Blake and Sam pops into the reader's mind. Could Sam be the candidate or could a real love affair develop between the two? Sam is experiencing financial problems and certainly could use the money.

Chapter Two

Sam is not the tall, shapely blonde that Blake is generally attracted to but there is something that intrigues him about her. When he discovers that she is paying for her younger sister's upkeep in an expensive rehab facility, he knows that she would be vulnerable to an offer of a lucrative deal which would entail her being his wife and a duchess for a year. When he presents this idea to her, she is stunned and stresses that she is not on the menu. But he is persistent. He holds out a carrot that she cannot resist. Part of the prenuptial deal will include his paying for her sister's care for the rest of her life. Sam, who was worrying about having to pick up the lunch check, is understandably interested in the deal. The fact that she'll receive \$8 million dollars plus herself is also something that many women could not turn down. She's already recognized how attractive he is so it wouldn't be a dirty job.

More is revealed about Sam's background. Her mother committed suicide and her father served time for tax evasion. She had been forced to quit college in order to take care of her sister who had a debilitating stroke after she tried to take her life. Money would mean a lot to Sam. Although she considers him a womanizer, Blake could be the answer to many of her problems. Although she tries to brush it aside, she can't help but notice how attractive Blake is. Obviously, some kind of relationship between the two is brewing.

Chapter Three

Sam accepts the offer although not enthusiastically. She has to focus on how the deal will help her sister. Her sister's care has almost bankrupted her. By looking at the deal



as a way to continue her sister's stay in the exclusive rehab center, she can tell herself that her act isn't cynical and self-serving. She is becoming more attracted to Blake and is relieved to learn that he will spend half the year away from her in Europe. But there are also signs that he is growing more attracted to and fond of her. Will he really stay away from her for six months?

Analysis

Chapter Four

One sign that Blake is not viewing Sam as merely a financial deal is the protectiveness he shows toward her and his concern for her welfare. He also doesn't want to wait then days for Sam to get her passport. Apparently, he wants her to join him as soon as possible. He is not shy about making sexual or romantic overtures toward her. He is a duke and a handsome man who is accustomed to getting his way with woman. He feels that his title and status gives him a green light to behave however he wants. Although Sam tries to maintain a distance from him, she appears to be as tempted as he is to become involved.



Vanessa proved to be a rude elitist but one thing she did was inspire Sam to go shopping. She comments that she was wearing Target to Vanessa's Gucci. If Sam were unconcerned about Blake, she probably wouldn't feel the need to compete with one of his lovers. Vanessa is a scorned woman and obviously dug into Sam's past referring to her background as "sordid". Because she is hurt by Blake's marriage, Vanessa may strike out at Sam and expose her family problems to the media. She could sabotage their arrangement.

Chapter Five

Blake is not kidding himself about Sam. He realizes that keeping her an ocean away would be the best way to remain true to their agreement. He is becoming more and more attracted to her. He doesn't seem to be concerned that Vanessa is upset about his marriage which demonstrates that he has no deep feelings for her.

News that Sam's townhouse had been bugged compels Blake to change his plans and return to Los Angeles earlier than he planned. He is worried that his cousin and his father's lawyers may be suspicious of his quick and unexpected marriage. They may assume that he married Sam just to meet his father's requirements for him to receive his inheritance and title and are going to try to prove it. When Blake says they could use the hidden cameras to prove that whoever planted them was wrong, he apparently intends to prove to prying eyes that he loves Sam and that their marriage is real. How far will Sam be willing to go to prove his point?

Chapter Six

The sexual tension between Blake and Sam is escalating and neither one seems to be fighting it much. Blake has proposed that they make an amendment to their contract that would allow them to have a romantic relationship. Although Sam is obviously attracted to Blake, she hesitates at his suggestion. She has never been in a relationship that had a shelf life and would end at a date certain. Sam is probably beginning to have feelings for Blake. He's been so accommodating and kind to her and wants to spoil her. Will she be able to resist his charms?

