The first chapter introduces the reader to the setting and main characters in a mysterious, intriguing manner. It is written in first person, without saying anything about the person talking aside from a signature—Gossip Girl. The main characters themselves are only addressed by the first letter of their first name.

This chapter offers depth and insight into Blair. The reader learns that she is a bulimic with attitude that takes her looks to the next level. She accepts and loves her father, but has a hard time with the reality that he is openly gay. Blair is a controlling being who expects life to go the way she wants it. Nate is there as well. They are good friends, and she wants him to be her lover. She has his life planned out as well. Blair is wealthy and used to getting things she wants. At the end of the chapter, she is embarrassed by the birthday display, but she is willing to overlook all the embarrassment for the perfect pair of shoes.

This section highlights Serena van der Woodsen. She is a stunningly beautiful girl with a zest for life. Although privileged, she doesn't flaunt her wealth. She is naive and doesn't realize Dan's attraction to her. Since she has been shunned by Blair and her former friends, she is grateful for a friend. Serena loves to shop at Barneys. It's her haven.

Blair sets the scene to have sex with Nate. Once again they are interrupted as she learns that her mother is going to get married. While her mother seems to want Blair to be excited with her, she seems oblivious to the fact that her daughter is upset about the wedding. She also doesn't seem to realize that her wedding date is her daughter's birthday.

The plot gains more depth in this section as Vanessa enters the picture. Dan is hopelessly obsessed with Serena, and Vanessa is secretly crushing on Dan. Jenny is a silent observer. Vanessa has talent in cinematography, but she let her emotions rule when it came to casting. Dan is in her film, and the acting is horrible.

Serena doesn't show up when the others are expecting her. She genuinely forgets to come. Vanessa thinks that Serena doesn't really care about the film since the other girl has everything, but the film actually means a lot to Serena. Up until this point in the



book, Serena has been oblivious to Dan's obsession with her. Now, after talking with his father, she is starting to get a clue. She doesn't know how to deal with the situation.

Jenny doesn't understand or appreciate her brother's obsession with Serena until she meets Nate in the park. She falls for him hard and fast, even smoking pot to be with him. When he invites her to his house, she is eager to go.

Even though Serena comes across as flighty, there is a serious side of her. This shows in her film. It's artsy, and Vanessa does the camera work well. Dan feels connected to Serena and calls her, but she is uncertain about how to deal with him so she doesn't give him much of an opportunity to speak. They are going away together, but both have very different ideas regarding the weekend at Brown, and only the reader knows this.

Nate and Jenny have a friend connection. They feel very comfortable together. Nate shows that he isn't very interested in Blair as he tosses her gift into a closet while he is in the house with a new girl. Jenny is honest about her age, and Nate doesn't shie away from her. He doesn't take advantage of her, either.

Gossip Girl sums everyone up on sighting and the film competition. She is the hub of information and juicy tidbits, whether they are true or not. She plants ideas into the minds of her readers by offering just little bits of information.

Everybody seems to be excited about Blair's mother's wedding except for Blair herself. She remembers happier times when she and Serena got along well, but now she feels betrayed by her former friend. Instead of working things out, she shuns her former friend and lashes back. It ends out hurting herself as well as Serena.

Serena doesn't have many friends, but Jenny and Vanessa join her. She feels really badly for not showing up at the film showing.

This is a chapter centered on communication and on communications that are ignored. It clearly shows who is interested in who. Nate does not respond to Blair, but messages Jenny, who agrees to meet with him. Dan sends poetry to Serena and asks her to hang out, but he gets no response.

When Jenny and Nate are together, they enjoy each other for who they really are. There is no pretense or awkwardness. This is in contrast to Dan and his situation with Serena, which is awkward. He has no idea what she is thinking or doing. She does't know either. She wants to be friends with Dan, but she doesn't know how to deal with his intensity.

Blair has already pictured her new brother as a nerd. She is practicing for her interview, which is very important to her, when her life is derailed by his showing up at her home. Instead of being a nerd, he is a very kind hippie. She is weak emotionally and literally shuts herself off, even when he reaches out to her with kindness. Blair goes to Nate for comfort, but he blows her off. She finds solace in her cat and old movies.