As much as Blake claims that he detests his father and his memory, he is more like him that he probably would be ready to admit. His father was a womanizer but so is Blake. His father made his mother's life miserable. If he falls in love with Sam, who he is legally married to, would he expect her to accept his infidelity like his mother did with his father? Sam doesn't appear to be the type of girl who would go along with such an arrangement. Things are getting more complicated.

Analysis

Chapter Seven

There would be no problem with affording nurses to take care of her.

It means a lot to Sam that she was the only woman who had stayed with Blake at his new Malibu mansion. She lets him know that she trusts him by telling him that she hadn't been close to anyone else since her father's problems. She found it hard to trust anyone – it was obvious that she was at least beginning to trust Blake.

Chapter Eight

Blake is impressed and perhaps a bit surprised that Sam has the manner and demeanor of a duchess. She is tactful and charming with his mother. She keeps her cool even when Blake's mother "ambushes" them at the airport. Sam is not wearing her finest compared to Linda who is decked out like a duchess. But it is Sam's sophisticated personality and gracious demeanor that makes her truly a duchess.

It is revealed that Sam is fighting demons from the past which explains why it has been nearly impossible for her to trust a man. Her lover was actually an undercover agent

Analysis

Chapter Ten

Sam was understandably shocked when she learned that she was pregnant. Instead of being happy to know that Blake's baby was growing inside of her, she immediately thought that he would be upset and suspect that she had gotten herself pregnant. Of course, she didn't know that he'd be elated. It would solve his problem with the requirement of an heir in his father's will.

Vanessa made a last ditch effort to turn Blake against Sam. She threw up Sam's family problems and referred to her as a criminal. She warned him that it would come back to haunt him. Vanessa is a woman scorned and may not be satisfied until she has some revenge. What could she have planned for Blake and Sam to drive a wedge between them?

Chapter Eleven

Sam is astounded that Blake isn't upset to learn about her pregnancy. He hinted that the baby could change their relationship from its one-year agreement to one with longevity. Blake still doesn't tell her about the heir which he may regret later if Sam learns it from someone else – namely Vanessa. Blake is again showing his protectiveness toward



Sam and now their baby. The baby appears to mean more to him than just something to mark off a checklist on his way to an inheritance.

Chapter Twelve

Vanessa's plan for revenge is revealed. She somehow knew that having an heir was one of his father's stipulations in his will. When Sam discovers that the condoms were damaged intentionally, she is convinced that she's been duped. She had finally been able to trust a man again, but she's apparently been taken in by another man who is no better than his controlling father and no better than her own father.

Blake's attorney, Jeff, had hired private investigators to follow Vanessa in an attempt to find out if she'd been behind the bugging of Sam's townhouse. A woman in a photo with Vanessa is familiar to him but he can't place her. He takes the photo with him hoping his memory will be jogged. The identity of this person could be key to learning who was behind planting the surveillance cameras and hidden mics and who had invaded Sam's privacy. Finding out who was out to sabotage his marriage becomes all the more urgent as Blake watches Sam walk out on him.

Chapter Thirteen and Epilogue

Blake does some investigating of his own. From the research that Sam had done on the computer, he figures out that Vanessa knew about the requirement of an heir in his father's will before he did. He recalls that the woman in the photo with Vanessa is one of Parker's assistants. Blake concluded that this woman had let Vanessa know about the heir codicil and it was Vanessa who had poked holes in the condoms, hoping to get pregnant and trick Blake into making her the duchess. His discoveries made him understand why Sam was so upset. He could have avoided a lot of problems had he told her about the heir requirement when he first found out about it which was when he found out that Sam was pregnant. Characters

Blake Harrison

Blake Harrison is a wealthy businessman and is also the Duke of Albany, a small European country. Blake's father passed away and left a will stipulating that Blake must be married by his thirty-sixth birthday in order for him to have his inheritance and title. But Blake is a playboy and commitment is an anathema to him. He proudly states that his relationships never last past a year. But if he wants the \$300 million fortune, the ancestral home and his title, he has to meet the marriage stipulation laid out in his father's will.