Gossip Girl keeps everyone informed. Nothing is private.

She answers his questions and behaves in a manner that she knows is inappropriate. She even admits that she stole a pair of pajamas for her boyfriend who didn't even thank her. At the very end of the interview, she kisses Jason on the cheek.

Serena is surprised that she doesn't feel more nervous. She woke up that morning holding Nate's hand, and when he smiles at her, she knows that everything is going to be all right between them. They are friends again. As Serena and Nate discuss how they aren't as nervous as they thought they would be, Dan has a different take on the day. He is really nervous and bothered by the way they are so comfortable together.

Serena's interviewer is tough, asking her why she got kicked out of boarding school. She answers honestly. When he asks if she's going to behave herself, she tells him that she is trying to. Nate has a very perky interviewer named Brigid. When she asks about his interests, he tells her that his biggest interest is sailing. He tells her that he is concerned that his grades aren't good enough for Brown, and she reassures him. She also tells him that there is a sailing team at the school.

Dan's interviewer is named Marian. She asks him about books that he has read, and Dan gives her an analysis. As he discusses one book, he realizes that he is obsessed with Serena, but she doesn't love him back. He realizes he needs to get a life.

Serena's interviewer asks her if she has read any good books recently. She mentions a book that Dan recommended for her even though she hadn't finished reading it. The interviewer asks her if she has done anything else, and she tells him about the film that she made. She feels that the interview is going poorly, but she re-collects herself and restores her cool.



Brigid asks Nate to tell her about something he has read recently such as a book or article. He tells her about an article he read in the New York Times about a pot pill that's pure THC. No matter how he feels as or how much he thinks he isn't qualified for the college, Brigid seems determined to get him into Brown. Nate knows that Blair is going to be upset that he didn't even try to go to Yale, but he realizes he doesn't really care what she thinks.

Marian realizes that Dan is also a writer and asked him about his writing. He tells her that he writes poetry. The realization that Serena doesn't love him is so hard for him to handle that he leaves the interview early.

Jenny is happy that she went to go see Vanessa's screening at the Five and Dime because there is only one other person there. She notices that Vanessa has shaved her head again, and wonders if she should comment on it. Jenny watches her brother acting in the film and decide that he makes a pretty convincing junkie. When the film is over, she tells Vanessa that she thinks the cinematography is great, especially the shots at the end., Vanessa asks her if she ever saw the final cut of Serena's film, and Jenny says that she has. Jenny points out that Vanessa did the camera work for that.

Jenny and Vanessa decide to go grab some food. They talk about guys, and Jenny tells Vanessa about Nate. She says that Nate just likes her, and they haven't even kissed yet. He's not slimy like the other guys. Jenny knows that Vanessa has a crush on Dan. She tells the girl that Serena and Dan don't have much in common. She tells Vanessa that if she has feelings for Dan, she should do something about it.

Aaron asks how the interview went. Blair tells him that she thinks it went okay. The interview seems like a blur. She sees a book on the back seat, and suddenly the interviewer's questions come back to her. She realizes that she messed up the entire interview. Aaron can't believe that she did that and asks her if she is suicidal. She says she isn't but should be after this. She blames him for making her late.

Blair is concerned about what she is going to tell her father and Nate. Aaron tries to cheer her up. Blair tries to think of reasons to live, but things seem dismal. She reminds herself that she isn't a loser. Turning to Aaron, she announces that when they get back home, she's going to call her dad and ask him to donate something to Yale.

In the "who's with who" section, Gossip Girl wonders if Dan has gotten over Serena and if Nate is really serious about Jenny. In the "you knew this was coming" section there is an piece stating that Yale University announced the addition of the Yale Waldorf Vineyard. The e-mails from the readers address the Film Festival. In closing, Gossip Girl talks about Thanksgiving.

The contestants for the Film Festival are sitting in the front row. Serena looks beautiful, but she is very nervous. If she wins the competition, it will show colleges that there is something more to her than being the girl who was kicked out of boarding school. Vanessa is nervous as well, but she doesn't show it. She's counting on winning the competition so that she can cinch her early acceptance to New York University.



Blair is feeling sick to her stomach for numerous reasons. Nate isn't responding to her calls and messages. Her mother is dragging her to wedding related activities, and her father has left a message on her machine asking how the interview went. She e-mails him, telling him that the interviewer has an interest in wine. She mentions that a donation was secure her "already pretty sure" place at Yale. She hopes that the film competition will be her chance to change her luck.

Mr. Coate thanks everyone for coming then gives a history of women in film. He introduces Serena's film. As she watches it, Serena begins to feel proud of it. The other girls tear it apart. The film teacher whistles when the film is over. Two more films are introduced before Vanessa's film shows. The winner is announced. It's Serena. Vanessa stands up and wolf whistles. She is proud to be part of the film. Serena goes up to receive her award, which is two tickets to Cannes and three nights in a five-star hotel during the film festival in the spring. She calls Vanessa and Jennifer up and hands them the tickets. Blair can't believe what's going on in her life.

Serena tells Dan that they liked her film. She reminds him about the wedding.

rendezvous at grand central station - and the winner is... Analysis

In this section, Dan's plans to spend time with Serena is once again thwarted. It's interesting to note that he is heavily into literature, romance and writing poetry yet doesn't seem to know how to communicate with Serena.

Even though Blair seems disgusted with her new brother, they begin to bond on the trip. This chapter compares and contrasts two journeys—the one to Brown and the one to Yale. Neither group is accustomed to motels, but they accept their situation. The relationships among the characters shift during this chapter: Blair and Aaron have a fun and pleasant evening together, Serena and Nate reconnect, and Dan begins to realize that Serena isn't a drawn to him as he is to her.

The morning shows a big difference between the friends. Blair is late, harried and stressed. Serena is calmer than she thought she would have been. When Aaron gives Blair the card, he show more kindness to her than anyone else has in the book to this point.

Back in the city, with distractions gone, Jenny bonds with Vanessa.

Blair is still under the influence of the herbal cigarette and completely bombs her interview. All her inner turmoil comes out in spite of all the time she spent practicing to nail the interview.

This chapter shows how unfair interviews really can be. The youth have one chance to impress an interviewer. Serena feels like a failure, but keeps her cool. Nate tries to avoid going to college, but ironically has an interviewer who seems determined to



persuade him that Brown would be a good choice for him in spite of his low grades and lack of desire to attend. Dan really wants to get into Brown, but his realization that Serena doesn't love him hits him during the interview. He is so distracted, he walks out on the interviewer.

Vanessa seems like a tough character, but Jenny sees a gentler side of her. When she sees Vanessa knocked down, she defends the girl and boosts her up. Instead of behaving like the shy ninth grade Jenny, she begins to show some assertiveness as she bluntly tells Vanessa to express her feelings for Dan.

Blair responds to Aaron's caring questioning about the interview by telling him things went fine. She has a flashback to what actually occurred and is horrified. Her reaction to the situation, and her method of problem solving is to ask her daddy to fix it for her by donating money to the college.

Gossip Girl show that Blair's dad followed through on the donation idea.

The Film Festival is a big deal to the participants for many reasons. Even though Vanessa thinks Serena is shallow and simply lucky, winning means a lot to her. Serena shows her ability to reach out to others and not take credit where it isn't due when she brings Vanessa and Jenny up to the podium and gives them the prize tickets. Blair, the one who tries to make life miserable for Serena out of revenge, is left with her own life falling apart.

Serena wants to share her joy with Dan as a friend. He is so discombobulated by how he feels for her that he doesn't respond well.

Eleanor Waldorf and her bridesmaids go for a beauty treatment in the spa. Blair is not having a good time. Her mother starts talking about a pair of pajamas she bought at Barney's, and Blair realizes that she could say something about Blair's stealing of the pajamas. She decides not to.