Blake contacts Alliance, a matchmaking company, and meets with the company's president, Sam Elliot, to start his search for a wife in name only. He is stunned when Sam Elliot is actually Samantha Elliot, a petite, pretty red-head. But she is a professional and convinces him that she can deliver for him. She will do a thorough job and find a slate of candidates who are willing to enter into a contractual agreement with Blake and will understand that they will not be living the life of a wealthy duchess; the girl Blake selects to fill the role of his wife will understand that she will be generously remunerated for playing the role of his wife and that the marriage will end in one year.

But there's something about Sam that Blake finds fascinating and he offers her the year-long contract to be his wife. At first she is hesitant but her financial issues compel her to accept the offer. Although Blake had no intention of finding a real wife, as always life is full of surprises for him. The newly married man and wife are attracted to each other and they begin to fall in love. Although a former girlfriend tries to sabotage their relationship, it survives the assault and lasts past the expiration date. Blake finds love and marriage and a family in the most unexpected way.

Sam Elliot

Samantha "Sam" Elliot is a young woman in her late twenties and is the president of her own company, Alliance, which is a sophisticated high-end matchmaking organization. She has had many struggles in her life. Her father served time in prison for tax evasion following a huge scandal. Her mother couldn't bear the shame and committed suicide. Her younger sister, Jordan, tried to commit suicide but failed. However, her attempt caused her to have a stroke which landed her in a rehab facility for the disabled. Sam's company is making money but it is all going to her sister's upkeep at the expensive rehab center.

Blake Harrison, a wealthy playboy and the Duke of Albany, contacts her. He needs to find a wife and right away. He will lose his inheritance if he isn't married by his thirty-sixth birthday which is coming up the next week. He wants to find a woman to marry in name only. The woman to whom he will pay a small fortune must agree to a divorce



after a year. Blake is taken with Sam and quickly decides that she will be the perfect candidate for his temporary wife. She needs the money because of her sister's care and eventually accepts the offer. Although she tries to resist, Sam finds herself more and more drawn to Blake. When it's obvious that he feels the same way, the two begin the start of a real love affair.

When Sam learns that she is pregnant, it sets off a whole series of ramifications. She fears that Blake will think she got pregnant on purpose. However, Blake just found out he needed an heir to be entitled to his inheritance. When she finds that out, she thinks he tricked her into getting pregnant. When everything is finally ironed out, Sam and Blake decide to stay together not just for the sake of the baby but because they love each other.

Jordan Elliot

Jordan Elliot is Sam's younger sister. Her attempted suicide caused her to have a stroke. She is disabled and lives in an exclusive rehab home. Sam pays for her care.

Vanessa

Vanessa was Blake's lover before he met Sam. She is vindictive and bitter that Blake married Sam and she is out for revenge. Ironically, it was Vanessa's machinations - intended to trap Blake into marrying her - that result in Sam getting pregnant and solidifying Sam and Blake's true love for one another.

Mark Parker

Mark Parker is one of Blake's late father's attorneys. The law firm of Parker & Parker was hired to make sure that Blake met all the requirements of his father's will before he could inherit his father's fortune, ancestral home and title.

Jeff Melina

Jeff Melina is Blake's friend and attorney. He hires private investigators to follow Vanessa in an effort to learn if she was behind bugging Sam's town house.

Linda Harrison

Linda Harrison is Blake's mother. She is the widow of the Duke of Albany. She had a difficult marriage because of the Duke's infidelity. She stayed with the Duke because of his money and status.



Gwen Harrison

Gwen Harrison is Blake's younger sister. She is warm and friendly and welcomes Sam into the family. She is happy to have someone in the family who is close in age to her.