Blair feels even more miserable, and things get worse when her mother asks about the Yale interview. Blair tells her it went really great. Serena mentions that she had an interview at Brown over the weekend, and it went terribly. Blair realizes then that Serena was Brown the same time Nate was there. She storms out of the spa.

Gossip Girl summarizes the rest of the spa day and answers questions from readers before offering sightings.

Some of the bridesmaids are complaining about the dresses they have to wear. Blair looks really good in the dress. Serena does, too. Even though they are all getting dressed together, Blair still ignores Serena. The wedding ceremony goes well even though people are gossiping about how quickly the couple is getting married and they also talk about how long the marriage would last.

Blair looks at Nate. He had sent her an email apologizing for not seen her in a while. She responded immediately but hadn't heard back. Everything would be resolved when they saw each other again. She looked closely to see if Nate was looking longingly at Serena. When he doesn't, she feels optimistic. Nate concentrates on the ceremony, trying to avoid eye contact with Blair. He is worried about how he's going to tell her about Jennifer.

Serena looks beautiful on the outside, but inside she is worried about Dan. She is also worried about Blair. Dan is in a pew looking at the wedding. He doesn't understand what people are gossiping about around him because everything looks great to him. Still, he feels out of place. After the wedding, he and Serena are in a car alone together, then Nate joins them.

Blair is feeling angry because Serena and Nate are at a table together, but she is stuck sitting with her family. She is almost back-to-back with Nate, and she whispers to him that she would like to talk with him after the speeches. He knows that Jennifer is going to be there soon and realizes that it's possible to avoid talking to Blair. After they eat, while Cyrus is making his speech, Blair decides to talk with Nate. He notices his sister there with Nate. Blair comes out of the bathroom and sees Nate with Jenny. She goes back to the bathroom. Dan confronts Nate, but Jenny defends him. Vanessa intervenes. She tells Dan that she is going to buy him a drink.

Serena leaves so that she can go and talk with Dan, but she finds him talking with Vanessa. She goes to the ladies room and sees Blair. Blair is crying, and Serena asks if she is okay. Blair confesses that her life is a mess. Serena comforts her.

Nate invites Jenny back to the party with him. Dan and Vanessa hook up, and Blair and Serena reunite as friends. They watch an Audrey Hepburn film together.

Gossip Girl sums up everything that has happened recently. She also points out that Serena and Blair were seen in Barney's men's department returning pajama bottoms. She ends the book with a series of questions.

Nate and Jenny finally kiss. The connection between the two of them is serious enough for him to realize he needs to tell Blair about Jenny and tell Jenny about Blair. He is just confused as to how he is going to do this.

Spa day with the bridesmaids is supposed to be a relaxing, enjoyable time. Instead, Blair is confronted with every part of her life she is dissatisfied with. She has to face the reality of her mother's wedding, spend a day with Serena and talk about the Yale interview. The proverbial straw that breaks the camel's back is when she realizes Nate and Serena were together at Brown. This causes her to crack, and she abruptly leaves. Her mother seems oblivious to the turmoil in her daughter's life.

The wedding ceremony itself goes off without a hitch, but there are undercurrents showing that things aren't perfect.



Blair is to consumed by jealousy at the reception when Serena and Nate are put together at a table. She wants to talk with Nate, but he continues to avoid her.

Now that Vanessa and Jenny are at the hotel, all the main characters of this novel are under one roof. This foreshadows disaster.

The truth of Nate and Jenny is exposed in this chapter. Vanessa is there to help heal Dan's wounded heart, and Blair is left alone.

The ever-forgiving and understanding Serena is there to help Blair, and Blair lets her. When everything else falls apart, she allows her former friend back into her life.

Nate is ready to go public with his relationship with Jenny, and Blair and Serena bond over old movies.

Gossip Girl winds things up as the book concludes. She ends with a series of questions that lets the readers know that while there is some resolution, the story is far from over.



Characters

Blair

Blair is the 17-year-old daughter in a wealthy family. She is used to luxuries in her life such as fancy shoes, elite schooling, and luxurious surroundings. Her father is a gay man who now lives in France. He comes to visit her three weeks before her birthday. She is embarrassed by the cake and attention at the restaurant until she sees the shoes that he gives her as a present. They are enough to make her forget her embarrassment.

Blair likes to control things and has bulimic tendencies. She plans to attend Yale the following year and wants to lose her virginity to her friend Nate. Blair loves old, romantic movies, especially "Breakfast at Tiffany's." She hides her vulnerabilities and focuses on revenge when she is upset. This is shown by the way she turned Serena into a social outcast when she was upset at her.

Serena

Serena is a wealthy girl who seems to have everything she could possibly want. To others, she appears confident and as if things come easily to her. She sees herself as a failure and really wants to prove that she can be taken seriously. This is why the Film festival is important to her. If she wins, she will show others that she has talent and can do something on her own.

Serena is kind to others even when they are cruel to her. This is shown in the way she shows concern for Blair even when Blair shuns her. She isn't self-serving. When she wins the prize for the film festival, she makes certain that everyone knows she didn't do it on her own, and she gives away her prize. Serena is mild but resilient. She knows she didn't do well in her college interview, but she regroups and finishes the interview with class.

Harold

This is Blair's father. He is a gay man who lives in France. He gives Blair fabulous shoes for her birthday.

Nate

This is a very handsome young man that Blair wants to have sex with. He loves to smoke pot.



Daniel

This is a character who is deeply in love with Serena. He writes poetry and loves to read heavy literature.

Jenny

This is a large-busted girl in ninth grade who finds herself close to Nate. She is Dan's sister.

Eleanor

This is Blair's mother. She is about to get married and is extremely excited about it.

Cyrus

This is a balding, fat man who has no sense of style. He is marrying Blaire's mother.

Aaron

This is Cyrus' son. He is 16 but headed for college. The boy had dreadlocks and is known for his kindness.

Erik

This is Serena's older brother. She goes to visit him at Brown.

Gossip Girl

This is the character that keeps track of the happenings on the upper east side.

Tyler

This is Blair's 11-year-old brother. He wants to be a rock-and-roll journalist.

Vanessa

This character lives in Brooklyn. She shaves her head and has a huge crush on Dan. She works with film and wants to be a director.



Zeke

This is Dan's friend who meets him in the park. He tells Dan to get a life.



Objects/Places

Upper East Side

This is the section of New York City where the wealthy live, shop, and attend exclusive schools.

Yale

This is where Blair wants to attend college. It is her father's alma mater.

Brown

This is where Erik goes to school. Serena and Dan spend a weekend there.

Central Park

This is where the guys go to play. Nate and Jenny get to know each other better there.

Barney's

This is Serena's favorite store. It's also where Blair steals something.

Cashmere Pajamas

This is what Blair steals. She wants to give it as a gift for Nate.

Serendipity 3

This is where Serena and Dan go to get ice cream. Dan wishes the place was a bit more romantic.

The Met

Serena likes to sit on the steps of this place. She brings Dan there after they get ice cream.



Grand Central

This is where Dan is supposed to meet Serena before they go away for the weekend. They run into other friends there.

Constance Billard

This is the school Serena attends. The film festival is at this school.

Riverside Prep

This is the school Dan attends. It's across town from Serena's school.

Motel 6

This is where Aaron and Blair spend the night before Blair's interview at Yale.

Best Western

This is where Blair, Dan, Nate and their friends spend the night before they go to Brown for interviews.



Themes

Preparing for College

Nate, Blair, Dan, Serena, and Aaron are all getting ready for college. They have different ideas about it and different approaches to getting into college, but they all share a common goal that adds stress to their high school experience.

Serena wants to go to Brown. That's where her brother attends college, and she wants to prove that she is capable of doing something on her own. Her interview doesn't go well, but she recollects herself and hopes for the best. Winning the Film Festival gives her a sense of accomplishment that might help her get into college.

Blair is determined to go to Yale, just as her father did. She envisions herself going there with Nate by her side. When her interview turns into a disaster, she appeals to her father to donate to the college to help her get in.