Howard Walker

Howard Walker is Blake's cousin and number one enemy. If Blake fails to meet the stipulations of his father's will, his fortune, ancestral home and title will all go to Howard.

Samuel Edmund Harrison

Samuel Edmund Harrison is Blake and Sam's infant son and heir to the Duchy of Albany. He is named for his mother, Samantha, and for Blake's father, Edmund, who unwittingly brought Sam and Blake together.

Alliance is the name of Sam Elliot's matchmaking service. Brad Harrison contacted Alliance in his pursuit of a wife.

Themes and Motifs

Trust

One of the main themes in the story of Blake Harrison and Sam Elliot in "Wife by Wednesday" is trust. Sam Elliot had been hurt in the past by trusting the wrong people. For one, she naturally trusted her father but he let her down and violated her trust through his criminal activities that shed a bad light on her and haunted her ever since. While federal investigators were trying to make a case against Sam's father, an undercover agent named Dan started a romantic relationship with Sam for the purpose of learning more about her father. Sam fell for Dan who taped her conversations and used them to prosecute her father. She was twenty-one at the time and was so hurt by the relationship that she didn't let anyone get close to her for many years.

Once bitten, twice as shy... due to her past relationship problems Sam had a difficult time trusting Blake. They began their relationship as an impersonal business one but there was an obvious attraction on both sides and it soon evolved into a very personal one. However, Sam had her doubts all the time about Blake's feelings for her. Although he appeared to really care for her, Sam could never relax and let herself be loved and enjoy him due to her past issues with trust.

When Sam discovers that Blake withheld a vital piece of information about their relationship and his father's will, she is convinced that he had used and manipulated her. Her history of hurt over violations of trust doesn't allow him any margin for error and she leaves him. When he finally is able to explain the huge misunderstanding, Sam again must go through the fragile process of learning to trust him again.

Commitment

One of the main themes in "Wife by Wednesday" by Catherine Bybee is commitment. Blake Harrison is a wealthy businessman and a member of European royalty. To be entitled to his inheritance and ancestral home and to maintain his title of Duke of Albany, he had to be married by his thirty-sixth birthday according to his father's will. But Blake was a playboy and was averse to any thoughts of marriage and commitment. He boasted that none of his relationships lasted a year because he grew tired of them and didn't want to lead anyone on.

But to get his \$300 million dollars and the other perks he had no choice – he had to be married. He engaged the services of a matchmaking organization that was run by Samantha "Sam" Elliot. She understood that the candidates she sent him would understand that Blake Harrison would not be making a commitment to them. They would have to agree to a divorce in a year – but they would make a small fortune for carrying out the unusual arrangement.



Blake is taken with Sam and decides that she is the perfect choice to be his temporary wife. She has financial problems and reluctantly agrees to the arrangement. But she has no intention to make a commitment either. She had a horrible experience with a man a few years back and has not allowed anyone to get close to her since. She is committed to her company and to her sister, her only surviving relative.

After the two have an impromptu wedding in Las Vegas, things change very quickly. There is a strong attraction between them and Blake begins acting like a new man. He is suddenly worried about Sam's safety and welfare. He feels protective toward her and can't stand to be away from her. Although he doesn't vocalize it, or maybe doesn't even realize it, he is falling in love with his wife. Meanwhile, Sam is struggling with resisting Blake's charms because she knows he is not the kind to commit. Besides, she reminds herself, their relationship is just a business arrangement.

Finally, Blake and Sam admit their feelings for each other and Blake takes a huge step – at least for him – and commits to be with one woman forever. He tells her that he'll always love her and if she is waiting for him to say their time together is up, she will be waiting a life time.

Abandonment

The issue of abandonment is one of the main themes in the novel "Wife by Wednesday" by Catherine Bybee. Samantha "Sam" Elliot had been abandoned on many levels. As a child she enjoyed the good life provided by her father who was ostensibly a very successful businessman. However, he was really a crook who was accused of embezzlement and served time for tax evasion. Sam was abandoned by the father she thought she had and stripped of the only life she had ever known. Her mother could not take the shame and humiliation of the scandal and committed suicide. Sam, therefore, was also abandoned by her other parent.

All she had left in her nuclear family was her younger sister, Jordan. But she had problems, too, and tried to follow in her mother's footsteps. Her suicide attempt failed but it caused a severe stroke that left her disabled. The sister she loved had also abandoned her and was replaced with a girl who was little more than a vegetable. They had been close but there was no more sharing of thoughts and dreams for Sam with a sister who could barely talk and understood little.

Sam had been involved with a man named Dan. But he abandoned her as her lover when he revealed that he was an undercover agent who was amassing evidence against her father. After that disastrous affair, Sam would not let anyone close to her. She had been hurt and abandoned one time too many. She met Blake years after her affair with Dan ended. It was difficult for her to trust Blake, but eventually they fell in love and love conquers all. After she learned she was pregnant he vowed to her that he would never abandon her or the baby. And he stayed true to his word.



Styles

Point of View

"Wife by Wednesday" by Catherine Bybee is written in the third person narrative, limited omniscient. By writing the story of Blake Harrison and Sam Elliot from this point of view, the reader is privy to the thoughts, ideas, intentions and motivations of the these two main characters. Since the story is about an unexpected relationship, the growing feelings and doubts and fears about their budding romance are made clear to the reader while they, of course, remain unknown to the principles themselves.

Sam Elliot first meets Blake Harrison when he contacts her to help him find a wife. As the title suggests, he needs a wife right away in order to secure his inheritance. When the Blake Harrison character is first introduced he is portrayed as a womanizer and playboy who wants nothing to do with commitment or marriage. The story quickly evolves and it comes as no surprise when Blake decides the Sam could fill the bill for the wife he needs.

Starting with this premise, the only way to effectively tell the story is from the third person narrative. The narrator is able to convey the growing feelings that both Blake and Sam begin to have for each other and the doubts they have about one another and their relationship. It would not have worked as well if the perspective was from just one of the main characters because it would leave the feelings of the other main character unknown to the reader. Although the characters, of course, don't know the inner thoughts of one another, the story is engaging for the reader who can see Blake and Sam continually drawing closer to one other.

Language and Meaning

"Wife by Wednesday" by Catherine Bybee is a light romance that is written in a straightforward manner. There are no mysteries or complexities to the characters or plot. The reader is able to anticipate plot and story line revelations because of the simplistic nature of the story.

Although the premise is about Blake, a young man who had always been averse to marriage and commitment, he changes rather quickly after meeting Sam. The two have a relationship that is strictly business but Blake pushes the relationship to an intimate level by his flirtatious words and his sexual innuendoes. Although Sam tries to resist Blake's advances to her, she begins to respond to Blake's come-ons with her own double-entendres and flirtations and suggestive comments.

When Blake brings Sam to London to meet his family, which has ties to royalty, he is impressed with Sam's manner. She demonstrates true sophistication and charm under the most stressful of circumstances. Even when a rude cousin asks her if Blake married Sam because she was pregnant, she handles the awkward moment with tact and grace.



Vanessa, a former girlfriend of Blake's, is bitter over his marriage to Sam and tries to sabotage their relationship. After being confronted by Vanessa, Sam calls her a venomous "viper".

Although the story is light and easy to understand, there are many sexual situations that are intimate and somewhat graphic. If the story did not contain these passages, the book could qualify as young adult.

Structure

"Wife by Wednesday" by Catherine Bybee has thirteen medium-sized chapters which are followed by an epilogue. The story is told in a chronological manner with no flashbacks and only has some references to incidents in the past. The book ends with a preview of the author's new book, "Not Quite Mine".