Nate isn't thinking the way Blair does. He is more interested in sailing with his father. However, after his interviewer encourages him during the interview, he discovers that he is more serious about college than he had previously thought. He doesn't want to go to Yale, though. He has his interview at Brown.

Dan has an interview at Brown as well. He feels that it is very important. During the interview, his thoughts are derailed and he walks out. Before he leaves, he shows that he has a solid grasp of literature and writing.

Dealing With Romantic Relationships

Romance is a huge issue with teenagers and this book taps right into it. Blair is determined to lose her virginity during her senior year. She wants to have sex with Nate. She is constantly trying to get his attention and plan a special time with him, but he doesn't feel the same connection. Blair had discovered that he and Serena had sex previously, and this ruined her friendship with Serena. It also kept her jealous and suspicious throughout this book.

Nate and Jenny have a strong connection. Even though guys are always interested in her thanks to her large breasts, he doesn't even try to kiss her until they have really gotten to know each other.

Jenny's brother, Dan doesn't find the same compatibility with his love interest. He is completely obsessed with Serena, writing poems about her and constantly trying to be with her. She doesn't know how to deal with his intensity and does her best to keep it at a friendship level. When he finally realizes that she doesn't love him like he loves her, he is devastated.



Meanwhile, Vanessa, a girl with a tough exterior, has a huge crush on Dan. Jenny knows this and tells her to be honest about her feelings with Dan. When he has his heart broken by Serena, she steps in to help him mend.

The Good and Bad of Friendships

A theme in this novel is the delicate balance of friendship. Serena and Blair have been close friends for most of their lives. They were both friends with Nate, but this all changed when Serena and Nate slept together before Serena went off to boarding school. Blair learned about it and was determined to lose her own virginity to Nate. She also turned her back on her life-long friend, encouraging others to shun Serena as well.

On the trip to Brown, Nate and Serena reconnected. They weren't drawn to each others as lovers. They just kept their friendship. Serena had several opportunities to retaliate against Blair. She knew Blair stole the pajamas and could have exposed her, but she had compassion and understanding of her former friend. When Blair learns that Nate is with Jenny and everything is against her, Serena is there to help her. This time, Blair accepts the friendship.

Jenny and Vanessa become friends as well. Jenny sees the softer side of the other girl and knows how Vanessa feels about Dan. She encourages her to talk with Dan and let him know how she feels. Nate and Jenny are friends before they take the relationship any further. From the first time they met each other, they feel extremely comfortable with each other.



Style

Point of View

You Love Me: A Gossip Girl Novel by Cecily Von Ziegesar constantly shifts its point of view. Although Blair is the main character, there are many sub-main characters such as Serena, Jenny, Dan, Nate and Vanessa. The point-of-view is third person subjective, offering insight into the speaker's thought processes. However, it jumps from one character to another, frequently on the same page. This unique glimpse into each character helps the reader understand and relate to each main character. It also shows motive behind actions from all sides.

The sections relating Gossip Girl's blog posts are in second person. Gossip Girl talks directly to her readers and they respond. These sections feel like news stories. They add more insight to the story but are separated from actual events.

Setting

This novel highlights the elite from the upper east side of New York City. This is important because it's a world hub of activity, and the wealthy are used to being catered to. There is a separation of classes, which adds to the story as Dan and Jenny become major parts of the story even though they are from the West Side. The teens go college visiting and stay in motels. This is symbolic of the new places and situations they might face in life.

Language and Meaning

You Love Me: A Gossip Girl Novel by Cecily Von Ziegesar revolves mostly around college seniors, and its language reflects this. Each character has a unique voice and manner of speaking, but all sound like average educated teens. vocabulary is simple, and words a reader might not be familiar with revolve around clothing brand names.

Structure

The contents of this book are divided into 34 sections. These sections are labeled by headers that are written in small letters with no caps. The sections average around 10 pages long. The parts that highlight Gossip Girl's blurbs always begin with the words "hey people." The banner art on these pages depict a web page from the Internet. Gossip Girl refers to each main character by the letter of their first name.