The story begins when Blake Harrison, a wealthy businessman and the Duke of Albany, is looking for a wife. He needs to find a wife right away in order to be entitled to his inheritance. His father's will stipulates that Blake must be married and settled down by his thirty-sixth birthday which is coming up in a matter of days.

The story then transitions to a budding romance between Blake and Sam Elliot who he had actually hired to find a woman who for a very generous fee was willing to be his wife in name only. The majority of the story is focused on the growing affection and attraction that Blake and Sam have for each other. Conflict arises when Sam becomes pregnant and she is told that Blake tricked her into becoming pregnant because the will also stipulated that an heir must be on the way.

The conclusion of the story is told in the epilogue when Sam and Blake celebrate their one year anniversary with their family and with Eddie their new baby boy.



Quotes

I don't need emotion clogging up something as important as a marriage agreement. -- Blake (Chapter 1)

Importance: This quote captures Blake's opinion of marriage when the story begins. It is an agreement to him not an emotional commitment.

Blake hurts everyone... eventually. You'll discover that soon enough. -- Vanessa (Chapter 4)

Importance: Vanessa, Blake's scorned lover, tells Sam what she has to look forward in her relationship with Blake. Vanessa, of course, doesn't know that their marriage is a financial arrangement, and Sam can't tell her that.

I never found anyone drawer-worthy.

-- Blake (Chapter 7)

Importance: This was Blake's way of telling Sam that his other girlfriends didn't have any clothes or belongings in his bedroom suite. In fact, none of them had ever been at his new Malibu mansion. He's trying to convince her that she is special to him.

There are some things in life you just know are the right thing to do.

-- Blake (Chapter 8)

Importance: Blake was responding to Howard's questions about marrying Sam when he'd known her such a short time. Howard was suspicious that the marriage was just an arrangement.

Samantha was having a hell of a time shaking the jet lag, and they'd been in Europe for over a week. Then again, living a lie was exhausting.

-- Narrator (Chapter 9)

Importance: This passage captures how ill at east Sam was with the deceit she was having to live under in order to fulfill her arrangement with Blake.

Falling in love with her husband was not part of the plan.

-- Narrator (Chapter 9)

Importance: The arrangement between Blake and Sam was supposed to be just a financial one. This quote demonstrates that it was becoming much more than that.

The internal clock in her head, counting backward with the time she had remaining as Blake's wife, was getting louder every day. The harder she tried to ignore the click, the worse it dug into her soul.

Importance: Reality is dawning on Sam. As much as she is enjoying her relationship with Blake, it is one that is predestined to end.

If she cares about you half as much as you seem to care for her, she might say yes to having your baby.

-- Jim Melina (Chapter 10)

Importance: Blake's lawyer gives him some non-legal advice.

I just found out I'm pregnant. I'm going to be a mother forever. That's the only solid thing I know is going to happen. Everything else is a big fat question mark.

-- Sam (Chapter 11)

Importance: Sam is placing her baby and her motherhood at the top of her priorities and future. Whether she and Blake stay together is an unknown and could change. The fact that she will be a mother will not change.

His gaze fell to his wife in the sea of people, pulling her in for a hug. Identifying his love for their child collided with another reality. His love for Samantha.

-- Narrator (Chapter 12)

Importance: This passage captures the moment that Blake admitted to himself that he was in love with Sam.

Damn him. Damn him for making her love him, trust him, and then blowing that all to hell.

-- Sam (Chapter 12)

Importance: Sam is crushed when she learns that in order for Blake to inherit his fortune, he had to have an heir. Sam assumes that he manipulated her into getting pregnant.

I love you, Samantha Harrison, and if you're waiting for the day I ask you to leave my life, you'd best be willing to wait a lifetime.

-- Blake (Chapter 13)

Importance: Blake has fallen in love with Sam and the one-year deal is off. He wants to spend a lifetime with her.
